

A RESOLUTION (2194)

REQUESTING TEXAS STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO SPONSOR QUARANTINE HOSPITAL PROJECT TEX. 41-349.

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio has hertofore made application for a Federal contribution, Lanham Act Funds of \$121,269.75, to defray the maintenance and operation costs of a Quarantine Hospital in San Antonio, Texas, for the treatment and control of venereal diseases; and,

WHEREAS, the United States Public Health Service and the State Department of Health of the State of Texas propose to donate services valued at \$17,000.00 of the above amount, or 14.1 per cent of the cost of the Project which is known as Quarantine Hospital Project Tex. 41-349; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire that the Texas State Board of Health become the sponsor of such Project; THEREFORE:-

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

That the Texas State Board of Health be and is hereby requested to become the sponsor to said Quarantine Hospital Project Tex. 41-349, and that copy of this Resolution be certified and forwarded by the City Clerk to George W. Cox, M.D. State Health Officer, Austin, Texas.

AN ORDINANCE (2203)

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE DEED, CONVEYING TRIANGULAR PIECE OF LOT 17, NEW CITY BLOCK 3111 TO C. T. GOLDING AND WIFE, MRS. VESTA G. GOLDING, IN EXCHANGE FOR TRIANGULAR PIECE OF LOT 16, NEW CITY BLOCK 3111, FOR THE PURPOSE OF STRAIGHTENING MARTINEZ CREEK.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the Mayor of the City of San Antonio be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute deed to a triangular peice of Lot 17, New City Block 3111, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, to C. T. Golding and wife, Mrs. Vesta Golding, as follows:

2. Beginning at the southeast corner of said Lot 17; Thence westward along the south line of said Lot 17, twenty feet; Thence in a northeasterly direction to a point in the division line between Lots 16 and 17, half-way between the north line and the south line of these lots; Thence southward along said division line to the place of beginning;

3. In exchange for a triangular piece of Lot 16, New City Block 3111, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, to be conveyed to the City of San Antonio by C. T. Golding and wife, Mrs. Vesta G. Golding, as follows:

4. Beginning at the northwest corner of Lot 16; Thence east along the north line of said Lot 16, twenty feet; Thence in a southwesterly direction to a point in the division line between Lots 16 and 17, half way between the north line and the south

line of these lots;
thence northward along said division line to the place of beginning.

5. Said portion of Lot 16, New City Block 3111, to be conveyed to the City by C. T. Golding and wife, to be used for the purpose of straightening Martinez Creek.

AN ORDINANCE (2225)

ORDERING AN ELECTION ON THE 11TH OF MAY, 1943, FOR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND ON THE QUESTION OF THE SALE OF THE MEDINA RURAL ELECTRIC SYSTEM.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That an election be, and the same is ordered hereby to be held in the City of San Antonio, on Tuesday, the 11th day of May, A.D. 1943, for the general municipal election of the following municipal officers, to-wit:

MAYOR: COMMISSIONER OF TAXATION: COMMISSIONER OF SANITATION,
PARKS AND PUBLIC PROPERTY: COMMISSIONER OF STREETS AND PUBLIC
IMPROVEMENTS: AND, COMMISSIONER OF FIRE AND POLICE.

2. At which election the following proposition shall be submitted also to the qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, viz:

"PROPOSITION TO SELL MEDINA RURAL ELECTRIC SYSTEM."

Shall the City of San Antonio sell for \$111,115.66 cash, to the Medina Electric Cooperative, Incorporated, the rural electric distribution lines, properties and appurtenances owned by the City of San Antonio in the Counties of Medina and Uvalde, in the State of Texas, serving approximately 500 customers outside of the 'City Service Area', described generally as follows:

2-a: Real Estate:- That certain tract and parcel of land situated in the town of Castroville, Medina County, Texas, referred to as Castroville Power Plant Site, described and bounded as follows: Beginning at a point 247.7 feet south 45 degrees east, from southeast corner of Florence and Main Streets, in the Town of Castroville, south 45 degrees west, 143 feet to a concrete monument; thence south 45 degrees east, 279 feet to the edge of the Medina River; thence from a concrete monument 42 feet from the river's edge along survey line north 69 degrees east, 156.2 feet to concrete monument; and thence along a line north 45 degrees west from the Medina River's edge 332.5 feet to the place of beginning; being the same property conveyed by Jordan T. Lawler to San Antonio Public Service Company, by deed recorded in the record of Deeds of said Medina County, on August 10, 1936, in Volume 106, at pages 309-310.

