

airport property without previous arrangements and approval of the Airport Director or Assistant Airport Director.

c. No individual mechanic will be permitted to offer his services or conduct his business in competition with based-operators unless such mechanic has been duly registered at the Airport office and has paid the prescribed fee.

d. All aircraft taking off or landing shall pay the prescribed fee where such craft is operating on a commercial basis, that is, where the activity involves payment of compensation to the operator or owner thereof; but no take-off or landing fee will be charged where the aircraft involved is not being used for compensation or profit to such operator or owner. The Airport Director shall set the prescribed fees subject to approval by the Mayor.

SECTION 9. Any lessee or licensee who may wish to use natural gas, electricity, water or other utility must contract directly therefor and pay the required charges.

SECTION 10. It is desirable that all who may enter upon or have any character of business relations with or through a City-owned or controlled airport, its representatives, employees, lessees or licensees, be fully advised that the airports are being maintained by the City as a non-profit enterprise of public necessity and convenience, in the exercise by the City of its Police Powers; and that the City assumes no liability whatsoever for injury or damage to person or property growing out of or in connection with operations conducted thereon by or on account of its representatives or employees, lessee or licensees, irrespective of any question of negligence involved; and that each such lessee or licensee shall in every respect be an independent contractor and hold the City harmless from any and all claims, demands or suits growing out of any such injury or damage.

SECTION 11. To better accomplish the purposes expressed in the next preceding Section, pertinent clauses excluding municipal liability and fixing the status as independent contractors of all such lessees and licensees will be incorporated in their respective contracts; and that a boldly lettered sign or notice embodying in substance the City's status of non-liability be prominently displayed at all public entrances to any such City-owned or controlled airport.

SECTION 12. Subject to the provisions and limitations hereof and the Charter of the City of San Antonio, the Airport Director is hereby authorized, in consultation with and by approval of the Mayor, to promulgate and enforce all necessary and convenient rules and regulations relating to the operation of any airport owned or controlled by the City of San Antonio.

Dear Sirs:

On February 13, 1947 we submitted a bid for \$5,700,000 Public Improvement Bonds of the City of San Antonio more fully described in your call for tenders dated February 7, 1947. As our bid was the most favorable to the City, it was duly accepted; and we have since been prepared at any time to accept delivery of the Bonds if accompanied by the opinion of Messrs. Chapman and Cutler approving the validity of their issuance.

We are now advised that the first maturing \$500,000 Bonds of \$1,750,000 Interregional Highway Bonds, in the opinion of Messrs. Chapman and Cutler cannot be issued under existing conditions; but that the City will immediately proceed to remove the technical obstacles by enacting and obtaining the necessary ordinances and legislation to authorize the issuance of \$500,000 Interregional Highway Refunding Bonds of the same terms; namely, \$87,000 Bonds due each November 1, 1947-51 bearing interest at the rate of 2 1/2%, and \$65,000 Bonds due November 1, 1952, bearing interest at the rate of 2 1/4% per annum.

Acting upon these assurances, we are now prepared to accept delivery of the remaining \$5,200,000 Bonds as described in your call for tenders and in our bid, and to pay the City at the average price per Bond stated in our bid for \$5,700,000 Bonds, namely \$1,000.05 per \$1,000, such acceptance of partial delivery being conditioned only upon the following understanding:

That the City of San Antonio will press for all possible speed in enactment of the remedial legislation, in order to complete delivery of the \$500,000 Bonds above described within sixty days from March 31, 1947 with the approving legal opinion of Messrs. Chapman and Cutler and that if for any reason this is not done, the City will assume and pay or reimburse us for the following expenses incident to delivery of the Bonds:

If the City can make delivery of the \$500,000 Bonds, completing the original contract covering \$5,700,000 Bonds, we shall of course be glad to pay the above itemized expenses. Payment for the \$500,000 Bonds will be at the original contract rate of \$1,000.05 for \$1,000 Bond.

While we are sure that you appreciate the reason for our request that you assume the expenses above listed in the event that the City is not able to complete delivery of the Bonds, probably that should be stated for the record.

