ORDINANCE CALLING BOND ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS §
CITY OF SAN ANTONIO §

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, has determined, and hereby affirmatively declares, that it is necessary and desirable to call and hold an election in the City on the propositions of issuing bonds payable from ad valorem taxes for the purposes hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to proceed with the ordering of such election; Now, Therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. An election shall be held on January 26, 1980, in the City of San Antonio, Texas, in the several election precincts of said City, and at the several polling places, as shall be designated by the City Council by supplemental ordinance to be adopted for such purpose, and, upon adoption, each such supplemental ordinance shall be deemed a part of this Ordinance for all purposes. On election day the polls shall be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

2. At such election the following propositions shall be submitted in accordance with law:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

SHALL THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE, IN ONE OR MORE SERIES OR ISSUES, BONDS OF THE CITY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,978,000, WITH THE BONDS OF EACH SERIES OR ISSUE TO MATURE SERIALLY NOT MORE THAN 40 YEARS FROM THEIR DATE, AND TO BE SOLD AT SUCH PRICES AND BEAR INTEREST AT SUCH RATES, NOT TO EXCEED THE MAXIMUM RATES PERMITTED BY LAW, AS SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, AND TO LEVY AND CAUSE TO BE ASSESSED AND COLLECTED ANNUAL AD VALOREM TAXES IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE ANNUAL INTEREST ON SUCH BONDS AND PROVIDE A SINKING FUND FOR THE PAYMENT OF SUCH BONDS AT MATURITY, FOR THE ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY AND MAKING IMPROVEMENTS FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES, TO-WIT: PROVIDING PUBLIC LIBRARY IMPROVEMENTS AND FACILITIES, NAMELY:

3. For purposes of conducting the election, voting machines shall be used at each polling place on the day of the election and for absentee voting, except that absentee voting by mail shall be by paper ballots. The official ballots for such election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid propositions, with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings, and language as required by law, and with such propositions to be expressed substantially as follows:

4. The Mayor of the City of San Antonio shall appoint for each election precinct a presiding judge and an alternate presiding judge and shall fix the maximum number of clerks which may be appointed to serve in each precinct.

5. The City Clerk is hereby appointed the clerk for absentee voting for the election (Mailing Address: City Clerk, City of San Antonio, P.O. Box 9066, San Antonio, Texas 78285). Absentee voting by personal appearance shall be conducted at the Office of the City Clerk, City Hall, San Antonio, Texas and also at any temporary branch office for absentee voting by personal appearance as shall hereafter be designated by supplemental ordinance, from 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on each day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or official state holiday during the period commencing on Monday, January 7, 1980, and ending on Tuesday, January 22, 1980, and at any other times as shall be designated by supplemental ordinance, and, upon adoption, each such supplemental ordinance shall be deemed a part of this Ordinance for all purposes.

6. All resident, qualified electors of the City of San Antonio shall be entitled to vote at the election, and the election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the Texas Election Code and other applicable laws.

7. Notice of the election shall be given by posting a substantial copy of this Ordinance and each ordinance supplemental hereto in English and in Spanish in at least three (3) public places in the City of San Antonio and also at the City Hall, not less than 15 days prior to the date set for the election; and a substantial copy of this Ordinance and each ordinance supplemental hereto also shall be published in English and in Spanish on the same day in each of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of San Antonio, the date of the first publication to be not less than 30 days prior to the date set for the election.

8. All bonds voted at such election shall be issued only in accordance with, and subject to all restrictions and requirements of, all applicable law.

9. This Ordinance is hereby passed as an emergency measure, to be effective immediately upon enactment, such emergency being that the proceeds from the bonds to be voted on as herein provided are required as soon as possible for the preservation of the public peace, property, health, and safety.

10. The City Council officially finds, determines, recites and declares that a sufficient written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of this meeting of the City Council was posted at a place convenient and readily accessible at all times to the general public at the City Hall of the City for the time required by law preceding this meeting, as required by the Open Meetings Law, Article 6252-17, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes, as amended; and that this meeting has been open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Ordinance and the subject matter thereof has been discussed, considered and formally acted upon. The City Council further ratifies, approves and confirms such written notice and the contents and posting thereof.




