

A RESOLUTION **2008-09-18-0042R**

APPROVING THE MISSION/VISION STATEMENT OF THE SAN ANTONIO RIVER COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, in November 2007, the River Commission began discussing and drafting the San Antonio River Commission Mission and Vision for the River; and

WHEREAS, in December, the Commission adopted the Mission/Vision statement with guiding principles; and

WHEREAS, the Commission agreed that the Mission/Vision statement should be recommended to the various boards and commissions taking up matters within the River corridor in order to establish one "shared" vision for the river corridor; and

WHEREAS, the goal of the River Commission was to have the various entities adopt the Mission/Vision statement, so that one consistent vision for the river can be a resource when making various policy decisions; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the River Commission drafting a Mission/Vision statement, the Commission worked with the various boards and commissions in order to coordinate standard language that can be utilized when making policy decisions within the River Corridor; and

WHEREAS, two separate meetings were held with these entities in order to form a consensus for "one" shared vision; and

WHEREAS, the River Commission representatives began making presentations to the various boards and commissions; and

WHEREAS, subsequently, the Planning Commission, Zoning Commission, HDRC, along with the Riverwalk Capital Improvement Advisory Board unanimously approved the adoption of the River Commission's Mission/Vision Statement; and

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Conservation Society and the San Antonio River Oversight Committee passed a resolution to support the Mission/Vision statement and the Paseo Del Rio Association voted to offer input and analysis, rather than an overall endorsement of the Mission/Vision statement; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The Mission/Vision Statement of the San Antonio River Commission, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment I**, is hereby approved

San Antonio River: Vision Statement

Within its city limits, the San Antonio River is 18 miles in length. In some respects, the River defines the city. One's experience of the River changes in different parts of the city. As large parts of the River are improved and adjacent development occurs, the River will change. The River Commission has adopted the following Mission and Vision statements to be used as a universal lens by which all future River-related decisions are viewed:

Vision Statement: The San Antonio River will be a fully linked linear park that unifies the city and serves as a community gathering place for all to enjoy. The River will have many special places and uses; some active, some quiet. Each will be unique, genuine, and vary by design.

Guiding Principles:

1. **Community Access:** Community access to the River and its public spaces should be provided and encouraged.
2. **Environment:** The public spaces of the River will celebrate the natural environment, where wildlife and aquatic species flourish. The public areas of the River will be protected from intrusive commercial activities which diminish the experience along the River corridor.
3. **Surrounding Land Uses/Development:** Development activity occurring along the banks will be in keeping with the unique character of the River at that location. Land uses will also be in keeping with the City Master Plan (Neighborhood and Community Plans). In all cases, development and activity along the banks will not damage the natural environment or ecology of the River or its public spaces, but will enhance the quality of the site and environment.
4. **Adjoining Buildings and Design:** Historical buildings and features along the River will be preserved to help tell the story of what the River has meant to San Antonio over the generations. Where development occurs, buildings will be unique, and incorporate design elements that celebrate the natural or built context of the River at that location.
5. **Private Enterprise:** Policies will encourage existing and new business development and regulate enterprises within these Guiding Principals and Vision.

San Antonio River Commission Mission and City's River Vision

SUMMARY:

On June 28, 2007, the San Antonio River Commission was appointed. The Commission was established in order to advise the City Council on any aspect of development and operations of the River Walk and within the San Antonio River corridor. They also advise to public agencies on policies related to flood control, water quality, quantity, and clarity, to the extent that they affect the ambiance and charm of the San Antonio River. They also advise the Historic and Design Review Commission, Planning Commission, Zoning Commission, and the Board of Adjustments on zoning, land use and design requirements related to both the public and private projects within the RIO Districts (1-6).

On September 17, 2008 the River Commission is scheduled to present their first annual report highlighting their accomplishments for the first year. The City's Vision for the River is attached for your approval.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Mission Statement is as follows: The River Commission provides public policy advice regarding the River Walk and San Antonio River to preserve, protect, and enhance the history, heritage, and ambiance of the River.

Attached for reference is the Vision Statement for the River.

ISSUE:

Adopt the River Commission's Mission and the City's River Vision statement for utilization by the San Antonio River Commission and said boards in order to be used as a tool when making policy decisions within the river corridor.

ALTERNATIVES:

This Mission/Vision will serve as a tool for the various boards and commissions when making policy decisions within the River corridor.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of the San Antonio River Commission's Mission and River Vision statement.
