

## AN ORDINANCE 98-166

Approving Contract with San Antonio Public Service Co.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

That the attached contract with the San Antonio Public Service Co., be and is hereby in all things approved and accepted to-wit:

STATE OF TEXAS:

COUNTY OF BEXAR:

THIS CONTRACT made and entered into, effective as of the 1st day of February, A. D. 1928, by and between the San Antonio Public Service Company, hereinafter referred to as "Company", acting herein by and through its duly authorized officers, and the City of San Antonio, hereinafter referred to as "City", acting herein by and through its Mayor, C. M. Chambers, he being thereunto duly authorized by the City Commission as required by law.

WITNESSETH:

1. The Company will furnish, maintain and light fourteen hundred (1400) or more series lamps, using approximately four hundred (400) watts to the lamp, at forty-eight and no/100 dollars (\$48.00) per light per annum on overhead circuit.
2. The Company will furnish the City the current for incandescent lights and power in the City Hall, Market House, City Hospital, City Stables, Fire and Police Stations, Parks, and all other public places, for two and one-half cents (2.5¢) per kilowatt hour, as measured by standard meter.
3. The Company will furnish, maintain and light six hundred (600) or more lamps of approximately two hundred fifty (250) candle power as the City may order on the fixtures and underground circuits now installed on Houston Street, Alamo Plaza, Commerce Street, Travis Street, Losoya Street, North Flores Street, Main Avenue and St. Mary's Street, and at such other points as may be mutually agreed upon, at thirty-nine and no/100 dollars (\$39.00) per lamp per year.
4. The Company will furnish, maintain and light four hundred (400) or more lamps of approximately two hundred fifty (250) candle power on overhead circuits near the central business district at thirty and no/100 dollars (\$30.00) per lamps per year.
5. The Company will furnish, maintain, and light Mazda lamps of one hundred fifty (150) watt capacity at twenty-four and no/100 dollars (\$24.00) per lamp per year.
6. All lamps under this contract shall be renewed in not less than every six months (6) or in less time, provided any lamp should show deficient candle power, and lamps so replaced shall not again be used on any city lighting circuit. The City shall have the right at all reasonable times, by competent experts of practical experience, to test the capacity of all lamps and to give immediate notice to the Company of any deficiency found. If such deficient capacity is not corrected within twelve hours (12) after such notice, a proportionate reduction in charge shall be made therefor until rectified.
7. All lights shall be burned every night from dusk until day light. If any light is not burning on any night then such outage shall be reported and a proportionate reduction made in the charge.
8. The City shall have the right to add lamps, provided that in case of approximately 400 watt series lamps they shall be installed at the Company's expense if the location does not exceed one thousand feet from the Company's series lighting circuits. The City shall bear the expense of the necessary extension and installation over and above the

cost of extending one thousand feet. The same provisions shall govern in the case of smaller lights on overhead and underground circuits, but the distance shall be two hundred fifty (250) feet, the City to pay for all cost in excess of this distance, provided that in the case of any lamps on underground circuits where it is necessary to install cables under paving in streets or sidewalks the City shall bear all the expense of replacing or repairing said streets or sidewalks. The City shall have the right to designate the height of each lamp above the ground. All lamps and posts are to be maintained by the Company at all times, in first class condition, and glassware kept clean.

9. In case of strikes, causing a shutdown of the Company's plant, or in the event of fire, flood or accident to its plant or machinery, the Company shall be excused from the performance of this contract during the continuance of the interrupting cause, but will rebate to the City in proportion to the delay.

10. The payment of the City are to be monthly as the service for the preceding months has been rendered, and the obligation of the City to make any or all of said payments is conditioned upon the rendition of the service herein provided for, and such payments are to be made out of the current revenues of the City for the year in which the service is rendered, or out of other funds in the control of the City lawfully applicable thereto.

11. This contract shall be in force and effect as to all the public electric lighting for street lights and other purposes in the City of San Antonio, for a period of two years from February 1st, 1928.

