THURSDAY, OCTOBER 4TH, A. D. 1934, 10:00 A. M.

PRESENT: Honorable C. K. Guin, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners, Bushick, Rubiola, Steffler, Wright.

RESOLUTION *MM-482.1*

Changing the name of Roosevelt Park to Lambert Park.