In accordance with the terms of sale as fixed by the City, we named higher rates of interest for the shorter maturities of the various serial issues, in order to obtain for the City the lowest possible average interest cost on the loan. These higher rates on the short Bonds and the lower yields at which they were sold, meant that proportionately a very large amount of our total underwriting and sales commissions were to be obtained from the short maturities. In fact, while we paid you slightly above 100 for all of the Bonds, we sold the \$2,000,000 Bonds maturing 1961-66 at prices below 100, as shown by our original offering circular of which a copy is enclosed. The City's inability to deliver the \$500,000 Bonds would reduce our compensation for selling the longer Bonds by a total of more than \$19,000. For this reason, we would ordinarily propose that the bid price to the City be adjusted accordingly; but we prefer in effect to continue our partnership with the City in the confident belief that you will be able to correct the technical difficulties and complete the original contract. It is evident that your assumption of the expenses would be but partial compensation.

Upon your acceptance of this understanding, we are ready to accept as a partial delivery the \$5,200,000 Bonds, and we have so advised our correspondent, the National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio.

We trust that this whole matter will be expedited, and we assure you of our continued interest in your future offerings of City of San Antonio securities.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court of Bexar County, Texas, on April 3rd, 1947 passed an order authorizing and empowering the County Judge of Bexar County, Texas, to enter into a contract and agreement with the City of San Antonio to lease or rent to said City approximately 217 voting machines which said voting machines are now in the custody of Bexar County, Texas, for use by said City in said city general election proposed to be held on the 13th day of May, 1947, the rent to be charged by Bexar County to be at the rate of \$20.00 per machine; that the City of San Antonio is to pay, in addition to the above rental and for its own account, the cost of preparation of said machines for said election and the cost of servicing said machines prior to and on the date of said election, and for the City of San Antonio to further pay for the drayage of said machines from the Bexar County Court House to each of the several election places within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio and to pay for any drayage necessary for the return of said voting machines from said voting places either to the Bexar County Court House or to such places, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, as may be designated by the Commissioners' Court of Bexar County, Texas,;

NOW THEREFORE:- KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, Charles W. Anderson, the duly authorized, elected, qualified and acting County Judge of Bexar County, Texas, pursuant to the aforesaid order, for and in consideration of the sum of \$4340.00, to be paid by the City of San Antonio to Bexar County, Texas, said sum to cover the rental charge for 217 voting machines at the rate of \$20.00 per machine, do hereby rent to the City of San Antonio for the use of said City at its general city election proposed to be held on the 13th day of May, 1947, approximately 217 voting machines.

It is further understood and agreed that the City of San Antonio is to pay all costs connected with the preparation of said machines for use in said city general election above mentioned, and further that the City of San Antonio is to pay all costs in connection with the servicing of said machines prior to and on the day of said city general election; and it is further understood and agreed that the City of San Antonio is to pay all drayage involved in the moving of said machines from the Court House of Bexar County, Texas, to the several voting places used by the City of San Antonio in the said city general election, and that the City of San Antonio is further to pay all costs of drayage involved in the return of said voting machines to the Bexar County Court House or to such place or places, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, as may be designated by the Commissioners Court of Bexar County, Texas.

It is further agreed that the City of San Antonio shall cause to be prepared, at its own expense, all election ballots and supplies which may be necessary to conduct said city general election, and the City of San Antonio hereby assumes liability for all damages to or destruction of any of said voting machines directly caused by the negligence of the City of San Antonio, its officers, agents, servants or employees, while said voting machines are in the actual custody of said City.

The City of San Antonio hereby agrees that the rental charge of \$4340.00 hereinabove provided for is to be remitted to the County of Bexar on or before the 15th day of June, A. D. 1947.

It is further agreed and understood by and between Bexar County, Texas and the City of San Antonio that should there be a run-off election as the result of the city general election of May 13th, 1947, then and in that event the City of San Antonio is hereby permitted to use as many of the above mentioned voting machines as said City may require in said run-off election, but not to exceed 217, at no further or additional cost to the City of San Antonio for rental; but that, as in the city general election, all costs of preparation,

servicing and drayage will be paid for by the City.

AN ORDINANCE (4899)

AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$500,000 REFUNDING INTERREGIONAL  
HIGHWAY BONDS, SERIES A-45, OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, CON-  
FIRMING THE SALE THEREOF, AND PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COL-  
LECTION OF TAXES TO PAY PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS.

