A large delegation of citizens from the southwest section of the city was present in the audience to show their interest in the right of way purchases being proposed and they cheered the action of passing the foregoing ordinance. Mr. Dan Traugott, Mr. Henry Van de Walle and Mr. Jacob Rodriguez all thanked and congratulated the council in speeches. Mr. Van de Walle especially called the attention of the council to the great value of the truck farming industry to the city and he called attention to the value of the completion of the freeways to that industry. Mr. Leslie Neal, Chairman of the Highway Committee of the Chamber of Commerce, also spoke and expressed the hope that the negotiation would soon be purchasing right of way.

Since the grade separation at the IGN & T & NO tracks was not mentioned in the ordinance it was agreed to have another drawn.

Gentlemen:

The following petitions were received and forwarded to the City Manager for his recommendation or action.

- 11-15-54 Petition of Guadalupe M. Salas requesting refund of \$2.00 paid for Food Establishment license which was a duplicate license.
- 11-15-54 Petition of First Friends Church requesting tax exemption of Lot 10, Block 5, NCB 7188.
- 11-16-54 Petition of Dan E. Genard, et al, requesting a grade separation be provided at the IGN Railroad tracks; neither W. Commerce St. nor Buena Vista Street be declared a one-way street; and Hwy 90 West remain on West Commerce Street.
- 11-17-54 Petition of Most. Rev. Robert E. Lucey, Archbishop of the City of San Antonio, requesting tax exemption of Lots 5 & 6, NCB 2982
- 11-18-54 Petition of J. C. Torres requesting refund of \$13.00 paid for building permit fee.
- 11-18-54 Petition of residents of Jean Street requesting that some grading be done to the street.
- 11-18-54 Petition of Recreation Improvement Association for Southwest San Antonio Youth requesting financial and engineering aid for recreational projects.
- 11-18-54 Petition of Sociedad Union Protectora de Kenwood requesting tax exemption of Lots 19, 20, and 21, NCB 7295.

Mrs. Johnnie Brink and Mrs. Hayden Miller representing the P.T.A. were then recognized to urge the council to take action on the matter heretofore discussed of sidewalks in the vicinity of James Madison School.

Mrs. Abshire, representing the Safety Council, asked that the City add to the committee appointed in this matter to include P.T.A. and Safety Council members.

Mr. Dillashaw then made the following motion:

"I move the continuance of the committee appointed by the City Council to study the request of the Madison P.T.A. in regards to a solution of the existing problem of Safety. Also that said committee be augmented by two or three other individuals, suggested: representatives of P.T.A., Traffic Engineer, and Director of Bureau of Safety and Dr. Rice to fully study existing safety conditions at the location and report in a reasonable time."

The motion was unanimously adopted by a voice vote. The City Manager then reported to the council that he had requests from a large number of Houston Street merchants to make a special rule that NO PARKING be allowed on Houston Street between Flores and Alamo Streets during the holidays. Since an ordinance would be required to make an enforceable regulation, the City Manager was instructed to make his wants known to have the City Attorney draft an ordinance for council action.

On motion of Mr. Rudeloff, seconded by Mr. Lacy, the meeting adjourned.