2-b: Distribution Systems:- The 13 KV line beginning at the delivery side of the meter located on the 13 KV line on the east side of the Medina River near the town of Castroville, and extending in a northerly direction from said meter to serve customers in the Medina Lake area, together with all connecting branch lines, transformers, secondary lines, services, customers' meters and other devices; and, the 13 KV step-down transformer station located at said metering point and the 2.3 KV line extending from said transformer station through Castroville and west to the town of Dunlay, together with all connecting branch lines, transformers, secondary lines, services, customers' meters and other devices; and, the 2.3 KV lines beginning at and extending from the 66 KV sub-station forming a part of the San Antonio Electric & Gas System at D'Hanis, together with all connecting branch lines, transformers, secondary lines, services, cus-

tomers' meters and other devices; and, the 13 KV line extending in a northwesterly direction from a point east of and near D'Hanis to the town of Utopia, together with all connecting branch lines, transformers, secondary lines, services, customers' meters and other devices.

3. The ballot used in the election of the Proposition to sell Medina Rural Electric System shall be arranged in such a manner that the electors may vote either for or against said proposition.

4. At the election, all voters in favor of and desiring to support the Proposition shall have printed on their ballots the words:

"FOR THE PROPOSITION TO SELL THE MEDINA RURAL ELECTRIC SYSTEM"

and those opposed to and desiring to vote against said Proposition shall have printed on their ballots the words:

"AGAINST THE PROPOSITION TO SELL THE MEDINA RURAL ELECTRIC SYSTEM".

5. Said election shall be held as prescribed by law, at the following polling or voting places in the several election precincts of the City of San Antonio, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 o'clock P.M., Central War Time; - 1 - City Hall, Military Plaza; 2 - Fire Station No. 12, 1102 So. 6. The Mayor shall be authorized to issue a Proclamation and Notice of Election substantially in the form hereof, and he is directed to cause such Proclamation and Notice of Election to be published and promulgated by posting one copy thereof in each of said election precincts at the polling place specified and cause the same to be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of San Antonio, in the time and manner prescribed by law.

7. It is ordered by a two-thirds vote of the full Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that this ordinance shall receive final action without having been read at three several meetings of the Commission.

LEASE CONTRACT OF CAFE AT
NEW MUNICIPAL AIRPORT.

EXHIBIT A.

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

COUNTY OF BEXAR.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:-

That this agreement made the day and date hereinafter designated, by and between the City of San Antonio, a municipal corporation, acting by and through its duly authorized Mayor, Gus B. Mauermann, hereinafter called "LESSOR", and the Gunter Hotel Corporation, a private corporation duly chartered and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Texas, with its principal office and doing business in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, acting by and through its duly authorized President, Earl M. Baker, hereinafter called "LESSEE", WITNESSETH:-

FIRST: that Lessor, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, leases and demises to the Lessee, the following described property, to-wit:

That certain portion or part of Hangar No. 1 being the inside present Coffee Shop space, located in the Southeast lean-to of said Hangar No. 1, situate upon those certain tracts or parcels of land lying north of the city of San Antonio, in Bexar County, Texas, known as the New Municipal Airport.

SECOND: That the term of this lease shall be for a period of fourteen (14) months commencing on the 1st day of April, A.D. 1943, and ending on the 31st day of May, A.D. 1944, with the privilege and option granted Lessee to extend the term of this lease for one year covering a period from June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, provided, however, that if such renewal is desired by Lessee, at least sixty days' written notice of such desire shall be given by Lessee to Lessor prior to May 31, 1944.

THIRD: Lessee agrees to pay Lessor, upon the execution and delivery of this lease, at the office of the License and Dues Collector of the City of San Antonio, Texas, the sum of Four Thousand one Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars and Forty-nine Cents (\$4,199.49) cash, which sum covers the price paid by Lessee to Lessor for all of Lessor's coffee shop equipment located in the aforesaid cafe, list of said equipment being hereto attached, marded "Exhibit A" and made a part hereof, and covers, in addition thereto, rental for the aforesaid premises for the period beginning April 1st, 1943 and ending May 31st, 1944. In addition theretok Lessee further agrees to pay Lessor as rental, at the office of the License and Dues Collector of the City of San Antonio, Texas, a sum equal to two and one-half per cent (2½) of the gross monthly receipts of said

^a restaurant in excess of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for each and every month where the gross receipts exceed \$3,000.00 during any one calendar month, whether such receipts are from the sale of foodstuffs or otherwise, In other words, should the gross receipts for any calendar month exceed \$3,000.00, then and in such event Lessee shall pay Lessor 2½% of such excess for such month, and such payments to be made to Lessor not later than the 10th day of the month succeeding. Lessee further agrees to furnish to Lessor monthly statements showing the amount of gross sales for each and every month during the term of this lease, or any renewal thereof, and will produce its books for inspection to substantiate same, if requested by Lessor.

