AN ORDINANCE 11,895

PRESCRIBING FEES FOR DISCHARGING SEWAGE INTO THE SANITARY SEWAGE SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO BE PAID BY THE OWNERS OR OCCUPANTS OF RESIDENCES, BUILDINGS, APARTMENTS, TOURIST COURTS AND BUSINESSES OUTSIDE THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS TO SO USE SAID SANITARY SEWAGE SYSTEM AND THE PAYMENT OF SAID FEES; PRESCRIBING PENALTY AND INTEREST, AND MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO DISCHARGE OR TO SUFFER OR PERMIT THE DISCHARGE OF SEWAGE INTO THE SANITARY SEWAGE SYSTEM OF THE CITY WITHOUT A PERMIT, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio has expended large sums of money, raised by taxation, during the past forty (40) YEARS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, operation and maintenance of a Sanitary Sewer System and Disposal Plant, for the benefit of its citizens and inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, property owners, businesses and residences outside the corporate limits of the City have been allowed and permitted to the use and services of this System and Plant at a nominal cost to them generally, and sometimes at no cost at all; and

WHEREAS, the costs for construction, maintenance and operation of the main lines, intercepting lines, the outfall sewers and the disposal plant have increased greatly during the last few years and the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio now deem it necessary to raise the fees and charges for rendering such services; and

WHEREAS, in justice and right to the taxpayers and citizens of the City of San Antonio, who have borne and are now bearing the costs necessary for this system, a reasonable and fair charge should be made for this service upon all users of the system outside said City based upon a fair and reasonable share of cost of operation and the amount of money required to construct and finance same; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio owes no duty to furnish said services to users outside of its corporate limits; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. That the following rates and charges are hereby established for each residence, apartment, tourist court, business and other building, outside the Corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, now connected to directly or indirectly, or that may hereafter be so connected with and using the Sanitary Sewer System of the City of San Antonio for the disposal of sewage:

- ✓ (a) A fee of \$6.00 per annum for each four-fixture (4) connection.
- ✓ (b) For each unit of more than four (4) fixtures a fee of \$6.00 plus \$1.00 for each additional fixture above the number of four (4).

said fees and charges to be paid by the owner or occupant of each such residence, apartment, tourist court, business or other building, in advance, beginning on the 1st day of July, 1950, and thereafter for each subsequent year. All such sums so paid to the City shall be paid to the License and Dues Collector of said City and become a part of the General Fund of the City. It shall be the duty of both the owner and the occupant to see that such fees are paid and that the license hereafter provided for is taken out; and each such owner and occupant shall be jointly and severally liable therefor.

It is further provided that if the fees and charges above set out shall not be paid when due and payable, then a ten percent penalty shall be added thereto and collected with interest at the rate of six (6) percentum per annum, from date until paid.

Section 2. Upon the payment of the amount of money due as charges or fees under Section 1 of this Ordinance to the License and Dues Collector of the City of San Antonio, a written permit shall be issued by said City to the owner or occupant paying the same, giving the right and privilege to continue the Sanitary Sewer connection for that particular premise to the Sanitary Sewer System of the City of San Antonio and to discharge sewage into said system until the succeeding January 1st., fees for part of a year shall be prorated according to the number of remaining calendar months in the year but a fraction of a month shall count as an entire month.

Section 3. A map and record shall be prepared by the City Engineer on which shall be shown the owners or occupants of all residences, buildings and businesses located outside the Corporate Limits of the City of San Antonio which are connected to the City's Sanitary Sewer System, and a copy of such map and record shall be furnished to the License and Dues Collector; and it is hereby made the duty of the License and Dues Collector to send notices to all such owners and occupants of the amount due by each of them under the provisions of Section 1 of this Ordinance.

Section 4. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation owning or occupying any residence, apartment, tourist court, business or other building situated outside the Corporate Limits of the City of San Antonio to discharge or to suffer, permit or cause the discharge of any sewage into the Sanitary Sewage System of the City of San Antonio within the Corporate Limits of the City of San Antonio, or to have his sewer line connected with said Sanitary Sewage System without having a permit to do so as provided in Section 2 hereof, and any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00, and each day such violation shall be made or permitted or allowed shall constitute a separate offense, and both owner and the occupant shall be guilty of a misdemeanor upon violating any of the penal provisions of this ordinance and shall be punished as provided in this Section.

Section 5. That the provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to any City, Town, Village, Governmental Agency and the inhabitants thereof which has entered into a valid and binding contract with the City of San Antonio for the payment of the fees and charges levied or assessed against its inhabitants provided for in Section 1 hereof during the term of said contract.

Section 6. That the City of San Antonio shall have the right, if any person, firm or corporation fails or refuses to secure a permit as required under the provisions of this Ordinance, to summarily disconnect said person's, firm's or corporation's sewer connection from the City of San Antonio's Sanitary Sewer System without notice.

Section 7. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or provisions of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provisions thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 8. All ordinances or part of ordinances heretofore passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio in direct and irreconcilable conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed.
