

AN ORDINANCE **77947**

ORDERING THE RUN-OFF MUNICIPAL ELECTION FOR DISTRICT 7 TO BE HELD ON THE 5TH DAY OF JUNE, 1993, IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, BEXAR COUNTY, TEXAS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING THE MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY SAN ANTONIO FOR DISTRICT 7; PROVIDING THAT SUCH ELECTION SHALL BE A JOINT ELECTION WITH BEXAR COUNTY AS PROVIDED FOR IN CHAPTER 271 OF THE TEXAS ELECTION CODE; ESTABLISHING THE POLLING PLACES FOR SAID RUN-OFF ELECTION TO BE HELD ON JUNE 5, 1993; ESTABLISHING THE EARLY VOTING SITES, DATES, AND TIMES IN CONNECTION WITH EARLY VOTING FOR THIS RUN-OFF ELECTION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on the 1st day of May, 1993, in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, there was held the Regular Municipal Election for the purpose of electing the members of the Council of the City of San Antonio; and

WHEREAS, at said election, no candidate for District 7 of the City Council of the City of San Antonio received a majority of all the votes for the office of Member of Council, District 7, cast by the qualified voters voting in said election, and therefore, no candidate was elected at said election for the Office of Member of Council, District 7; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to order a Run-off Municipal Election for District 7 for the purpose of electing the Member of the Council of the City of San Antonio for District 7; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:


SECTION 1. A Run-off Municipal Election for the purpose of electing the Member of the Council of the City of San Antonio, District 7, is hereby ordered to be held in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, on the 5th day of June, 1993, in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the provisions of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and the official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code. The two candidates receiving the highest number of votes for District 7 shall again be voted for at the Run-off Election ordered herein.


SECTION 2. It is further ordered that said election shall be held as prescribed by law, in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, at the following polling or voting places as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein.


SECTION 3. It is further ordered that Early Voting for the Run-off Election ordered herein shall be conducted at the sites, dates, and times set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated herein.

SECTION 4. Because early voting in connection with the Run-off Election ordered herein must be conducted beginning May 19, 1993, in order to comply with the time requirements set forth in the Texas Election Code, this ordinance must be considered and acted upon at the May 13, 1993, scheduled meeting of the City Council of the City of San Antonio in order that early voting may be authorized to begin on May 19, 1993. Therefore, an emergency is hereby found and declared to exist so that upon the affirmative vote of at least eight members of the Council, this ordinance shall take effect immediately in order that the public peace, property, health or safety may be preserved. Otherwise, this ordinance shall take effect on the 10th day after adoption hereof.

Because the Run-off Election for District 7 will be held as a joint election with Bexar County in connection with the run-off for the Special Senatorial Election called by the Governor of the State of Texas, and because early voting in connection with the Run-off Election for District 7 must be conducted beginning May 19, 1993, in order to comply with the time requirements set forth in the Texas Election Code, this ordinance must be considered and acted upon at the May 13, 1993, scheduled meeting of the City Council of the City of San Antonio in order that this ordinance shall take effect immediately authorizing Early Voting to begin on May 19, 1993. An emergency therefore exists which requires that the Council consider this matter at its May 13, 1993, scheduled meeting rather than at the next scheduled City Council Meeting on May 20, 1993, and this item shall be considered on an emergency basis in accordance with Section 3A(h) of Article 6252-17 of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas.

SUMMARY:

This ordinance sets the date for the Run-off Election in District 7 in conjunction with the Special Senatorial Run-off Election called by the Governor. This election will take place on Saturday, June 5, from 7:00 A.M. until 7:00 P.M. The polling places for the June 5 election will be exactly the same as the ones on Saturday, May 1. The early voting sites, times and dates are attached hereto for your reference.

City Council approval of this ordinance is necessary in order to submit the information to the Justice Department as soon as possible.

POLICY ANALYSIS:

Combining our Run-off election with the Special Senatorial Election will amount to a substantial savings to the City as well as to the County. This combination is in keeping with our past practice of making it more convenient for voters to vote at one location on different issues.