AN ORDINANCE **88-167**

AMENDING THE TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, LIMITING PARKING TO ONE HOUR ON NORTH ALAMO STREET AND ALAMO PLAZA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That Rule 39 of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Regulating the Government of Traffic on the Streets, Plazas and Public Places of the City of San Antonio", passed and approved on the 8th day of December, 1921, with amendments thereto; be and the same is hereby amended by adding, after the words "Around Park on which City Hall Building is located on Military Plaza", the following:-

2. "On North Alamo Street, between East Commerce Street and Blum Street.

"On the north, south, east and west sides of Alamo Plaza.

"Around the Park plot at the south end of Alamo Plaza.

"Around the Park plot at the north end of Alamo Plaza.

3. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

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AN ORDINANCE *08-168*

ORDERING AN ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, BEXAR COUNTY, TEXAS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED TAXPAYING ELECTORS OF SAID CITY, TEN (10) CERTAIN SEPARATE PROPOSITIONS TO BORROW MONEY ON THE CREDIT OF SAID CITY, AND TO ISSUE BONDS OF SAID CITY THEREFOR, THE PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF WHICH SHALL BE USED IN EFFECTING AND CONSTRUCTING THE FOLLOWING PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR SAID CITY, VIZ: (1) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$1,250,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING A PERMANENT SYSTEM OF SEWERAGE DISPOSAL AND PERMANENT SANITARY SEWERS AND DRAINS, AND ACQUIRING ANY PARCELS OF LAND WHICH MAY BE NECESSARY THEREFORE; (2) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$600,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF OPENING, WIDENING AND STRAIGHTENING PUBLIC STREETS AND PUBLIC PLACES, AND ACQUIRING ANY PARCELS OF LAND WHICH MAY BE NECESSARY THEREFOR; (3) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$750,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PERMANENTLY PAVING AND GRADING THE PUBLIC STREETS AND PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY; (4) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$500,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PERMANENTLY IMPROVING THE SAN ANTONIO RIVER, SAN PEDRO AND ALAZAN CREEKS, AND DRAINAGE DITCHES AND STREAMS IN SAID CITY, BY WIDENING, ALTERING AND CHANGING THE CHANNELS THEREOF, AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT LEVEES AND WALLS ALONG AND NEAR THE SAME, AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT STORM SEWERS AND DRAINS, WITH MAINS, LATERALS AND NECESSARY ACCESSORIES THERETO, AND TO ACQUIRE ANY LANDS AND OTHER PROPERTY NECESSARY THEREFOR; (5) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$150,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING BRIDGES; (6) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$300,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING SUITABLE BUILDINGS FOR FIRE AND POLICE DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY AND PERMANENT FIRE ALARM AND POLICE SIGNAL SYSTEMS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, AND ACQUIRING NECESSARY SITES THEREFOR; (7) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$400,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING LAND <sup>AND</sup> SITES FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN THE PUBLIC PARKS OF SAID CITY; (8) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$500,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING AND PERMANENTLY EQUIPPING OF USEFUL AND NECESSARY ADDITIONS TO AND ENLARGEMENT OF THE PRESENT PUBLIC LIBRARY BUILDING OF SAID CITY, AND THE ESTABLISHMENT, ERECTION, CONSTRUCTION AND PERMANENT EQUIPPING OF BRANCH PUBLIC LIBRARIES THEREOF, AND THE ACQUISITION OF ANY PARCELS OF LAND AND SITES WHICH MAY BE NECESSARY THEREFORE, IN THE SEVERAL WARDS OF THE CITY; (9) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$250,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING AND ACQUIRING APPROXIMATELY ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY ACRES (190) OF LAND, SITUATED IN BEXAR COUNTY, TEXAS, AND KNOWN AS THE INTERNATIONAL EXPOSITION GROUNDS, FROM THE INTERNATIONAL EXPOSITION OF SAN ANTONIO, FOR USE

