

AN ORDINANCE

ORDERING AN ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING
A PROPOSITION TO ISSUE \$300,000.00 ADDITIONAL
AUDITORIUM BONDS; AND DESIGNATING POLLING PLACES
AND OFFICERS OF SUCH ELECTION.

WHEREAS, heretofore, to-wit on the 1st day of September, 1921, the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio passed an ordinance authorizing the issuance of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AUDITORIUM BONDS, for the purpose of constructing an auditorium in and for said City; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that said sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is entirely inadequate to construct an auditorium to meet the needs of said City, and that it will require an additional bond issue to supplement the funds available to construct said auditorium; and

WHEREAS, the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio deem it advisable to issue said additional bonds for said purpose; THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That an election be, and the same is hereby ordered to be held on the 9 day of September, 1922, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted:

"Shall the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the sum of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00), payable serially one to ~~forty~~ years after date, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent (5%) per annum, payable semi-annually, for the purpose of supplementing the available bond fund for the construction of an auditorium, in and for the City of San Antonio; and to levy a tax sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem them at maturity."

and those opposed shall have printed on their ballots the words:

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$300,000.00 additional
AUDITORIUM BONDS"

The Manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws of the State regulating general elections.

A copy of this ordinance, signed by the Mayor, shall serve as proper notice of said election, and the Mayor is directed to cause notice of said election to be posted at three public places in the City of San Antonio, at least thirty days prior to the date of said election; and he is further directed to publish said notice of election in a newspaper of general circulation, in the City of San Antonio, at least once a week for at least thirty ^{days} prior to the date of said election.

Said election shall be held in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and only qualified voters, who are property taxpayers of the City of San Antonio, shall be allowed to vote, and all voters desiring to support the proposition to issue bonds shall have printed on their ballots:

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$300,000.00 ADDITIONAL AUDITORIUM BONDS," and those opposed shall have printed on their ballots the words: "AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$300,000.00 ADDITIONAL AUDITORIUM BONDS."

The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws of the State regulating general elections.

A copy of this ordinance, signed by the Mayor, shall serve as proper notice of said election, and the Mayor is directed to cause notice of said election to be posted at three public places in the City of San Antonio, at least thirty days prior to the date of said election; and he is further directed to publish said notice of election in a newspaper of general circulation, in the City of San Antonio, at least once a week for at least thirty days prior to the date of said election.