WHEREAS, at an election duly held in the City of San Antonio on September 25, 1945, a majority of the qualified electors of the city who own taxable property and who had duly rendered same for taxation, voting on the proposition, authorized the issuance by the City of

San Antonio of \$1,750,000 Interregional Highway Bonds, Series A-45, for the purpose of acquiring permanent public improvements for the city to consist of the acquisition of property for the right of way for the Interregional Highway and Freeway and access ways thereto, the establishment and opening of streets or builevards, and the appurtenances thereof; and

WHEREAS such bonds were thereafter authorized by ordinance adopted on October 29, 1946, and were sold, but because there was litigation pending questioning the legality of such bonds, which litigation had resulted in approval of the bonds by the Supreme Court of Texas but was pending on application for writ of certiorari filed in the Supreme Court of the United States, the city was unable to make delivery of said bonds to the purchasers thereof accompanied by an unqualified approving legal opinion and said purchasers thereupon withdrew their bid; and

WHEREAS prior to the election the State of Texas had allocated to the city a large sum of money to be used in conjunction with the proceeds of said bonds for the construction of the traffic facilities for which said bonds were voted, and because of the long delay in the issuance of the bonds occasioned by the aforesaid litigation, the State of Texas was about to withdraw from the City of San Antonio the funds allocated as aforesaid and advised the city that unless it could make immediately available the sum of \$500,000 to commence the work which was to be done with the proceeds of said bonds and said allocated funds, the allocation would be withdrawn; and

WHEREAS in order to enable the city to obtain the funds needed for such purpose and retain the state allocation, J. M. Harris, H. B. Zachry, L. E. Fite and W. W. McAllister, citizens of the City of San Antonio, offered under date of January 21, 1947, to purchase five hundred of the bonds authorized as aforesaid and to accept delivery of said bonds and pay therefor immediately despite the pending litigation and to permit the city to re-purchase said bonds without profit to said purchasers, provided the city exercised its right to re-purchase the bonds within ninety days after the final termination of said litigation; and

WHEREAS acting pursuant to such offer, the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on January 27, 1947, adopted an ordinance accepting said offer and providing for the delivery of bonds numbered 1 to 500, inclusive, of said Interregional Highway Bonds, Series A-45, to said purchasers, and the bonds were duly delivered to said purchasers and were paid for at par and accrued interest to the date of delivery; and

WHEREAS thereafter said litigation was terminated and the legality of the bonds upheld and the city thereupon proceeded to request bids for and to sell all of the bonds which had been voted at said election, including the entire issue of \$1,750,000 Interregional Highway Bonds, Series A-45, and on February 14, 1947, entered into an agreement with The National City Bank of New York and associates for the sale of said bonds to said bank; and

WHEREAS because of changed market conditions existing at the time of said sale, it was necessary for the city to pay somewhat higher rates of interest on said bonds than had been required by the original sale agreement, and therefore, on February 20, 1947, the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio adopted an ordinance repealing said original ordinance of October 29, 1946, and re-authorizing the issuance of said bonds with the same maturities specified in the original ordinance, but with a change in interest rates; and

WHEREAS although the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio knew at the time of the sale of said bonds to The National City Bank of New York and associates and at the time of the re-authorization of said bonds, as aforesaid, that five hundred of the bonds voted at the election had already been delivered and were outstanding obligations of the city, it was the intention of the Commissioners, and the Commissioners had been advised that it would be legally possible, to re-purchase as an investment for various bond and sinking funds of the city the five hundred bonds sold on January 27 and to substitute for those bonds five hundred of the

bonds authorized by said ordinance of February 20, 1947, and to deliver to The National City Bank of New York the five hundred bonds so substituted, and to place in said bond and sinking funds the proceeds of the bonds so received from The National City Bank of New York, so that the issuance of said \$1,750,000 Interregional Highway Bonds, Series A-45, would be consummated in all respects as though a part of said bonds had not been previously sold and delivered; and