AS A PUBLIC PARK, AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS THEREON; (10) BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$55,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING AND ACQUIRING THAT TRACT OF LAND BETWEEN THE WEST SIDE OF MILITARY PLAZA AND THE EAST SIDE OF CALDER STREET, BOUNDED ON THE NORTH BY PROPERTY OF LOUISE SIMMANG AND SCHWARTZ AND COHEN, AND ON THE SOUTH BY PROPERTY OF MRS. JOHANNA STEVES, KNOWN AS THE "SPANISH GOVERNOR'S PLACE", IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, BEXAR COUNTY, TEXAS, FOR USE AS A PUBLIC PARK OF THE CITY, AND CONSTRUCTING PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS THEREON.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio deem it necessary and advisable to issue bonds of said City for the respective purposes and in the respective amounts hereinafter specified, and desire to submit said propositions to the taxpaying voters as required by law;

THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

SECTION ONE: That an election be and is hereby ordered to be held in the City of San Antonio on Saturday the 19th day of May, A. D. 1928, and the Mayor of said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his proclamation calling said election on said date, at which election ten (10) certain separate propositions to borrow money on the credit of said City, for the purpose of effecting and constructing permanent public improvements in the said City, shall be submitted to the qualified taxpaying voters of said City, as follows, to-wit:-

1st. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of One Million Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$1,250,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be of the face denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: to be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive. All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and to create a sinking fund, as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting the health and safety of the people of the City, by the construction of a permanent system of sewerage disposal and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefore; said public improvements to be constructed being the construction of a permanent system of sewerage disposal, and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, extending and supplementing the present system of sanitary sewers and drains of said City.

2nd. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of Six Hundred Thousand (\$600,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be of the face denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: to be payable serially in amounts of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall

respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the public convenience and traffic conditions of the public streets and public places of said City, by opening, widening and straightening public streets and public places, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed and effected being the permanent opening, widening and straightening of public streets and public places in the several wards of said City, and the acquisition of any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor.

3rd. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$750,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be of the face denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: to be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay <sup>the</sup> interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places of said City by permanently paving and grading the same; said public improvements to be constructed being the paving and grading in permanent manner of public streets and public places, in the several wards of said City.

4th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be of the face denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: to be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay interest on said bonds as same become payable, and to create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, and drainage ditches and streams in said City, by widening, deepening, altering and changing the channels thereof, and constructing permanent levees and walls along and near the same, and constructing permanent storm sewers and drains, with mains, laterals and necessary accessories thereto, so as to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions, and protect the public health and safety, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor, extending and supplementing the present permanent system of storm sewers and drains of said City; said public improvements to be constructed being the widening, deepening, altering and changing of the channels of the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, and drainage ditches and streams in said City, and constructing permanent levees and walls along

and near the same, and constructing permanent storm sewers and drains, with mains, laterals and necessary accessories thereto, and acquiring any lands and other property necessary therefor.

5th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$150,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be of the face denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and to mature serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum, payable semiannually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the condition of the public thoroughfares and public places of said City, by building permanent bridges; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent bridges over streams crossing public thoroughfares and public places in the several wards of said City.

6th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be of the face denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: to be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the facilities and service of the Fire and Police Departments of said City, by creating suitable permanent buildings therefor, and permanent fire alarm and police signal systems in connection therewith, and acquiring necessary sites for same; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent buildings for additional fire and police stations, and permanent fire alarm and police signal system in connection therewith, and the acquisition of the necessary sites therefor.

7th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of Four Hundred Thousand (\$400,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be of the face denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: to be payable serially in amounts of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to

assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks and constructing permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent buildings, plumbing and other permanent structures in said public parks belonging to the City of San Antonio, and the purchase and acquisition of any necessary land and sites therefor.

