1. That "An Ordinance declaring the public necessity for the opening and extending of the Fredericksburg Road, from the East line of North Flores Street to the West line of San Pedro Avenue at its intersection with the North line of Warren Street; directing the City Engineer to prepare plans, profiles, plats, specifications and property owners roll and report; declaring the intention of the City to assess a part of the cost of said improvement against the abutting property and against the owners thereof", passed and approved on the 13th day of January, A. D. 1930;

And "An Ordinance approving report and roll filed by the City Engineer, with reference to the extension and widening of Fredericksburg Road, between its intersection with the east line of North Flores Street, and the West line of San Pedro Avenue, together with attached documents", passed and approved on the 24th day of March, A. 77J-727 AN ORDINANCE

DECLARING THE PUBLIC NECESSITY TO OPEN AND EXTEND THE FREDERICKSBURG ROAD FROM THE EAST LINE OF NORTH FLORES STREET TO THE NORTH LINE OF CYPRESS STREET; DIRECTING THE CITY ENGINEER TO PREPARE PLANS, PROFILES, PLATS, SPECIFICATIONS, ROLL OF PROPERTY OWNERS AND REPORT; AND DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE CITY TO ASSESS A PART OF THE COST OF THE IMPROVEMENT AGAINST ABUTTING PROPERTY AND ITS OWNERS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That a public necessity exists for the improvement of the Fredericksburg Road in the City of San Antonio by opening and extending it from its intersection with the East line of North Flores Street to the North line of Cypress Street; and that Special Assessments and taxes shall be made and levied as provided by the Statutes of the State of Texas, by the Charter of the

City of San Antonio and by the Ordinances of the City of San Antonio, on account of the cost of such improvement.

2. That the improvement shall consist in general of the opening and extension of said street between the points aforesaid by establishing new street lines, sidewalk lines and property lines; by removing such buildings, structures and improvement as may conflict with the new lines of the street, and acquiring of such property as may be necessary so that when said street extension is completed, that it shall have a width of 60 feet generally between property lines, with a roadway of 44 feet and a sidewalk on each side of the street approximately 8 feet in width.

3. That the City Engineer is hereby directed to prepare Plans, Profiles, Plat and Specifications covering the proposed improvement, in accordance with this Ordinance, and to report same to these Commissioners forthwith, together with a statement of the cost of such improvements, the names of the property owners abutting thereon, the description of the property which will abut upon said street as improved, and the amount, if any, to be assessed against said owners and said property as their, or its, cost of making such improvement.

4. That the cost of said improvements shall be discharged as follows:-

4a. An amount, not exceeding three-fourths (3/4) of the whole cost thereof, shall be paid by the owners of the property abutting on said street, as opened and extended, and shall be assessed against them and their property as provided for by law and ordinance, provided however, that no assessment shall be made against any property or owner thereof until after legal hearing notice shall have been given to said property owners and legal hearing had; nor shall any assessment be made against any property or owner thereof in excess of the actual benefit to such owner in the enhanced value of his property by means of such improvement as ascertained at such hearing.

4b. The remainder of the cost of said improvement, not to exceed \$5,000.00. shall be paid by the City of San Antonio.


