TEXAS, HELD AT 10:00 O'CLOCK, A. M. ON THURSDAY, JULY 22, 1943,
IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER AT THE CITY HALL, SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS

Mayor Pro Tempore presiding.

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The Clerk read the Minutes of the regular meeting of July 15th and of the special meeting

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Mayor Mauermann then welcomed the Mayor of Monterrey, Senor Constancio Villareal, and his guests to the Council meeting.

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Upon motion by Commissioner Anderson, duly seconded and unanimously carried, the Mayor of Monterrey was elected an Honorary Member of the Council. Mayor Mauermann turned the Mayor's chair and gavel over to Mayor Villareal and Mayor Villareal made a motion that the cities of Monterrey, Mexico, and San Antonio be classed in the future as sister cities. The motion was unanimously carried. Senor Villareal made another motion that the citizens of Mexico, as well as the United States of America, go on record concurring with our leaders in demanding the unconditional surrender of the Axis powers.

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Mayor Villareal of Monterrey and his guests made speeches before the Council in appreciation of the courteous treatment tendered them by the Mayor and Commissioners.

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Mayor Villareal was appointed an Honorary Special Police Inspector of the City of San Antonio and Commissioner Anderson presented him with a gold police badge.

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There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Villareal moved that the meeting be adjourned, which motion was unanimously carried, and the meeting adjourned July 23, 1943.