8th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be of the face denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: to be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing and permanent equipping of useful and necessary additions to and enlargement of the present Public Library Building of said City, and the establishment, erection, construction and permanent equipping of branch public libraries thereof, and the acquisition of any parcels of land and sites which may be necessary therefor, in the several wards of said City; said public improvements to be constructed being the construction and permanent equipping of useful and necessary additions to and enlargement of the present Public Library Building of said City, and the establishment, erection, construction and permanent equipping of branch public libraries thereof, and the acquisition of any parcels of land and sites which may be necessary therefor, in the several wards of said City.

9th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$250,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be of the face denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: to be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum, payable semiannually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay interest on said bonds as same become payable, and create a sinking fund, as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring approximately one hundred and ninety (190) acres of land, situated in Bexar County, Texas, and known as the International Exposition Grounds, from the International Exposition of San Antonio, for use as a public park, and constructing permanent public improvements thereon, said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent buildings thereon, and the purchase and acquisition of the necessary land therefor.

10th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of Fifty-five Thousand (\$55,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be of the face denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: to be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay interest on said bonds as same become payable, and to create a sinking fund, as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring that tract of land between the west side of Military Plaza and the east side of Calder Street, bounded on the north by property of Louise Simmang and Schwartz and Cohen, and on the south by property of Mrs. Johanna Steves, known as the "Spanish Governor's Palace", in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, for use as a public Park of said City, and constructing permanent public improvements thereon; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent buildings thereon, and the purchase and acquisition of said land as a site therefor.

SECTION TWO: The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws of the State regulating general elections, and by the provisions of the Charter of the City of San Antonio and the Ordinances of said City for such cases lawfully made and provided; and as provided by law, only those persons shall vote at said election who are qualified voters of said City and who pay taxes on property in said City; and the ballot to be used in said election shall be an "official ballot" arranged in such manner that persons qualified at said election may vote either for or against any or all of said propositions.

✓ # SECTION THREE: That the form in which said ten (10) several propositions shall be voted on respectively, shall be substantially as follows, to-wit:-

1st. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the FIRST PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of One Million Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$1,250,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing a permanent system of sewerage disposal and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, and acquiring any necessary lands therefor."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of One Million Two Hundred and

Fifty Thousand (\$1,250,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing a permanent system of sewerage disposal and permanent sanitary sewers and drains, and acquiring any necessary lands therefor." #

2nd. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the SECOND PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Six Hundred Thousand (\$600,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars each, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum, said loan being desired for the purpose of opening, widening and straightening public streets and public places of said City, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words.

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Six Hundred Thousand (\$600,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) Years, in yearly installments of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars each, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of opening, widening and straightening public streets and public places of said City, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor."

3rd. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the THIRD PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$750,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum; said loan

being desired for the purpose of permanently paving and grading the public streets and public places of said City, in the several wards thereof."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$750,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently paving and grading the public streets and public places of said City, in the several wards thereof."

4th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the FOURTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks by widening, deepening, altering and changing the channels thereof, and constructing permanent levees and walls along and near the same, and constructing permanent storm sewers and drains, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creek by widening, deeping, altering and changing the channels thereof, and constructing permanent levees

and walls along and near the same, and constructing permanent storm sewers and drains, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor."

5th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the FIFTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$150,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the condition of the public thoroughfares and public places of said City by building permanent bridges."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots, the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$150,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of permanently improving the condition of the public thoroughfares and public places of said City by building permanent bridges."

6th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the SIXTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the facilities and service of the Police and Fire Departments of said City, by erecting suitable permanent buildings therefor, and permanent fire alarm and police signal systems in connection therewith and acquiring sites for same."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots

the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the facilities and service of the Police and Fire Departments of said City, by erecting suitable permanent buildings therefor, and permanent fire alarm and police signal systems in connection therewith, and acquiring sites for same."

7th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the SEVENTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Four Hundred Thousand (\$400,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars each, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks, and constructing permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed the upon their ballots the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Four Hundred Thousand (\$400,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars each, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth (4 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring land and sites for public parks, and constructing permanent public improvements in the public parks of said City."