WHEREAS pursuant to said intention, the Commissioners adopted an ordinance on March 13, 1947, authorizing the purchase of the aforesaid five hundred bonds from the original purchasers thereof, as an investment for various bond and sinking funds of the city specified in said ordinance, and the payment of the purchase price of said bonds with funds to be taken from said bond and sinking funds, and thereafter the bonds were so purchased from said holders and were so paid for and the bonds were allocated to and placed in said bond and sinking funds as an investment; and

WHEREAS in order to obtain the approval of the Attorney General of Texas on the \$1,750,000 bonds authorized by said ordinance of February 20, 1947, and to arrange for the registration of said bonds by the State Comptroller, it became necessary for the city to instruct the State Comptroller to cancel the bonds which had been previously printed and executed pursuant to the provisions of said ordinance of October 29, 1946, but which the city had been unable to deliver, and the city accordingly instructed the Comptroller so to cancel said bonds and to register in lieu thereof the bonds which had been printed and executed pursuant to said ordinance of February 20, 1947; and

WHEREAS when the bonds which had been so originally printed and executed pursuant to said ordinance of October 29, 1946, were presented to the Comptroller for cancellation there were erroneously included with said bonds the five hundred bonds which had been issued as above described and reacquired by the city and which were then being held as an investment for said bond and sinking funds; and

WHEREAS it was at no time the intention of the city to extinguish the indebtedness which was represented by said five hundred bonds, nor to authorize or permit the cancellation thereof, and said bonds have not been paid and the indebtedness represented thereby remains a legal and valid outstanding indebtedness of the city despite the erroneous cancellation of said bonds; and

WHEREAS the city now has urgent need of the money taken from said bond and sinking funds to pay for the purchase of said outstanding bonds and desires to consummate the re-sale thereof to The National City Bank of New York as previously agreed upon, but is unable to make deliver to The National City Bank of New York of bonds numbered 1 to 500, inclusive, of the bonds authorized by said ordinance of February 20, because the procedure attempted to be followed by the city in the completion of said transaction is questioned by the bond attorneys whose opinion approving said bonds is required, and the city is therefore unable to make effective delivery of said bonds; and

WHEREAS in order to rectify the errors which have been committed and validly to authorize and issue the bonds which have been agreed by the city to be sold to The National City Bank, as aforesaid, and thus to obtain the proceeds thereof which are needed for said bond and sinking funds, the city desires to authorize the refunding of the indebtedness represented by the bonds so purchased as an investment for said bond and sinking funds, which refunding bonds are to be identical in detail with the bonds so sold to The National City Bank of New York, and to deliver such refunding bonds to said purchasers pursuant to the terms of sale; NOW, THEREFORE:-

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

Section 1. That for the reasons recited in the preamble hereto and pursuant to authority contained in the charter of the City of San Antonio and the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas, the indebtedness of the City of San Antonio in the amount of \$500,000 described in the preamble hereto be refunded and that for the purpose of obtaining funds for the refunding and payment of said indebtedness, there are hereby authorized to be issued the negotiable coupon bonds of the City of San Antonio in the principal amount of \$500,000.

Section 2. That such bonds shall be dated November 1, 1946, shall be in the denomination of \$1,000 each, shall be numbered 1 to 500, inclusive, and shall fall due serially in numerical order \$87,000 on November 1 of each of the years 1947 to 1951, inclusive, and \$65,000 on November 1, 1952. Bonds numbered 1 to 435, inclusive, shall bear interest at the rate of two and one-half per cent per annum and bonds numbered 436 to 500, inclusive, shall bear interest at the rate of two and one-quarter per cent per annum, all of which interest shall be payable from the date of said bonds until the payment thereof and shall become due semi-annually on May 1 and November 1 of each year. Principal of and interest on such bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the City Treasurer in San Antonio, Texas, or at the option of the holder thereof at the bank in the City of New York, New York, which at the time of such payment is acting as fiscal agency of the City of San Antonio.

Section 3. That each of the bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the City Clerk and shall have the corporate seal of the city impressed thereon. Interest falling due on the bonds on and prior to the maturity thereof shall be represented by appropriate interest coupons to be attached thereto. Such coupons shall be signed by the facsimile signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk and said officials by the execution of said bonds shall be deemed to have adopted as and for their own proper signatures their facsimile signatures appearing on said coupons.