FOURTH: In the event Lessee exercises its privileges and option to renew this lease for a term beginning June 1, A.D. 1944 and ending May 31st, A.D. 1945, then it agrees to pay to Lessor, at the office of the License and Dues Collector of the City of San Antonio, Texas, on or before June 1st, 1944, the total sum of Twenty-three Hundred and Forty Dollars (\$2340.00), which said sum shall cover rental for said entire term, commencing June 1st, 1944 and ending May 31st, 1945, and in addition thereto, Lessee shall pay to Lessor 2½% of its gross monthly sales in excess of \$3,000.00, as hereinabove provided.

FIFTH: The leased premises and appurtenances thereto attached shall be occupied by Lessee for the purpose of selling food, drinks, candy, tobacco and such other articles and commodities as are usually sold and dispensed by similar institutions; and to be known as "Gunter Hotel Skiways Restaurant".

SIXTH: The Lessee represents that it has carefully examined the premises, and acknowledges same to be suitable, safe, in good condition and sufficient for the purpose for which same is to be used.

SEVENTH: The Lessee agrees that it will take good care of said premises and suffer no waste, and shall, at its own expense, keep same in good repair, and return the demised premises in good order and condition upon the termination of this lease, however terminated; and Lessee further agrees at all times to keep all of said premises in a clean, sanitary and attractive condition. In addition thereto, Lessee agrees to furnish at such time or times as may be requested by Lessor or its Airport Manager, porter service at its own expense, to take care of the inside of such restaurant as well as the men's and women's rest rooms adjoining the public waiting room, and to keep same in a clean and sanitary condition.

EIGHTH: Lessee further agrees to furnish continuously throughout the period of this lease wholesome food service to the best of its ability to do so, being restricted only by imposed O.P.A. or other Federal food rationing regulations; and Lessee further agrees at its expense to comply with all laws, rules and regulations applicable to health, sanitation, and police departments of the City of San Antonio for the correction, prevention and abatement of nuisances in or upon or connected with the premises during the term of this lease.

NINTH: Lessee further agrees that it will pay to the City of San Antonio monthly for all gas and electric service used by it in said restaurant as shown by the restaurant meters, and bills rendered by Lessor.

TENTH: To secure the payment of rentals herein, Lessee grants unto Lessor a contract lien on all fixtures that are or may be installed by it on said premises, which lien shall be cumulative of all rights of a landlord under the statutes of the State of Texas, and shall not operate as a waiver of same.

ELEVENTH: Lessee covenants and agrees that at the termination of this lease, it will surrender said premises to Lessor without notice further than as herein provided, in as good condition as when same was entered upon by it, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

TWELFTH: In case of default in any of the above covenants, Lessor shall give (5) days written notice of such default, and so long thereafter as such continues Lessor may declare

this lease forfeited at its discretion, and Lessor or Lessor's agent or attorney, shall have the right, with further notice or demand, the re-enter and removal of all persons therefrom without being deemed guilty of any manner of trespass, and without prejudice to any remedies for arrears of rent or breach of covenants; or, at its option Lessor or Lessor's agent or attorney may resume possession of the premises and re-let same for the remainder of the term at the best rent it can obtain; and the Lessor shall have a lien as security for rent aforesaid which may be due and unpaid, upon all of the goods, wares, chattels, implements, fixtures, furniture, tools and other personal property belonging to Lessee which are or may be put on the demised premises,

THIRTEENTH: The Lessee shall not make any improvements in or upon said premises without the written consent of Lessor.

FOURTEENTH: The Lessor shall not assign, sub-let or part with the possession of the whole or any part of the demised premises without first obtaining the written consent of the Lessor.

PETITION TO EXEMPT SCHOOL PROPERTY

Dear Sirs:-

The undersigned respectfully Petition Your Honors to grant them exemption from taxation of certain property utilized for school and educational purposes at No. 917 West Mulberry Avenue, in San Antonio, better described as Lots 39 to 43, inclusive, Block 24, New City Block 1803, for the following reasons:

1. Our school, known as GRIFFITHS SCHOOL, was first established in 1918 as "Beacon Kindergarten School", in cooperation with the wishes of the membership of Westminster Presbyterian Church, and its first location was at King William and Garden Streets. In 1919 it was removed, in cooperation with the membership wishes expressed by Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church, to Grant and Huisache Avenues. The school expanded in facilities and pupils until it was made a full-fledged educational institution in September 1927.

