

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 23RD, A.D. 1918, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable Sam C. Bell, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Coy, Heuermann, Wright, Lambert.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

---MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS---

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police: W.G. Costillo, requesting payment of damages to his automobile.

Rieber Ice Cream Co. for permit to build a spur track.

Citizens, complaining of noises made by planing mill operated by Artesian Ice Co.

Petition of Commonwealth Bank & Trust Co. for remission of taxes, was read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation.

Petition of R.L. Burnett, relating to the clearing of brush from certain lots, was read and referred to Health Department.

Petition of H.W. Adams, requesting assignment of a legacy made by H.B. Adams to the City of San Antonio, was read and referred to City Attorney.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that the proposition of the Austin-Western Road Machinery Company, Dallas, Texas, offering to trade one new eight-horse grader for one second hand scarifier be and is hereby accepted and the City Purchasing Agent is authorized to complete transaction.

No. 188 **MC-567** AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$350.00 to pay Chas R. Gerlach acct. widening of Soledad Street.

No. 190 **MC 569** AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$71.50 to pay R.J.McMillan, City Atty acct. expense trip to Dallas.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$71.50 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund to pay expense of trip of R.J.McMillan, City Atty. to Dallas, Houston and Galveston, to make an investigation in connection with street car rates, as per statement attached.

Commissioner Coy made the following recommendations:

That petition of J.J.Cain for correction of assessment on automobile be granted. Adopted
