

1943, regardless of when they were earned; and,

WHEREAS, deductions, at the option of the employer, may be computed on the amount actually paid at any payroll period or upon the basis of wage bracket withholdings set forth in Section 466 (c) (1) of the Act for any payroll period; NOW, THEREFORE:-

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. That beginning with the first semi-monthly payroll on or after January 1, 1943, the City Treasurer and Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to deduct and withhold from the wages or salary paid to each officer or employee of the City the Victory Tax in such an amount as is required by the Revenue Act of 1942 based on the wage bracket withholding authorized under Section 466 (c) (1) of that Act on every payroll.

Section 2. The City Treasurer and Auditor at the time of making up the payroll or immediately thereafter, shall transfer the monies deducted therefrom under the provisions of this ordinance to a separate account in the Frost National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, where they shall be deposited and designated as a "Victory Tax Account, held for the benefit of the Collector of Internal Revenue." The monies accumulated from such withholdings during each quarter of the calendar year shall be paid by the City Treasurer to the United States Collector of Internal Revenue for the District in which this city is located on or before the last day of the month following the close of any such quarter.

Section 3. During the month of January, 1944, and during each January thereafter or when the last payment of wages is made, if employment is terminated before the close of the calendar year, the City Treasurer and Auditor shall furnish to each employee with respect to his employment during the calendar year, a written statement showing the wages for the period covered and the amount of tax withheld and paid in respect to such wages. A copy of this statement for every employee shall be included with the final return for the preceding calendar year to the Collector of Internal Revenue. The City Treasurer and Auditor shall keep such records and make such reports to the Bureau of Internal Revenue of wages paid and the tax collected and paid with respect thereto as that Bureau may require and prescribe.

(a) On or before the 31st day of December, 1942, the City Treasurer and Auditor shall either include on the regular payroll or make a supplementary payroll to include all moneys earned during the year and due and unpaid for the calendar year, and shall pay the respective employees to whom they are due. The first payroll of January following shall be made to include wages or salaries earned in January only.

Section 4. The Taxes to be withheld and collected under this ordinance shall not apply to any taxable year commencing after the date of cessation of hostilities in the present war and the account established for the receiving of the tax funds hereunder shall be closed with the last payment to the Federal Government of the funds withheld. The operation of this ordinance shall terminate at that time or sooner if the victory tax is terminated by Federal action prior to that time.

Section 5. The provisions of all ordinances or parts thereof now in effect relating to payroll procedure of this city inconsistent herewith or with the provisions of the Revenue Act of 1942 relating to the victory tax are to that extent modified.

Section 6. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure made necessary for the preservation of the public peace and safety and to meet the requirements of the Revenue Act of 1942 and shall take effect immediately.

AN ORDINANCE MAKING SALE OF ELECTRIC PROPERTIES IN WILSON AND KARNES COUNTIES

AN ORDINANCE (1994)

MAKING THE SALE AND CONVEYANCE, OF ELECTRIC PROPERTIES IN WILSON AND KARNES COUNTIES, TEXAS, TO THE CITY OF FLORESVILLE, TEXAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That, in pursuant of the agreement dated October 24, 1942, between the City of San Antonio and the City of Floresville, Texas, and others, the City of San Antonio does sell and convey unto the City of Floresville, for the consideration of \$328,810, the property described hereinafter, and the Mayor and City Clerk of the City be and they are hereby authorized to execute for and in the name of the City, a standard City form deed and a bill of sale, to convey said properties, as follows:

ELECTRIC SYSTEM

2. Except for the Boreggo Road 2.3 Kv Line extending approximately six miles into Wilson County; all the 13 Kv. and 2.3 Kv. transmission and distribution lines together with accompanying rights of way, easements, and franchises and the appurtenant substations, transformers, secondary lines, services, meters and devices for serving approximately 1440 customers in Wilson and Karnes Counties, Texas, heretofore owned by the San Antonio Public Service Company, including furniture and fixtures, tools and miscellaneous equipment located at the Floresville office of San Antonio Public Service Company and including the 200 Kw. internal combustion engine generating station and the land on which it is located in Floresville and in addition an easement to the City of Floresville to attach its 13 Kv. lines to the City of San Antonio's 66 Kv. poles south of the Elmen-dorf Substation to the extent that such 13 Kv lines are now so attached so long as said 66 Kv. line is maintained in use by the City of San Antonio or its assigns.

3. The East one--half of Lot No. 11 and all of Lots Nos. 12, 13 and 14, in Block C of the Railroad Addition to the City of Floresville, as shown by map or plat of said City of record in the office of the County Clerk of Wilson County, together with the improvements and electric generating plant located thereon, being the same property conveyed by South Texas Ice Company to San Antonio Public Service Company by deed duly recorded in Volume 163, at pages 167-168, of the Deed Records of Wilson County, Texas.