2. In January, 1943, there was a fire in the school building, then located at 1118 W. Huisache Avenue, and all the school records were destroyed. The present property was recently acquired to continue the school and educational programme. There is room for twenty (20) boarding students; we now have twenty (20) day pupils; and have had as many as sixty (60) students enrolled at one time. We take and educate students up to the Junior High Grades, and our certificates are acceptable to City Schools and our affiliation with them is equal. David Hill, a national hero, is one of our honor students.

3. Except to pay its own upkeep and the necessaries of the staff, the school is not operated for profit; it is a benevolent educational institution to help make good citizens and build character.

We respectfully submit, we should be granted equal exemption from taxation, with institutions of educational nature operated for gain.

AN ORDINANCE (2253)

AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, HEALTH CENTER REVENUE BONDS, SERIES OF 1943, IN THE AMOUNT OF FORTY THOUSAND (\$40,000.00) DOLLARS, BEARING INTEREST AT THE RATE OF THREE (3) PER CENT PER ANNUM, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING A BUILDING TO BE USED AS A HEALTH CENTER, PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID REVENUE BONDS AND THE COUPONS ATTACHED THERETO AND PROVIDING HOW SAID BONDS AND COUPONS SHALL BE EXECUTED; PLEDGING THE NET REVENUES FROM THE OPERATION OF SAID FACILITIES; AND AS SEPARABLE SECURITY, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN INDENTURE OF MORTGAGE ON SAID BUILDING TO CREATE A FIRST LIEN ON SAID PHYSICAL PROPERTY; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID INDENTURE OF MORTGATE TO BE EXECUTED BY THE MAYOR.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined upon the establishment of a health center for the City of San Antonio; and

WHEREAS, the City has been offered for such purpose the property known as the Old Alamo National Bank Building property and now known as the Commerce Building, located at the southwest corner of Commerce and Presa Streets for a total consideration of Eighty Thousand (\$80,000.00) Dollars; and

WHEREAS, it is found to be well worth the price asked therefor and is deemed to be desirable and adequate for use as a health establishment; and

WHEREAS, the United States Government has granted to the City the sum of Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars to be used as a cash payment on the purchase of such property; and

WHEREAS, it is considered advisable that the unpaid balance of the purchase price, to-wit: Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars be paid by the execution and delivery of revenue bonds to the seller of such above described property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to its Charter and the Statutes of the State of Texas, and particularly Chapter 470, page 1848 of the Acts of the Forty Fourth Legislature, 1935, Seconded Called Session, effective November 19, 1935, (Vernon's Revised Civil Statutes Art. 1180b) the City of San Antonio is authorized to issue negotiable revenue bonds for the purpose of acquiring facilities to be used as a health establishment and to pledge the net revenues of such facilities to the payment thereof and to further secure the payment of such bonds by mortgaging such project and facilities and to fix rental and concession charges for the use of the various installations and facilities of such project; and

WHEREAS, it is proper that the Board of Commissioners prescribe a form of Deed of Trust or of Indenture, which when executed will constitute a first lien on the real and personal property constituting such project, and that it provide for the execution of such Deed of Trust or of Indenture and supplementals thereto as may be necessary and for the filing thereof as a Deed of Trust and as a Chattel Mortgage; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary and proper that the Board of Commissioners proceed with the issuance of said Revenue Bonds;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

Section 1. That to provide for the purchase of a building to be used as a health center, pursuant to the provisions of the Charter, the Constitution and the laws of the State of Texas, particularly Chapter 470, page 1848 of the Acts of the 44th Legislature, 1935, Second Called Session, effective November 19, 1935, there shall be issued "City of San Antonio, Texas, Health Center Revenue Bonds, Series of 1943" (herein called "Bonds") aggregating Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars, numbered from One (1) to Forty (40), both inclusive, of the denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each.

Section 2. The bonds shall be substantially in the form prescribed herein; shall be dated April 15, 1943; shall bear interest at the rate of Three (3%) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on October 15th and April 15th of each year, the first interest payment date being April 15, 1944; principal and interest of the bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America upon presentation and surrender of bond or proper coupon at the Frost National Bank, San Antonio, Texas.

Section 9. All net revenues from said Project are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of said Series 1943 Revenue Bonds.

