

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, OCTOBER 2nd, A.D. 1916. 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Uhr.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

----MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS-----

Petition of Star Liquor Co. for permit to move an electric sign, was read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police.

Petition of Hillje and King for permit to use ground under sidewalk on W. Travis Street for basement, was read and granted. Adopted.

Petition of J. A. Leopold for permit to install gasoline tank, was read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police.

Petition of citizens for bridge across Martinez Creek, was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets, Bridges and Public Improvements.

On motion of Commissioner Kearny the hearing of property owners on the widening of W. Commerce Street, between Main Plaza and Santa Rosa Avenue, was postponed until October 9, 1916 at 4 o'clock P.M.

The recommendation of the Building Inspector that the bid of V. Fable for construction of vault for Commissioner of Taxation be accepted, was adopted.

Commissioner Garland recommended that petition of S.A. Poster Advertising Company for refund of money paid for building permits be granted, except that \$1.00 be retained for each board erected, amounting to \$7.00. Adopted.

Commissioner Garland recommended that petition of James T. Duffy for remission of interest and penalty be granted, on account of error in assessment. Adopted.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO

Four Hundred and Seventy Two and 05/100 Dollars be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1916 General Fund to re-imbure Wm. Herring for certain advance payments made by him for the City on account of purchases and other expenditures made on account of the Zoological Garden, as shown on statement hereto attached, and made a part hereof.

The Report of the Health Department on Milk and Dairy Inspection for September 1916, was read and adopted.

On recommendation of Commissioner Lambert petition of F. Liberto for permit to conduct a meat market at 701 N. Flores Street was granted.

Tabulation of bids on Club House for Golf Course was read, and on motion of Commissioner Lambert, duly seconded and carried, all bids were rejected.

No. 131 **MB-153** AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$462.72 out of the 1916 General Fund to pay Eva McIntosh for feeding City prisoners for the month of September 1916.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Four Hundred and Sixty Two and 72/100 Dollars (\$462.72), or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1916 General Fund to pay Eva McIntosh for furnishing 3856 meals to City prisoners at 12 cents per meal during the month of September 1916.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

Commissioner Uhr recommended that the petition of J.M. Guajardo for change in Jitney route be not granted. Adopted.


