

A RESOLUTION **2011 - 11 - 03 - 0030R**

**ACCEPTING THE LACKLAND AFB JOINT LAND USE STUDY (JLUS)
REPORT AND SUPPORTING RELATED COMMUNITY INITIATIVES.**

WHEREAS, Lackland Air Force Base is a vital national security resource and an asset to the San Antonio area, and with knowledge that the installation has already seen a significant increase in missions, units, and infrastructure with more additions in the near future; and

WHEREAS, the missions at Lackland AFB are affected by growth and development around the perimeter of the installation and the necessity of compatible land use has become a critical element in helping to preserve and protect the quality and quantity of the training being conducted at the base; and

WHEREAS, in promoting compatible land use to protect the mission of Lackland AFB the importance of private property rights is recognized and will be respected in this process; and

WHEREAS, without effective, well-defined, and specific strategies put in place the training and operational missions of Lackland AFB and future success of Port San Antonio may be put in jeopardy; and

WHEREAS, Lackland AFB generates a significant portion of \$13.3 billion of the DoD impact on the local community and the training conducted at Lackland AFB is vital not only to our national security but to the economic security of San Antonio and the surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, the Lackland AFB Joint Land Use Study was initiated in December 2009 with San Antonio and Bexar County, joining together with Lackland AFB, Joint Base San Antonio officials, and other agencies and interested parties with the goal of promoting compatible land use around the installation; and

WHEREAS, the study recommends strategies to address a variety of land use and operational issues, including incompatible land use, noise, outdoor lighting, aviation safety impacts, communication/notification procedures, and traffic and drainage issues; and

WHEREAS, the Lackland AFB JLUS Executive Committee has recommended that the JLUS local government partners adopt a resolution to accept the JLUS report and support the community initiatives as described in the study; **NOW THEREFORE:**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO
THAT:**

SECTION 1. The City Council of the City of San Antonio does hereby endorse and support the missions of Lackland AFB and accepts the Joint Land Use Study final report and endorses and supports the JLUS recommendations.

SECTION 2. The City Council is determined that Lackland AFB not only remain an active and vital military installation, but also that Lackland AFB receive additional missions, units, businesses, facilities, equipment, and related active duty military and civilian personnel.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be transmitted to the 502nd Air Base Wing Commander, Joint Base San Antonio, the Bexar County Judge, and the DoD Office of Economic Adjustment, immediately upon adoption.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall be in effect immediately upon adoption.