Section 10. And as additional, separable and independent security for the payment of the bonds, the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute and deliver to M. E. Allison as trustee (herein called "Trustee"), and the City Clerk is hereby authorized to attest on behalf of the City of San Antonio a Deed of Trust (herein called the "Deed of Trust") in substantially the form of the instrument attached hereto marked "EXHIBIT A", identified by the signature of the Mayor and the City Clerk and by imprint of the City's seal, constituting a first lien on the system and a first lien on and pledge of the net revenues from the Project with power of sale granted to the Trustee in the event of default in payment of principal or interest continued for a period of more than ninety days from date due. The Mayor is hereby directed to file a duly executed copy of such instrument with the County Clerk of Bexar County as is provided therein.

It is expressly understood that no holder of any rights under such Deed of Trust, or of any of the bonds, shall have the right to demand payment of the bonds out of moneys raised or to be raised by taxation of property in the City.

Section 11. Said "City of San Antonio, Texas, Health Center Revenue Bonds, Series 1943", are payable from and secured by an exclusive first lien upon and pledge of the net revenues of the Project.

Section 12. For the benefit of the original purchaser, and for the benefit of any and all subsequent holders of said bonds, coupons, or any part thereof, and in addition to all other provisions and covenants in the laws of the State of Texas and in this ordinance, it is expressly covenanted:-

A. USE OF REVENUES:

(a) Frost National Bank, San Antonio, Texas is hereby designated paying agent for this issue of bonds. The Interest and Sinking Fund of this issue of bonds shall also be established and maintained in said bank.

(b) It is agreed that the net revenues, as defined in Section 8 of this ordinance, will be collected promptly by said City and forwarded immediately upon receipt, to the paying agent, Frost National Bank, San Antonio, Texas, to be credited to the Interest and Sinking Fund of the issue.

(c) The City shall never be obligated to make any deposits into said Fund when and after the amount therein shall equal the principal of all outstanding bonds plus interest thereon to their maturity, unless the Fund is depleted otherwise than by payment of said bonds and interest in full.

B. ADDITIONAL BONDS: Encumbrance and Sale: While any of the bonds are outstanding, the City shall not issue any additional bonds payable from the revenues of the Project unless the lien of such bonds on the revenues of the Project is made junior and subordination in all respects to the lien of the bonds authorized in this ordinance and only under such terms and conditions as may be in accordance with then existing laws. In no event, while any of the bonds are outstanding will the City mortgage or otherwise encumber the Project or any part thereof, or sell, or otherwise dispose of any substantial portion of such System. These provisions shall inure to the benefit of, and be enforceable by any holder of any of the bonds.

C. MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION. The City shall maintain the Project in good condition and operate the same in an efficient manner and at a reasonable cost. So long as any of the bonds are outstanding, the City agrees to maintain insurance, for the benefit of the holders of the bonds, on the Project of a kind and in an amount which usually would be carried by private companies engaged in a similar type of business.

D. ACCOUNTS AND PERIODIC STATEMENTS: The City shall keep proper books of record and accounts (separate from all other records and accounts) in which complete and correct entries shall be made of all transactions relating to the Project. The City shall furnish to any holder of any of the bonds, at the written request of such holder, not more than thirty days after the close of each six months' fiscal period, operating an income statements of the Project in reasonable detail covering such six months' period, and, not more than sixty days after the close of each fiscal year, complete financial statement of the Project in reasonable detail covering such fiscal year, certified by the Mayor and the City Clerk of said City.

E. INSPECTION: Any holder or holders of 25 per centum of aggregate principal amount of the bonds at the time then outstanding shall have the right at all reasonable times to inspect the Project and all records, accounts and data of the City relating thereto.

F. SALE OF BONDS: Upon request, the City will furnish to any purchaser of 25 per centum of the bonds, information for the preparation of a bond circular in customary form, signed

by the proper officials of the City, containing such data as such purchaser may reasonably request concerning the Project.

Section 13. The Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby instructed and directed to do any and all things necessary and/or convenient in reference to the installing and maintaining of a complete system of records and accounts pertaining to said Project.

Section 14. The City hereby further covenants as follows:

(a) That the bonds authorized hereunder shall be special obligations of the City and that no holder of any of said bonds shall ever have the right to have the same paid, in whole or in part, out of funds derived from taxation.

(b) That it has the lawful power to pledge the revenues supporting the bonds and has lawfully exercised said power under the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, including power existing under Chapter 470, page 1848, Acts of the 44th Legislature, 1935, Second Called Session, effective November 19, 1935; that the bonds shall be ratably secured under said pledge of income, in such manner that no one bond shall have preference over any other bond of said issue.

(c) And as additional, separable and independent security for the payment of the bonds, that it has the lawful power to authorize and have executed the Deed of Trust constituting a first mortgage on the physical properties of the Project and everything pertaining thereto acquired or to be acquired.