Section 4. That the bonds, the coupons to be thereto attached and the endorsements to appear on the back thereof shall be in substantially the following form:

For the prompt payment of principal hereof and interest hereon as they respectively become due and for the levy of taxes sufficient for that purpose, the full faith, credit and resources of the City of San Antonio are hereby irrevocably pledged.

It is hereby certified, recited and represented that the issuance of this bond

and the series of which it is one is duly authorized by law; that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this series of bonds and of this bond have been properly done and performed and have happened in regular and due time, form and manner as required by law; that sufficient and proper provision for the levy and collection of taxes on all taxable property in the city has been made which, when collected, shall be appropriated exclusively to the payment of this series of bonds and the interest thereon as they become due, and that the total indebtedness of the City of San Antonio, including this series of bonds, does not exceed any constitutional, statutory or charter limitation.

Section 5. That the sale of the bonds herein authorized to The National City Bank of New York and associates is hereby ratified and confirmed. For the purpose of the delivery of such bonds and payment therefor, the bonds herein authorized shall be treated in all respects as though they were bonds numbered 1 to 500, inclusive of the bonds authorized by the ordinance of February 20, 1947, described in the preamble hereto. The bonds shall be printed and executed as soon as may be after the adoption of this ordinance and shall be thereupon delivered to said purchasers pursuant to payment therefor in accordance with the terms of sale. "to change the zoning of New City Block 6789, Lots 35, 36, 37 and 38; New City Block 6790, Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13; New City Block 6793, Block 5, Lots 65, 66 and 67; New City Block 6792, Block 4, Lots 1, 2, 3, and 4 (now Lots 28, 29 and 30), 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 (now 34, 35 and 36), 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18 (now 37, 38 and 39), and 19, 20, 21, 22 and 23; New City Block 6795, Lots 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 14, to "J" Commercial;" and

3. "To change the zoning of all of triangular Block 8793 bounded by the Austin Highway, Rittiman Road and the new road which is approximately halfway between the junction of the named roads and the Fey Road, except for the Etheridge Homestead property, of about 400 by 600 feet in the Southeast corner known as Lots 19 and 20, to "F" Local Retail."

4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed, and the present classification of said area is discontinued.

This Lease and Agreement made and entered into on this the 10th day of April, 1947, be and between the City of San Antonio, a municipal corporation in the State of Texas, in control of and operating the municipal airport, Alamo Field, At San Antonio, Texas, hereinafter designated as Lessor, and H. L. Brown, a resident of Bexar County, Texas, his heirs, executors or administrators, hereinafter designated as Lessee, WITNESSETH:

In consideration of the rent and covenants herein reserved and contained on the part of the Lessee to be paid, performed and observed, Lessor hereby demises, leases and lets unto Lessee, for the term of twenty (20) years, beginning on the 1st day of April, 1947 and ending on the 1st day of April 1967, unless sooner terminated as hereinafter provided, the following described lot or parcel of land situated in Bexar County, Texas, and more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point 900 feet easterly parallel to the center line of the existing concrete Taxiway "A" from the east edge of the main existing concrete apron in front of hangar now occupied by the Slick Airways, Inc., and northerly 275 feet at right angles from the center line of said taxiway; said point of beginning being 200 feet easterly of a southerly projection of the center line of "D" Street; THENCE northerly at right angles to the center line of the said existing taxiway, 200 feet; THENCE easterly parallel to the said taxiway 200 feet, this course being also parallel to and 80 feet, more or less, southerly from the center line of Second Avenue; THENCE southerly at right angles to the said taxiway, 200 feet; THENCE westerly parallel to the said taxiway 200 feet to the place of beginning.

ALSO, a strip of land extending from Second Avenue to the northerly side of the aforesaid 200 foot square tract and of sufficient width for the construction and maintenance of an entrance roadway.

ALSO, between the said 200 foot rectangular tract and Taxiway "A" sufficient land for constructing and maintaining:

First, a concrete apron 110 feet east and west along and centered on the center of the 200-foot square tract by 75 feet southerly therefrom; and

Second; for a taxi strip 50 feet wide with center on the production of the northerly and southerly center line of the 200-foot square tract and extending from the south side of the aforesaid concrete apron to the north side of the existing concrete Taxiway "A".

