The Mayor read the following letter from the County Commissioners:

Honorable J. Edwin Kuykendall, Mayor  
Members of the City Council  
City Hall  
San Antonio, Texas

Gentlemen:

With further reference to the joint meeting between the members of the City Council and the members of Commissioners' Court of Bexar County, which meeting was held in the Probate Courtroom at 2:00 P.M. March 16, 1959, at which time it was mutually and verbally agreed by the members of the Council and Commissioners' Court that the following jail sites would be acceptable provided the price would be right and reasonable:

- 1) The Kallison Property bounded by Main Ave., Nueva and S. Flores Streets, or
- 2) The Stumberg property bounded by Main Ave., Nueva, S. Flores and Stumberg Streets.

This is to advise you that the prices quoted by Mr. Kallison and Mr. Stumberg, on both pieces of property, were prohibitive. Also, both of the above named property owners have withdrawn their offers to sell said property.

In view of the above stated facts, a majority of the Court feels that a most suitable location in that site extending from W. Nueva, Northward to the Hilton Garage building and from Dwyer East to the San Antonio River. The City, of course, could erect police headquarters on any property within the immediate vicinity or adjacent to the property in accordance with the bond call. You will recall that the Assistant District Attorney and the Bond Attorney are both of the opinion that if the buildings are close, and agreeable to the City and County, it would be in keeping with the bond call.