(d) That other than for the payment of the bonds herein provided for, the rents, revenues and income of the said Project, hereinabove referred to, have not in any manner been pledged to the payment of any debt or obligation of the City, or of the Project.

Section 15. All orders and resolutions, and parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed insofar as they conflict herewith.

Section 16. In case any one or more of the provisions of this ordinance, the Deed of Trust or of the bonds or coupons issued hereunder or the application of such provisions to any person or situation shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not effect any other provision of this ordinance, the Deed of Trust or of said bonds or coupons or the application of such provisions to any other person or situation, but this ordinance, the Deed of Trust and said bonds and coupons shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions have not been contained therein.

This Deed of Trust, dated as of the 15th day of April, 1943, by and between the City of San Antonio, Texas, a municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas, (for brevity hereinafter called "the City"), acting through its Board of Commissioners duly authorized by an ordinance passed by said Board, party of the First Part, and M. E. Allison, of the City of San Antonio, County of Bexar, Texas, (for brevity hereinafter called "Trustee") Party of the Second Part:

W I T N E S S E T H :

The City for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar, to it in hand paid by the said Trustee, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said M. E. Allison, Trustee, and to his successors in trust, all and singular, the following described property, to-wit:

Situated within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, in the County of Bexar and State of Texas, and being part of New City Block 156,

BEGINNING at the intersection of the present south line of West Commerce Street and the west line of North Presa Street;

THENCE south along the west line of North Presa Street 81.6 feet, more or less, to a stake set for the southeast corner of the property formerly owned by the Alamo National Bank;

THENCE in a westerly direction with an angle of 96 degrees and 51 minutes turn from north to west along the new south property line of the property formerly owned by the Alamo National Bank, a distance of 69 feet, more or less, to the southwest corner of this tract;

THENCE in a northerly direction with an angle of 88 degrees 51 minutes west, turn from east to north, a distance of 77.0 feet to a point on the south line of West Commerce Street for the northwest corner of this tract;

THENCE east along the present south line of West Commerce Street with an angle of 94 degrees 8 minutes, turn from north to east, a distance of 77.3 feet, to the place of beginning, together with the eight story building and improvements situated thereon.

Together with all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the same belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said premises unto the said M. E. Allison, Trustee, his successors or assigns forever, together with all rights and appurtenances thereunto belonging and hereby expressly bind the City and its legal representatives to Warrant and Defend the title to said premises unto the said Trustee, his successors or assigns, against all persons whomsoever claiming any part thereof. This conveyance is in trust, however, for the following purposes and upon the following conditions, viz:

If the City shall pay off and discharge, or cause to be paid off and discharged, according to the tenor and effect thereof, the revenue bonds issued by said City payable to the W. K. Ewing Company, Inc., or its order, described as follows:

City of San Antonio, Texas, Health Center Revenue Bonds, Series of 1943, dated April 15, 1943, numbered from One (1) to Forty (40), both inclusive, in the denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, aggregating Forty Thousand (\$40,000.00) Dollars, bearing interest at the rate of three (3%) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, on October 15th and April 15th of each year, first interest being payable April 15, 1944, and maturing serially One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per year for the first five years, the first maturity being one year after date; during the next five years the maturity shall be Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) annually; and thereafter Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) annually including the year 1958, unless sooner called for redemption, as provided in the ordinance authorizing the issuance thereof, and which bonds are issued for the purpose of purchasing a building to be used as a health center providing health facilities. Said bonds are payable from the net revenues of said facilities and are further secured by the first mortgage lien herein created on the property so purchased. Said bonds are issued on the condition that the holder or holders shall never have the right to demand payment thereof from revenues raised or to be raised by taxation and shall never constitute a charge on the general revenues of the City;

and shall pay or cause to be paid, all other indebtedness secured by this Deed of Trust, then the said conveyance shall become null and void and the lien of this trust deed shall be duly released, but if default shall be made in the payment of the principal or interest of such bonds or if the

terms and conditions of the contract of encumbrance are otherwise violated then the said Trustee, or his successor in trust shall be and is hereby authorized and empowered, when requested to do so by the holder or holders of said bonds, or any of them, after such default to sell the said property herein conveyed at public sale for cash, between the hours of 10:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. of the first Tuesday in any month at the door of the County Court House of Bexar County, Texas, after posting written notice thereof for three consecutive weeks prior to the day of sale in three public places in the County, one of which shall be at the door of said Court House. It is provided, however, that such foreclosure proceedings shall not be begun by said Trustee, and no option to mature any part of the obligations herein described because of any default in the payment of any installment of principal or interest, or the violation of the terms and conditions of the pledges given shall be exercised until ninety (90) day written notice shall have been given to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the default claimed, and which notice shall date from the sending of a prepaid registered letter to each person to be notified, addressed to them at the post office of the City of San Antonio. Provided further that if the default shall have been cured before the expiration of the ninety (90) days, it shall have like effect as if no default had occurred or been claimed.