To have and to hold said premises unto Lessee, together with the right of ingress and egress to the same at all times, upon and subject to the terms, conditions and provisions hereinafter set out.

I.

Lessee, in consideration of said demise, covenants and agrees with Lessor, as follows:

1. To pay to Lessor as rent for said premises the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) per year, payment thereof to be made upon the 1st day of April of each year during the existence of this lease.

2. That Lessee will immediately commence and with reasonable expedition proceed with the erection of a steel and corrugated iron hangar to be used for the storing of airplanes, engine parts, supplies materials, gasoline, oils and greases, tools and machinery for installing, cleaning, checking, repairing and otherwise handling of aircraft parts, engines, engine parts, instrumentd, equipment and applicances and general shop work necessary or desirable in connection with the oeration of airplanes, together with apron and connecting taxi strip, all in conformity with plans hereto attached and made a part hereof, and the laws, ordinances and regulations of the City of San Antonio and said Airport, governing the construction of the same. Lessee shall pay all costs, expenses and liabilities arising out of or in any way connected with the construction of said hangar, apron and taxi strip, and shall keep the demised premises and said structures free and clear from any and all liens of mechanic's or material-men's and all liens of a similar character arising or growing out of the construction of said

hangar, apron and connecting taxi strip.

Upon completion of the said Hangar, apron and connecting taxi strip, Lessee shall furnish Lessor a detail statement of the cost of same for Lessor's examination and verification.

II.

It is mutually agreed by and between said parties, as follows:

1. That Lessee may make such alterations, additions or improvements in and to said hangar, apron and taxi strip as he may find necessary and beneficial to him in the use thereof; provided, however, all such alterations, additions or improvements shall comply with all laws, ordinances and regulations of the City of San Antonio and said Airport governing the construction of the same; and further that Lessee shall save Lessor harmless of and from any loss and damage by reason of the construction thereof and by reason of any mechanic's, materialmen's or other liens of similar character arising or growing out of the construction, alteration, addition or improvements of said hangar, apron or connecting taxi strip. Upon completion of such alterations additions or improvements, Lessee shall furnish Lessor a detail statement of the cost of same for Lessor's examination and verification.

2. That upon the expiration of the fifth year of this lease, Lessor shall have the continuous right and option to purchase said hangar, apron and connecting taxi strip at the cost thereof less the sum of \$1,200 for each year during which this lease has been in force and effect, and the further right and option to purchase any additions or improvements which Lessee may have made to the same at and for a sum to be agreed upon by the parties hereto.

In the event Lessor exercises said right and option to purchase said hangar, apron and connecting tax strip and/or other additions and improvements to the same, as hereinabove provided, Lessor shall notify Lessee, by registered mail addressed to Lessee at 636 Ivy Lane, San Antonio, Texas. In such event, this lease shall terminate and be of no further force or effect, and Lessor shall provide Lessee for the then unexpired term of this lease and at prevailing rates and rentals equivalent facilities at said airport for storing his airplanes, engine parts, supplies, material, gasoline, oil and greases, machinery, tools and other appliances and instruments for installing, cleaning, checking, repairing and otherwise handling airplanes, aircraft parts and engines, and engine parts.

Lessee shall be given a period of ninety (90) days to remove all airplanes, parts, supplies, materials, machinery, tools and appliances, and instruments therein located upon said premises to the facilities furnished by Lessor.

3. Lessor hereby grants to Lessee, for the term of this lease, the right and privilege of using that part of said Municipal Airport commonly referred to as "the landing field", for the landing and take-off of airplanes of non-commercial use.

4. Lessee shall insure said hangar against fire and tornado in a solvent insurance company with loss payable clause in favor of the parties as their interest may appear.

5. Such hangar, apron and connecting taxi strip and all alterations, additions and improvements to the same shall not be deemed fixtures but be deemed a part of the realty, and upon expiration of this lease by time shall become the property of Lessor.

6. In the event this lease is terminated before its expiration date for any cause or in any manner other than as herein provided, the Lessor shall ipso facto forfeit all rights and option herein granted, except the right to purchase said hangar and additions thereto, at the price herein provided, and failing to purchase the same, Lessee may remove said hangar and all additions thereto from said premises.

7. Lessee may sublet the premises and improvements thereon.
