The vote was then taken on nomination of A. J. Lewis, which resulted as follows; Ayes; White, Hein, Knight, South; Ploch, Reader and Anderson; Nays; Traugott, and Bennett; Present Davis and Reader.

Commissioners Davis moved to recess until 10:00 A.M. Tuesday July 26th., 1949, which motion was carried unanimously.