In the event the property herein conveyed is sold pursuant to the provisions hereof, the Trustee, or his successors, shall make to the purchaser thereof a good and sufficient deed in fee simple to the premises so sold, making the usual covenants and warranties; and any statement or recital of facts in such deed as to the non-payment of the indebtedness hereby secured, the existence of such indebtedness, notice by advertisement, sale, the receipt of the money, and as to the appointment of a substitute Trustee, as hereinafter provided, shall be prima facie evidence of the truth of such statement or recital; and the Trustee shall apply the proceeds of said sale as follows; First, to the payment of all necessary costs and expenses incident to the execution of said trust, including a commission of two and one-half (2½%) per cent upon the amount of the proceeds of sale to the Trustee as his compensation. Second: to the payment of the said Bonds then unpaid, including principal and such interest of said Bonds as shall have accrued, and all taxes, assessments, insurance premiums or other advancements made as provided for herein, with interest thereon (it being understood and agreed that when default shall be made in the payment of said Bonds, or any of them, or any part thereof, when due, or of any installment of interest thereon, said Bonds shall become due and payable at the option of the holders thereof). Third, the balance, if any shall be paid to the City of San Antonio.

And the City does hereby covenant that until said indebtedness shall have been fully paid it will insure and keep insured in a good and solvent fire insurance company, or companies, acceptable to said Trustee, the buildings and improvements on the land hereinbefore described to the full amount for which the same may be insurable, and will pay the premiums for such insurance and will cause the loss, if any, under the policies, to be made payable to said Trustee, as a further security for the payment of said debt, and will deliver such policies to said Trustee; provided, however, that if the said insured premises shall be injured or destroyed by fire before the maturity of said debt, the trustee may apply the insurance money received towards the payment of said Bonds or towards the restoration of the insured premises, at the option of the holder or holders of said Bonds, the premises so restored to be reinsured and kept insured in manner as aforesaid; and that it will pay all lawful taxes and assessments upon the premises hereinbefore conveyed and any and all taxes and assessments charged against said Bonds or this deed of trust; and if it shall fail to pay said insurance premiums, or said taxes and assessments when due, the Trustees or the holder of said Bonds may pay the same, and such payment shall be considered as part of the expenses of the execution of this trust and paid as such out of the proceeds of the sale of said premises hereby conveyed, together with interest thereon

at 6% per annum from the time of payment by such trustee or holder; provided, however, that the exercise of the right of advancement herein provided for shall in no wise be considered or constitute a waiver of the right of the holder of said bonds to declare same, and all other indebtedness hereunder, to be due and payable.

In case of the death of the said M. E. A. Allison, Trustee, or of his removal from the County of Bexar, or his refusal or inability for any reason to make said sale or to perform said trusts, then the holder or holders of said bonds, or any of them, shall have the right, and are hereby authorized and empowered to appoint, in writing, a suitable person, resident of Bexar County, Texas, who shall become the Trustee herein, as the substitute for said M. E. Allison and said substitute Trustee shall thereupon succeed to all the estate, powers and trusts hereinbefore granted to and vested in the said M. E. Allison.

M. E. Allison, herein named, hereby accepts the Trustees and obligations hereby imposed upon him, and in evidence of such acceptance has signed these presents.

The bonds hereby secured constitute special obligations of the City of San Antonio, in accordance with the terms and provisions of Chapter 470, page 1848, Acts of the 44th Legislature, 1935, Second Called Session, effective November 19, 1935. The holder or holders of said bonds shall never have the right to have same paid, in whole or in part, out of funds raised from taxation on any of the properties within the City.

In case of any one or more of the provisions of this Deed of Trust, or of the Bonds or coupons issued hereunder or the application of such provisions to any person or situation shall for any reason be held illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions of this Deed of Trust or of the Bonds or coupons or the application of such provisions to any other person or situation, but this Deed of Trust and the Bonds and coupons shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained therein.