The money received from the sale of such property shall be held by the Board of Trustees as a special fund for the purchase of additional property deemed by them necessary or advantageous to the system, and unless such money is used in such purchase of property within eighteen months of the time received, the same shall be used in the redemption prior to maturity of as many of the bonds as may be redeemed with such money in the manner provided in Section 7, Article V, for the redemption of bonds with surplus funds. All additional property purchased or acquired under the provisions of this section shall immediately upon such purchase or acquisition become subject to the lien of this indenture.

AMENDING SECTION 7 OF AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE INSPECTION OF MEAT AND MEAT FOOD PRODUCTS OFFERED FOR SALE WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, BEXAR COUNTY, TEXAS, PASSED AND APPROVED ON JULY 18TH, 1939, AND AMENDED BY AN ORDINANCE PASSED AND APPROVED ON JULY 25TH, 1939, AND AMENDED BY AN ORDINANCE PASSED AND APPROVED NOVEMBER 30TH, 1939, AND FURTHER AMENDED BY ORDINANCE PASSED AND APPROVED AUGUST 10TH 1942.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Section 7 of that certain ordinance providing for the inspection of meat and meat food products offered for sale within the City limits of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, passed and approved July 18th, 1939, recorded in Volume "I" on page 445 of the Ordinance Books of the City of San Antonio, and as amended by ordinance passed and approved July 25th, 1939, recorded in Volume "I" on page 493 of said Ordinance Books, and as amended by ordinance passed and approved November 30th, 1939, recorded in Volume "J" on page 1 of said Ordinance Books, and as further amended by ordinance passed and approved August 19th, 1942, recorded in Volume "K" on page 187 of said Ordinance Books, be and the same is hereby amended so that there shall be added to said Section 7 a subsection reading as follows:

"(e) Where such plants as those described in subsections (a), (b) and (c) hereof shall require extra working time of inspectors arrangements for such over-time must be made with the Director of Health before same is desired, and the additional fees to be paid for such over-time inspections shall be determined by the Director of Health figured and calculated on a pro rata basis of one and one-half time pay per hour of the monthly salary or salaries of the respective inspector or inspectors so employed for such extra working time."

2. This ordinance being of urgent importance to the public peace, health and safety of the City of San Antonio, same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Commissioners, as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

The receipt given to said Bank for the aforesaid substituted securities pledged by it shall recite, in substance, that the said securities have been duly pledged with the Governing Body of the City of San Antonio, Texas, as depository of said City, for the purpose of securing the funds of said City, deposited and to be deposited in said Bank during the Fiscal Year beginning June 1, 1942, upon the terms and conditions prescribed and provided by law.

It is directed that said securities be deposited by the Mayor, for safe keeping in a safety deposit box in the vaults of the Frost National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, rented by the City from said Bank.

FIXING THE MINIMUM WAGE RATES, SET OUT IN RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION (1997)

FIXING MINIMUM WAGE RATES.

WHEREAS, a thorough investigation has been made of the hourly wage rates which are being paid in the City of San Antonio and vicinity which is the locality in which the proposed project (hereinafter referred to as "Project") is to be constructed by the City of San Antonio, to Employees in each trade or occupation engaged in work of a nature similar to the work to be performed in the construction of said Project, and the prevailing hourly wage rates being paid in such locality to such employees for such work have been determined by having the included wage scales furnished by the various trades unions concerned,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio:

That the following rates for the respective trades or occupations listed below shall be and are hereby fixed as the minimum hourly wage rates and have been determined in accordance with rates prevailing for work of a similar nature in the locality in which the project is to be constructed:

Note: Work performed after 4:30 PM until midnight, from Mondays to Fridays inclusive, shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half. Work performed after midnight until 8:00 AM shall be paid for at the rate of double time. Work performed on Saturday morning, shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half. Work performed on Saturday afternoon, Sundays and holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

When a single shift is employed there must be paid one and one-half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of eight hours a day in any one day, or at any time during the interval from 5 P.M. Friday to 7 A.M. Monday, or on holidays, and when two or more shifts are employed there must be paid one and one half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of seven and one-half hours on any one day, or at any time during the interval from Friday midnight to Sunday midnight.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the foregoing list of trades or occupations includes to the best of our knowledge, all the classifications of employees who will be engaged in work on said Project other than executive, supervisory, administrative, clerical or other non-manual workers as such.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there be transmitted with this resolution the substantiating data upon which the foregoing determination is based.

AN ORDINANCE (2011)

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO EXECUTE EASEMENT TO THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the Mayor of the City of San Antonio be and he is hereby authorized to execute Easement over and Right-of-way on a tract of land owned by the City of San Antonio in the San Jose City Burial Ground, as is shown in red on the map attached hereto and made a part hereof. Form of easement attached hereto and made a part hereof.

2. This right-of-way is granted to the United States Government to furnish an access route to Stinson Field proper from the Building area of the Government, and same shall be maintained by the Government at its expense subject to appropriations being available for the purpose, and the right-of-way hereby granted shall be for a period of the use by the Government provided any fences, gates, culverts or bridges erected on said easement are maintained by the Government.
