The City Clerk read the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE 25,329

AMENDING SECTION 60-51 OF THE SAN ANTONIO CITY CODE ENTITLED "ONE-WAY STREETS" AS AMENDED, BY ADDING AND DESIGNATING PORTIONS OF CERTAIN OTHER STREETS ONE-WAY.

WHEREAS, (Full text in Ordinance Book, EE, page 394)

The Mayor asked if anyone wished to be heard. Mr. Elton Cude, representing the Alamo Funeral Home at Alamo & 7th Street, presented a petition signed by 250 citizens against passage of the ordinance. He read letters from various businessmen whose businesses have been affected by one-way streets heretofore passed. He stated that there are 325 businesses in the area and that probably 10% would be out of business within 6 months. He showed aerial photographs and gave his opinion of the traffic flow in these areas. Discussion was had on diversion of traffic during the improvement of Broadway. It was explained that streets listed in paragraph 2 of the ordinance would be made one-way temporarily to take care of the overflow of traffic but that Broadway would not be closed completely during construction. Mr. Cude also gave statistics on the accident rate on one-way streets as compared to two-way streets.

Mr. George Cunningham of the Rio Lado Motel, 1100 N. St. Marys also opposed the change and said it would hurt his business. Mr. John Schneider, Manager of the Firestone Store at Alamo and 7th Street asked that serious consideration be given the matter as their other store on Main Avenue had suffered loss of business when it was made one-way. Mrs. Cartwright, 414 Brooklyn, was opposed because she feared that soon no parking would be allowed on this street and would force them to close up because she has no off-street parking facilities. Mr. Bob Bourgeois, owner of the A & B Axle Service opposed the ordinance. He said one of his locations went out of business when one-way street was put into effect and did not want to lose another. He said that if 4th and Martin were also made one-way he would not oppose the change. He asked that the new traffic signal be given a chance to operate on these streets on a 2-way basis before making a change. Mr. Winton then stated he agreed with the people that

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some of the businesses would go out of business but that eventually these streets would have to be made one-way and that he would like to give the signal system a chance to operate on a two-way basis. He then moved that action be postponed for 6 months. His motion was seconded by Mr. Dietert. Mr. Daniels then stated that he did not think the City would gain anything by putting it off and moved that Mr. Winton's motion be tabled. This motion was seconded by Mr. Joe Olivares. After discussion of the motion, on roll call Mr. Daniels' motion to table failed by the following vote: AYES, Kuykendall, Gayoso, Olivares, Daniels; NAYS, Mr.; NAYS, Dietert, Passur, Crumrine, Winton, San Martin. Mayor Kuykendall then stated that the one-way streets would move traffic better, that this action had been planned for 8 months and that it should be passed. Manager Matthews then stated that the signal system was synchronized for one-way traffic and that it was scheduled to go into operation in early August. That if this was not passed it would delay putting the system into operation. After further discussion, Mr. Winton amended his motion so that Paragraph 1 of the ordinance be deleted and action postponed for 6 months and to pass Paragraph 2 regarding temporary one-way streets, seconded by Mr. Dietert. The motion failed by the following vote: AYES, Dietert, Crumrine, Winton; NAYS, Kuykendall, Passur, Gayoso, Olivares, Daniels, San Martin.

Then Dr. San Martin moved that the ordinance be passed with the provision that streets listed in Paragraph 1 be made one-way for a period of six months and Paragraph 2 remain as is, seconded by Mr. Daniels. The motion carried by the following vote: AYES, Kuykendall, Gayoso, Olivares, Daniels, San Martin; NAYS, Dietert, Crumrine, Winton,

Mr. Elton Cude then protested the action because they had not presented all of their witnesses. Dr. San Martin then moved that their action be reconsidered and re-open the matter, seconded by Mayor Kuykendall. The motion passed by the following vote: AYES, Kuykendall, Dietert, Passur, Crumrine, Winton, Gayoso, Olivares, Daniels, San Martin. NAYS, none.

Mr. Marcos Roberson then took the rostrum and proceeded to cross examine the Traffic Engineer at length regarding traffic at various intersections. Mr. Cude, Mr. Cunningham, Mrs. Cartwright and Mr. Bob Bourgeois again addressed the Council and asked that no action be taken. Mr. Tex Alsbury, representing a property owner on Broadway, also asked that serious consideration be given the matter.

Dr. San Martin then moved that the ordinance be passed with the provision that streets listed in Paragraph 1 be made one-way for a period beginning August 11, 1957 and ending November 10, 1957, seconded by Mr. Daniels. The ordinance was approved by the following vote: AYES, Kuykendall, Passur, Gayoso, Olivares, Daniels, San Martin; NAYS, Dietert, Crumrine, Winton:
