An Ordinance Authorizing Inter-Departmental Budget Transfer.

WHEREAS, an ordinance passed and approved August 16, 1932, being Council Appropriation No. 106, in the sum of \$1,556,000.00 covering operating expenses of the various departments out of the 1932 General Fund, for the fiscal year, beginning June 1, 1932, and ending May 31, 1933, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,

RESOLUTION

Directing the City Clerk to Advertise for Bids for the Concessions in Certain City Parks.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio:

1. That the City Clerk is hereby directed to advertise, in the manner provided by law, for sealed bids for the lease of certain privileges and concessions for the term of 1 or 2 years in the following parks and City property in the City of San Antonio, to-wit:

Brackenridge Park;
 Koehler Park;
 Zoological Area;
 Mexican Village;
 Open Air Theatre;
 Riverside Park;
 Woodlawn Lake Park;
 San Pedro Park, except Labor Day, for three days including the 16th of September and 5th of May of each year;
 Mission Pumping Station;
 Elmendorf Lake;
 Municipal Golf Links;
 Lincoln Park;
 Roosevelt Park.

2. The things provided under said contract shall be substantially as follows:

3. The right to sell soft drinks, ice cream, coffee, sandwiches, candy, tobacco and confections, boating and such other concessions and privileges which may be lawfully operated upon said premises, which concessions shall be exclusive, but all things shall be done in a decent, moral and lawful manner, and in such a way as not to impair the use of the parks and the public and always subject to such public use.

4. A copy of the proposed contract is on file in the office of the City Clerk and may be inspected at any time by prospective bidders.

5. A Cashier's Check payable, unconditionally, to the City of San Antonio in the sum of \$100.00 shall be filed with each bid to insure the execution of the contract by the bidder; and, in the case of the failure or refusal of the bidder to execute the contract within ten days after the award thereof, the title to the Cashier's Check shall automatically pass to the City of San Antonio.

6. Bids shall be opened on the 28th day of November, A.D. 1932, at 10:00 o'clock A.M., in the City Council Chamber of the City of San Antonio.

7. The bids may be joint and several, and the bidders may bid on any one of the parks, or more than one of the parks in combination.

8. The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

9. Notice shall be given by the publication of this resolution in the San Antonio Evening News, as provided by law.
