

AN ORDINANCE 11772

APPOINTING OFFICERS OF ELECTION

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the persons whose names appear on the schedule marked Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof, be and the same are hereby selected, elected and appointed to be election officers to act in the capacity specified to hold the Special election on the 9th day of May 1950, at the voting places in the precincts in the city of San Antonio fixed and established, said voting places being specified in the Proclamation and Notice of Election on the 4th, day of April, 1950.

2. Said election officers shall conduct the election as prescribed by the Revised Statutes of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of San Antonio, Texas.

3. Judges and Clerks will be paid \$7.00 a day each and 50 cents an hour each, for any time in excess of a day's work as herein defined, such excess time not to exceed two (2) hours. Twelve (12) working hours shall be considered a working day. The Judge who delivers the Returns of Election and makes return of all election supplies used, shall be paid \$2.00 more. No election official shall be paid more than the pro rata part of two (2) hours overtime after the polls have closed.

AN ORDINANCE

1. That the persons whose names appear on the schedule marked Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof, be and the same are hereby selected, elected and appointed to be election officers to act in the capacity specified to hold the special election on the 9th day of May 1950, at the voting places in the precincts in the city of San Antonio fixed and established, said voting places being specified in the Proclamation and Notice of Election on the 1st day of April, 1950.

2. Said election officers shall conduct the election as prescribed by the Revised Statutes of the State of Texas, Chapter of the City of San Antonio, Texas.

3. Judges and Clerks will be paid \$7.50 a day each and 50 cents an hour each, for any time in excess of their regular working hours shall be considered a working day. The Judge who delivers the Returns of Election and makes return of all election supplies used, shall be paid \$2.00 more. Clerks shall be paid more than the pro rata rate for the time after the polls have closed.
