RESOLUTION

Requesting the Secretary of War to install a unit of the Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps in the High Schools of San Antonio.

WHEREAS, recognizing the great benefit to be derived by the youth of the land from a certain amount of military training, thereby tending to promote obedience to the law and a higher physical development, and

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio being the centre of great military activity, and the fact that there are approximately one thousand students in our High Schools who would avail themselves of the opportunity to receive such instruction. NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That, the Honorable Secretary of War be, and he is hereby requested, to install in the high schools of the City of San Antonio a unit of the Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps.