AN ORDINANCE (2268)

GRANTING EASEMENT TO SOUTH TEXAS PROPERTIES CO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. The South Texas Properties Co., a private corporation, its successors or assigns, is granted an easement for the use of a tract of land 60 feet wide, extending from the Jones-Maltsberger Road to certain properties owned by the South Texas Properties Co., and said 60 foot tract of land being described as follows, to-wit:-

All that certain tract or parcel of land situate in Bexar County, Texas, and more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point at the intersection of the west property line of the Jones-Maltsberger Road and the north line of the Olmos Basin Tract for the northeast corner of this tract and also being the northeast corner of the Olmos Basin Tract and the southeast corner of the J. Renz Tract;

Thence South 89° - 50' west, 392.0 feet along the division line between the J. Renz Tract and the Olmos Basin Tract to a point for the northwest corner of this tract, also the northeast corner of the 30.61 acre tract owned by the South Texas Properties Co.;

Thence South 8° - 02' west, 60.61 feet along the division line between the Olmos Basin Tract and the South Texas Properties Co. tract to a point for the southwest corner of this tract;

Thence North 89° - 50' East, 402.21 feet to a point in the west property line of the Jones-Maltsberger Road for the southeast corner of this tract;

Thence North 1° - 40' west, 60.02 feet along the west property line of the Jones-Maltsberger Road to the place of beginning, containing .54 acres of land, more or less.

2. The South Texas Properties Co., its successors or assigns, shall have the right to use the aforesaid described land for road purposes; and shall have the right to grade or pave same, but the City of San Antonio to be in no way liable for or called upon to pay any part or portion of such grading or paving expense, nor for the maintenance of any road over such right-of-way.

3. The South Texas Properties Co. further agrees to hold the City of San Antonio free and harmless and reimburse it, from all demands or damages to persons or property that may result from the grant of this permit or the exercise of any rights thereunder; and, to defend all actions brought against the City as a result thereof; and, to pay all costs and expense to which the City may be put as a result thereof.

4. The grant herein is subject to the rights of the public, and to the rights of the other abutting property owners; and, is subject to revocation at the will of the governing body of the City of San Antonio if in the opinion of the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio it is deemed that public necessity and convenience requires such action.

5. This grant shall never mature into a vested right for which compensation will inure to the benefit of the South Texas Properties Co., its successors or assigns, on account of the revocation of this grant, or any change made therein.

6. The exercise of any act under this ordinance shall be a complete acceptance of all its terms and conditions by the South Texas Properties Co., its successors or assigns.

MAKING AND MANIFESTING AN EASEMENT TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
THROUGH CITY PROPERTY IN COLUMBIA HEIGHTS ADDITION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO;

1. That the City of San Antonio, a municipal corporation, of the County of Bexar, State of Texas, for and in consideration of the sum of \$150.00 cash in hand paid by the United States of America, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged and confessed, does by these presents hereby BARGAIN, GRANT, SELL, and CONVEY unto the said United States of America and unto its successors and assigns forever a perpetual easement and right-of-way in, under and across the following described land lying and being situate in the County of Bexar, State of Texas, to-wit:

2. A part of the property in Block 8, County Block 4028, in Columbia Heights Addition to the City of San Antonio, according to plat thereof recorded in Vol. 105, page 14-15, Bexar County Plat Records, conveyed to San Antonio Public Service Company indeed recorded in Vol. 1809, page 142, Bexar County Deed Records; being more particularly parts of Lots 5, 6, 7 and 8, and described by metes and bounds as follows:

Beginning at a point in the southerly line of aforesaid Lot 8, which point is N. 89 deg. 43 min. E. 57.2 feet along said line from the southwest corner of said Lot 8 and of said San Antonio Public Service Company tract;

The easement and right-of-way hereby conveyed is for the following purposes, namely, the perpetual right to construct, erect, operate, remove, maintain, repair, rebuild and patrol a 72 inch storm sewer pipe line, including all related appurtenances and priveleges thereunto belonging, together with the right of entry on the land over which said easement is granted, and the right of access over adjoining land owned by the Grantor necessary for the proper construction, maintenance and repair of said storm sewer pipe line; also the right to trim, cut, fell and remove trees, branches, underbrush and other obstructions within the limits of the easement or right-of-way and for such distance beyond such limits adjacent thereto as is necessary to eliminate hazards and to provide adequate clearance and permit free use and enjoyment of the said easement.

4. The Grantor reserves the right to use the surface of the land under which the drain shall have been sonstructed, for all purposes not inconsistent with the rights granted herein to the Grantee.

5. All surplus material resulting from the construction of the drainage and the drain shall be removed from the property by the Grantee, and the property shall be left as nearly as possible in its original condition.

6. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the United States of America and its assigns, forever, with all tenements, appurtenances, and hereditaments thereunto belonging.
