

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, APRIL 16TH, A. D. 1917, 4 P. M.

PRESENT: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, Presiding, and Commissioners Galand, Kearney, Lambert and Uhr.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

----- MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS. -----

The Clerk read the following:

The petition of Adolph Baeten for permit to build temporary fence was read and referred to City Engineer.

The following petitions were read and referred to the Commissioner of Fire and Police: A. M. Berrey for permit to operate motion picture show

F. Osterroth for permit to change Jitney route.

Frank E. Beaty to install gasoline tank at 231-33 S. Flores street.

Petition of Citizens for water main on Salinas street was read and referred to Commissioner of Sanitation.

Petition of Citizens for the improvement of Gladstone Addition was read and referred to Commissioner of Public Improvements.

Petition of L. B. Collins for refund of taxes was read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation.

MB-532 AN ORDINANCE.

Granting permit to San Antonio Loan and Trust Company, Agents for J. K. Burr to construct a Sanitary Sewer in Burr street.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Commissioner of the City of San Antonio, that

Section 1. That permission is hereby granted San Antonio Loan and Trust Co agent for J. K. Burr to construct a 10" and 8" Sanitary Sewer beginning at City sewer on River Avenue and Burr street and extending to and through Washington Heights addition on Burr street about 4300 feet according to plat line and grade to be made by the City Engineer; the cost of said sewer being estimated about Three Thousand, Five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00), to be paid by the said San Antonio Loan and trust Company, agents of J. K. Burr. The final actual cost to be filed with the City Engineer within ten (10) days after the completion of the sewer.

Section 2. Said Sewer, when completed, to become the property of the City of San Antonio and part of its public sewer system.

Section 3. The City Engineer is hereby directed to collect the sum of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) for each and every connection made with said sewer main or house service going into said main and pay the same over to said San Antonio Loan and trust Company, agent for J. K. Burr, not later than the 10th day of each month

following the month in which said connection is made, until the sum of actual cost of said sewer, shall have been collected and paid over as aforesaid, when no further connection fee of thirty-five (35.00) dollars shall be collected.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent therefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

Commissioner Garland recommended that the petition of A. J. Goolsby for refund of taxes be granted, and same was adopted.

Commissioner Garland recommended that the petition of Edward Townsend for correction of assessment be referred to City Attorney. Adopted.

MB-533 AN ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:
