A RESOLUTION

DECLARING THE INTENT OF THE SAN ANTONIO CITY  
COUNCIL TO ORDER A SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE  
ELECTORS TO APPROVE OR DISAPPROVE THE ISSUANCE  
OF BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING RIGHTS-OF-WAY  
FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF STATE AND FEDERAL HIGHWAYS IN  
THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO

WHEREAS, the Texas Highway Department has proposed to the City of San Antonio the improvement of State and Federal Highways within the City, providing the City will furnish the right of way required therefor; and

WHEREAS, the need for expanded and improved traffic facilities in the City of San Antonio is recognized, and considered to be of major importance and urgent necessity; and

WHEREAS, the cost of acquiring rights-of-way for the improvements needed is much greater than can be provided by current revenues, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That a special election be called, by ordinance to be passed by the Council at the earliest date that such ordinance can be properly drawn and studied by the Council, for the electors to approve or disapprove the issuance of bonds for the purpose of acquiring rights of way for the improvement of State and Federal Highways in the City of San Antonio.
2. That the proposed bond election be called for the sole purpose of approving or disapproving the issuance of Highway right of way bonds, for projects to be constructed by the Texas Highway Department, and forming a part of the overall plan for Highway Development as approved by the City and State.
3. That a total amount of \$11,100,000 in bonds be proposed for Rights-of-Way for State and/or Federal Aid Highways in the City and Access Ways thereto and Rights-of-Way and Participation in the Construction of a Railroad Grade Separation Project in the City and for Participation by the City in an Origin and Destination Traffic Survey, each more particularly described as follows:
  - A. \$8,000,000.00
    - (1) U.S. 81 Expressway from Martin Street to Colima Street, and
    - (2) U.S. 81 Expressway from Nogalitos Street to Loop 13, and
    - (3) U.S. 81 Expressway from Broadway to Old City Limits at MKT Railroad, and
    - (4) U.S. 87 Expressway from Fredericksburg Road to point where County Participation begins, and
  - B. \$1,000,000.00 -
    - (1) Right-of-Way and Participation in the Construction of a Grade Separation Project at the crossings at grade of the IGN RAILROAD tracks by West Commerce and Buena Vista Streets, and
  - C. \$100,000.00
    - (1) The City's Participation in an Origin and Destination Survey by the Texas Highway Department of the Vehicular Traffic within and about the Metropolitan Area of the City of San Antonio, and

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D. \$2,000,000.00

- (1) Right of Way for future designated State and/or Federal Aid Highway or Highways within an area bounded by the southern boundary of present U. S. 90 (East Commerce Street) on the North, the City Limits on the East and South, and bordered by the San Antonio River on the West.

4. That, if approved, the bonds be sold only in part as required to obtain right-of-way as requested by the State for immediate construction, and to protect necessary future right of way from improvements increasing its cost.

Cases for changing the zoning regulations were next called. The first case called was a proposed amendment to the law defining Accessory Buildings. It was explained by the Planning Director. No objection being registered the council adopted the change by the following vote: Ayes, Scherlen, Stevens, Shearer, Russell, Easley, Lester, Gonzalez; Nays, none; Absent, A. C. White, R. N. White.

Next case to be called was #334 which had been recessed from a previous meeting. The Clerk read a letter from Jerry J. Caples and one from Thomas R. York. Mr. Caples asked for a delay in the hearing but the council proceeded to hear Mr. Park Street, Attorney for proponents. Mr. George W. Delavan, Mr. McWilliams and Mr. George W. Delavan, Jr. were heard in favor of the change of properties on Vance Jackson Road from Temporary "A" Residential to Permanent "F" Local Retail. Capt. Berry, one of the protesting owners, was heard and at this time Mr. Caples arrived. He was also heard after which Mr. Scherlen moved that the recommendation of the Planning Commission be approved, after a second by Mr. Shearer the motion carried: Ayes, Scherlen, Stevens, Shearer, Russell, Easley, Lester, Gonzalez; Nays, none; Absent, A. C. White, R. N. White.

Next to be heard was Case #354, the application of Hoffman & Sledge to rezone Lots 8 & 9, New City Block 8678 in Sky Way Subdivision. After hearing Col. Gunstream, Airport Director, Mr. Dobbins, Attorney and Mr. C. W. A. Hoffman, the council, on motion of Scherlen, seconded by Shearer, voted to approve the recommendation of the Planning Commission and Deny the request. Ayes, Scherlen, Shearer, Stevens, Russell, Easley, Lester, Gonzalez; Nays, none; Absent, A. C. White, R. N. White.

Mr. Fred Pflughaupt, who is conducting an audit of the City's books, appeared at the request of the Council to explain his delay in making a report. He informed the council that his forces had run into great difficulties in locating information and were not yet through with their work. He says that a month and a half will still be necessary to complete his work and he has lost money. He asked the council to vote an additional \$7500.00 to take care of money actually spent by him and he also asked that the 25% now retained by the city for completion of the jobs be released. He was told by the council to take up the matter with the City Manager and get his recommendation.

Major Thomas Evans, U. S. Army Air Force, was presented a scroll by the Mayor, proclaiming June 6, 1954 as Army Air Force Day in San Antonio in honor of its 12th anniversary. He responded with a nice short address.
