AN ORDINANCE

Adopting Tentative Budget of \$2,135,331.05 for fiscal year 1923.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the tentative budget amounting to TWO MILLION, ONE HUNDRED THIRTY FIVE THOUSAND, THREE HUNDRED THIRTY ONE DOLLARS AND FIVE CENTS (\$2,135,331.05) be and the same is hereby adopted for the fiscal year 1923, June 1st 1923 to May 31st, 1924, as per statement of the various departments, on file in the office of the City Clerk and City Auditor.

AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE, EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CITY OF SAN ANTONIO PROMISSORY NOTES, TO EVIDENCE MONEY BORROWED FOR THE USE OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO IN ANTICIPATION OF THE RECEIPTS OF TAXES AND REVENUES FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR; PLEDGING AS SECURITY FOR SUCH LOAN THE UNCOLLECTED TAXES AND REVENUES OF SAID CITY FOR SAID YEAR.

WHEREAS, the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, has submitted a proposition to the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio to loan to said City the funds required to pay the current expenses debts, incurred during the present fiscal year, and to pay the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year; and to accept from said City, to evidence such loan, promissory notes bearing five per cent. (5% interest, which proposition has been accepted by said Commissioners; THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. That for the purpose of paying off the debts of the City of San Antonio, incurred for current expenses during the present fiscal year, beginning June 1, 1923, and to pay the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year, ending May 31,

1924, there shall be borrowed and secured from the City National Bank, of San Antonio, Texas, an advance of money for said purpose in the amount of TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000,00), which amounts does not exceed the current estimated income of said City for said fiscal year.

Section 2: That to evidence said loan, promissory notes of the City of San Antonio shall be executed and delivered to said City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, under and by virtue of the Charter of said City, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas.

Section 3: Said notes shall be numbered consecutively from one (1) to forty (40), both inclusive, shall be of the denomination of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000,00) each, aggregating the said sum of TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000).

Section 4: Said notes shall be payable to the order of The City National Bank, of San Antonio, Texas, shall be dated the 1st. day of August, 1923; shall become due and payable on or before the 1st. day of June, 1924; and shall bear interest at the rate of five per centum (5%) per annum, from date thereof until paid; provided, that interest shall be paid only on cash actually advanced on said notes and only from the dates of such advancements.

Section 5: Said notes shall be signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor, attested by the City Clerk, of said City, and the corporate seal of said City shall be impressed upon each of said notes.

Section 6: That to secure the payment of said notes, and all interest thereon, the current revenues of the City of San Antonio, arising from taxation and all other sources, for the fiscal year June 1, 1923, to May 31, 1924, are hereby irrevocably pledged; and said notes and all interest thereon shall be paid from said current income before such revenues may be lawfully appropriated to any other purpose or object whatsoever.

Section 7: That the proceeds of said loan shall be used first to take up and pay off the outstanding indebtedness, incurred for current expenses of said City during the present fiscal year, and the remainder of said proceeds shall be advanced as the notes are delivered by the City of such proceeds shall be deposited to the credit of the City of San Antonio under the provisions of the City Depository Contract, to be used in the payment of the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year.

Section 8: The form of said notes shall be substantially as follows:-

of said City during the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1923, and to supply the needed funds to pay current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year, ending May 31, 1924; said notes having been issued under and by virtue of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and in pursuance of an ordinance passed by the Commissioners of said City on the 30th day of July, 1923, which ordinance is recorded in Vol. _____ page _____ et seq. of the Minutes of said City Commissioners.

The date of this note, in conformity with said ordinance, is August 1st, 1923.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this series of notes, have been properly done and performed, and have happened in regular and due time, form and manner, as required by law: and that the full faith and credit of said City of San Antonio, and the taxes and current revenues of said City for the fiscal year June 1st, 1923, to May 31, 1924, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the punctual payment of the principal and interest of this series of notes.

 AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE, EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CITY OF SAN ANTONIO PROMISSORY NOTES, TO EVIDENCE MONEY BORROWED FOR THE USE OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR PAYMENT OF OPERATING EXPENSES OF SAID CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING MAY 31, 1923; PLEDGING AS SECURITY FOR SUCH LOAN THE UNCOLLECTED TAXES AND REVENUES OF SAID CITY FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR AND THE PRECEDING YEARS.

WHEREAS, The City of San Antonio needs to borrow money for the purpose of paying operating expenses of said City during the fiscal year ending May 31, 1923, in anticipation of the receipts of uncollected taxes levied for that year and current revenues therefor: and

WHEREAS, the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, has submitted a proposition to the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio to loan to said City the funds required to pay said expense debts, incurred during said fiscal year ending May 31, 1923, and to accept from said City to evidence such loan, promissory notes bearing five per cent (5%) annual interest, which proposition has been accepted by said Commissioners: THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. That for the purpose of the debts of the City of San Antonio incurred for current expenses during the fiscal year ending May 31, 1923, there shall be borrowed and secured from the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas an advance of money for said purpose in the amount of THREE HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$395,00,00) DOLLARS, which amount does not exceed the estimated income of said City for said fiscal year.

Section 2: That to evidence such loan, promissory notes of the City of San Antonio shall be executed and delivered to said City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, under and by virtue of the Charter of said City, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas.

Section 3: Said notes shall be numbered consecutively, from one (1) to eleven (11), both inclusive, notes numbered one (1) to ten (10), both inclusive, shall be of the denomination of TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$25,000,00) DOLLARS, each, and note numbered eleven (11) shall be of the denomination of FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$45,000,00) DOLLARS, aggregating the said sum of THREE HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$395,000,00) DOLLARS.

Section 4: Said notes shall be payable to the order of the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, and shall be dated the first day of August, 1923, and become due and payable on the first day of June, 1925, and shall bear interest at the rate of five per centum (5%) per annum from date thereof until paid.

Section 5: Said notes shall be signed by the Mayor, Countersigned by the City Auditor and attested by the City Clerk of said City, and the corporate seal of said City shall be impressed on each of said notes.

Section 6: That to secure the payment of said notes, and all interest thereon, the current revenues of the City of San Antonio, arising from taxation, and all other sources, including the surplus of the revenues and income of said City from any other proceeding fiscal year, after all current debts and obligations of such other year have first been paid in accordance with Section 52 of the Charter of said City (with the exception of approximately the sum of TWELVE THOUSAND (\$12,000,00) DOLLARS heretofore appropriated for street work and construction), are hereby irrevocably pledged; and said notes, and all interest thereon, shall be paid from said income before such revenues may be lawfully appropriated to any other purpose or object whatsoever.

Section 7: That the proceeds of said loan shall be used to take up and pay off the outstanding indebtedness incurred for current expenses of said City during said fiscal year ending May 31, 1923.

Section 8: The form of said notes shall be substantially as follows, the notes numbered from one (1) to ten (10), both inclusive, being in the sum of TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$25,000, 00) DOLLARS, each, and note numbered eleven (11) being in the sum of FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$45,000,00) DOLLARS.

AN ORDINANCE

To Amend an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Levying special assessments on account of the cost of the improvement of Navarro Street, by widening and straightening the same from S. line of San Antonio River to the N. line of Market Street and to provide for the issuance of assessment certificates, and for the appropriation of the part of the cost payable by the City, and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, on the 31st day of July, A. D. 1922, an ordinance of the City of San Antonio was duly passed and approved whereby certain assessments were levied against persons and liens were fixed against property, against persons owning land abutting upon Navarro Street, between the South line of the San Antonio River and the North line of Market Street, and against their property, and in said ordinance assignable certificates of special assessments covering said assessments were authorized and directed to be issued in such form as provided for by the Improvement Ordinance of the City of San Antonio and the amendment thereto:

And, Whereas, said Improvement Ordinance and the amendment thereto required that actual signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk be affixed to the last coupons of such certificates and authorizes their fac simile signatures to the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th, of such coupons;

And, Whereas, the aforesaid assignable certificates were not issued by the then Mayor and City Clerk, as directed, thru oversight;

And, Whereas, the first installment and coupon of each of said assessments will become due and payable on August 1, 1923, and such certificates are necessary to collect such installments and coupons and the ones following; and, whereas, the change of administration of the City of San Antonio on June 1st, A. D. 1923, resulted in the election, qualification and acting of a different person as Mayor and in the appointment, qualification and acting of a different person as City Clerk:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO,

That said ordinance so passed and approved on the 31st day of July, A. D. 1922, be and the same is now hereby amended in section "four" thereof by adding thereto the following language, to-wit:

And the Mayor, John W. Tobin, and the City Clerk, Fred Fries, are each hereby authorized and directed, on this the 30th day of July, A. D. 1923, to sign the assignable certificates to cover the aforesaid assessments. And the signatures of the said John W. Tobin, as Mayor, and the said Fred Fries, as City Clerk, of the City of San Antonio, shall have all the force and effect as if said assignable certificates had been issued before July 30, 1923, and before June 1, 1923, and had been signed by O. B. Black as Mayor and O. C. Speight as City Clerk.
