The following resolution was read and adopted:

#### RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, blank credentials shall be issued to the representative of each group of candidates at the General election to be held on the 13th day of May, 1919, so that any Judge or Clerk or Supervisor, whose name has been submitted to the Board of Commissioners and who shall for any reason fail or refuse to serve, may be substituted by said representative of such group of candidates by the issuance of credentials by such representatives to the person who is substituted in the place or stead of any Judge or Clerk or Supervisor, who may so fail or refuse to serve, and the presiding officer of any precinct shall recognize and permit those persons holding credentials duly signed by the representatives aforesaid and permit them to serve in the capacity stated in their credentials, provided that neither group of candidates shall have more than two judges and two clerks, and one supervisor in one polling place at one time.

It is the intention of this resolution to grant to each group of candidates equal representation in each of the 49 voting precincts in the City of San Antonio, and to grant to the duly accredited representatives of such group of candidates full authority to substitute any Judge or Clerk or Supervisor, in any voting precinct, in the place or stead of any such person as may have been theretofore appointed to act as such.

MC-883 AN ORDINANCE

Accepting offer of compromise and settlement, and authorizing the execution of a release of a weed and brush lien on certain lots belonging to G.E. Jack

WHEREAS, on the 31st day of July, 1918, the City of San Antonio caused to be filed in the office of the County Clerk of Bexar County, Texas, in Volume 541, page 203 of the Deed records of said County, the sworn statement of its City Health Officer certifying to the cost of certain work and improvements, on the dates and in the manner set out in said statement, to the property therein described, belonging to G.E. Jack, by removing therefrom all weeds and brush, creating or causing a nuisance thereon detrimental to public health, and asserting a privileged lien upon said property under and by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 184, page 405, of the acts of the regular session of the Thirty Fifth Legislature as carried into effect by an ordinance passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the 11th day of June, 1917; and

WHEREAS, the said G.E. Jack, the owner of said property, has declined to pay the full amount of the cost and expense of said work on the ground that the same is unjust and unreasonable, but has offered by way of compromise to pay the sum of \$54.92, in full satisfaction and settlement of said claim; and

WHEREAS, it appears that a mistake was made in the description of lots 18 to 24 inclusive, in that the Block Number in which said lots are situated is omitted from the statement filed in the office of the County Clerk, and the lien claimed as to said lots is therefore invalid and unenforceable; and after a full investigation said Commissioners, being of the opinion that the settlement offered by the said G.E. Jack is fair and reasonable and should be accepted; Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That said offer and compromise be and the same is hereby accepted and, upon the payment to the City of San Antonio of the sum of Fifty Four and 92/100 (\$54.92) Dollars, that the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver proper discharge, release and acquittance to the said G.E. Jack, his heirs or assigns, of all the right, title or interest which the City of San Antonio may have or be entitled to under and by virtue of the filing of said statement in the office of the County Clerk of Bexar County, Texas, which appears in Volume 541, page 203, of the Deed Records of said County, and to declare said property fully released and discharged from any and all liens, created thereby.

On motion of Commissioner Heuermann, duly seconded and carried, permission was granted the International Refinery Company to connect with sewer built by the U.S.Govt from Camp Normoyle.

- 889 AN ORDINANCE

Submitting a proposed amendment to the Charter of the City of San Antonio to a vote of the people and calling a special election therefor, as provided by law.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

WHEREAS, heretofore, to-wit, on the 14th day of April, 1919, the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, by a resolution duly passed and approved, declared its intention to pass an ordinance submitting to a vote of the people a certain proposed amendment to the Charter of the City, and ordering that twenty days notice of such intention be given by the publication of such resolution and notice for ten days in a newspaper of general circulation published in this City; and

WHEREAS, said notice was duly given and published as aforesaid, the first date of such publication having been on the \_\_\_ day of April, 1919; and

WHEREAS, there has been a petition by more than the requisite number of voters asking the Commission to submit to a vote of the people, as provided by law, the proposed amendment to the Charter to the voters of the City of San Antonio; Now therefore, Be It Hereby Further Ordained:

SECTION ONE: That a special election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held and conducted in this City on the 9th day of June, A.D. 1919, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City a certain proposed amendment to the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION TWO: That the manner and effect of holding said election shall be governed by those certain provisions of the constitution and laws of the State of Texas authorizing cities having more than five thousand inhabitants, by a majority vote of the qualified voters of such City at an election held for that purpose to adopt and amend their charters; and as provided by law only those persons shall vote at said election and who are qualified voters of said City.

SECTION THREE: That said election shall be held within the City of San Antonio in each of the forty-nine (49) election precincts thereof, variously located in each of the eight (8) several wards of said City, as said election precincts are

now lawfully defined, and said election herein ordered shall be held at the place in each such respective election precinct named and set opposite the number of such precinct in the following table, to-wit:

SECTION FOUR: That the Mayor of this City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his proclamation calling said special election: and that at such special election the following proposed amendment to the Charter of the City of San Antonio shall be, and the same is hereby, submitted to the qualified voters of the City for approval or rejection, to-wit:

That the Charter of the City of San Antonio be amended by adding thereto the following provision, which shall be known as Section 16-a:

"The Fire Department of the City of San Antonio shall be maintained upon the two platoon or double shift system, and appropriate action shall be taken by the Commissioners carrying this provision into effect."

SECTION FIVE: That the ballot for said election shall be prepared as provided by law, and in such manner that each voter may vote "yes" or "no" upon said amendment.

SECTION SIX: That the managers or officers of said election for each said election precinct shall be hereafter appointed and selected in accordance with the laws and ordinances for such cases made and provided.

SECTION SEVEN: That the Mayor and City Clerk be and they are hereby directed to cause publication of this ordinance at once in some newspaper of general circulation published in this City, and to require and preserve proper proof of such publication; and also to have printed a sufficient number of copies of said proposed amendment and to mail a copy of said proposed amendment to each qualified voter of this City as appears

from the tax collector's rolls for the year ending January 31, 1919.

SECTION EIGHT: That after the votes cast at said election shall have been counted, the Commissioners shall make and cause to be entered an official order upon the records of the City, showing the results of said election and the approval or rejection of such proposed amendment, and such amendment, if approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting at such election, shall be shown and declared by such official order to have been adopted, and from and after the entry as aforesaid of such official order, such amendment so declared to have been approved and adopted shall be and become a part of the Charter of the City of San Antonio.