8th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the EIGHTH PROPOSITION as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly in-

stallments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing and permanent equipping of useful and necessary additions to and enlargement of the present Public Library Building of said City, and the establishment, construction and permanent equipping of branch public libraries thereof, and acquiring any parcels of land and sites which may be necessary therefor, in the several wards of said City."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing and permanent equipping of useful and necessary additions to and enlargement of the present Public Library Building of said City, and the establishment, construction and permanent equipping of branch public libraries thereof, and acquiring any parcels of land and sites which may be necessary therefor, in the several wards of said City."

9th. That at said election, all voters desiring to support the NINTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$250,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring approximately one hundred and ninety (190) acres of land, situated in Bexar County, Texas, and known as the International Exposition Grounds, for use as a public park, and constructing permanent public improvements thereon."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots

the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$250,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring approximately one hundred and ninety (190) acres of land, situated in Bexar County, Texas, and known as the International Exposition Grounds, for use as a public park, and constructing permanent public improvements thereon."

10th. That said election, all voters desiring to support the TENTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"FOR the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Fifty-five Thousand (\$55,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring that tract of land between the west side of Military Plaza and the east side of Calder Street, in the City of San Antonio, known as the "Spanish Governor's Palace", for the use as a public park, and constructing permanent public improvements thereon."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"AGAINST the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio, in the sum of Fifty-five Thousand (\$55,000.00) Dollars, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, and bearing interest at the rate of four and one-fourth ( $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ ) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring that tract of land between the west side of Military Plaza and the east side of Calder Street, in the City of San Antonio, Texas, known as the "Spanish Governor's Palace, for use as a public park, and constructing permanent public improvements thereon."

SECTION FOUR: That said election shall be held within the City of San Antonio, and in each and all of the various election precincts thereof, variously located in each of the several wards of said City as said election precincts are now fixed and established, and being the same election precincts used in recent state and county elections; and said election herein ordered shall be held during the hours required by law, and at the place in each such respective election precinct set opposite the number of such precinct, in the following table, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE **08-169**

PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS TO CONTROL THE HIRING OF EMPLOYEES BY CONTRACTORS WITH THE CITY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That every contract entered into by the City of San Antonio with any contractor employ-  
ing more than five persons in the performance of the work prescribed in said contract, shall  
contain as an elemental part thereof, the following stipulations:-

2. "The contractor agrees that he will comply with the provisions of all laws regulating  
and governing labor or relating to employers and employees; that no employee, or  
laborer, on this work shall be required to work more than the lawful hours in any  
one day; that all things being equal, the contractor will use and employ home  
(San Antonio) labor and materials; that every person employed on said work shall be  
a bona fide inhabitant of the City of San Antonio and shall hold a poll tax receipt  
qualifying him to vote in all elections; that the contractor shall file with the  
City Clerk of the City of San Antonio, a schedule showing the names of all employees,  
their addresses and the precinct in which they vote; and, that the contractor will  
make proper provisions for the comfort of his employees by supplying them with fresh  
water to drink and providing suitable and sanitary privies for their use; all of  
which shall be subject to the approval of the City Engineer, and the approval of  
the City Health Officer."

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AN ORDINANCE **08-170**

AMENDING THE TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, LIMITING PARKING TO ONE HOUR, ON SOUTH HACKBERRY STREET.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Rule 39 of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Regulating the Government of Traffic  
on the Streets, Plazas and Public Places of the City of San Antonio", passed and approved on  
the 8th day of December, 1921, with amendments thereto;

2. Be and the same is hereby amended by adding to said Rule 39, the following paragraph:-

3. "Rule 39-a. It shall be unlawful for any vehicle except  
vehicles used by doctors in emergency calls, to park for  
a longer period than one hour, between the hours of 8:00  
A. M. and 9:00 P. M., on certain streets within the City,  
as follows:-

On South Hackberry Street, between Rigsby Avenue and  
Berkshire Avenue."
