

AN ORDINANCE 2010-04-15-0324

AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION, AND THE ACCEPTANCE OF UP TO \$1,316,488.00 UPON AWARD, FROM THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO FUND THE 2010 SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM OPERATED BY THE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT FOR THE PERIOD OF JUNE 14, 2010 THROUGH AUGUST 20, 2010.

WHEREAS, this application will allow the continuation of the Summer Food Service Program that has provided nutritional meals to children age eighteen and below in our community during the summer months since 1969; and

WHEREAS, the program will enable service to over 9,320 children, providing 338,675 lunches and 314,660 snacks throughout the summer in conjunction with the San Antonio Parks and Recreation Department's Summer Youth Programs and other city-wide non-profit organization's programs at over 116 sites; and

WHEREAS, if awarded, this ordinance allows the establishment of a fund, budget and 17 temporary employee positions to coordinate the food program; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget for the Summer Food Service Program is outlined in Attachment I; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance will also allow the City to accept any additional Texas Department of Agriculture funds for food service awarded during the term of this grant; and

WHEREAS, the contract for providing summer meals associated with this program is projected for City Council consideration in May, 2010; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager, or her designee, or the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department or his designee is hereby authorized to submit a grant application, and, if awarded, to accept up to \$1,316,488.00, from the Texas Department of Agriculture to fund the 2010 Summer Food Service Program operated by the Parks and Recreation Department for the period of June 14, 2010 through August 20, 2010. A copy of the Summer Food Services Program Application for Participation is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment II**.

SECTION 2. The City Manager or her designee, or the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department or his designee, is further authorized to accept grant funds, if awarded from the Texas Department of Agriculture in an amount up to \$1,316,488.00 to fund the 2010 Summer Food Services Program.

SECTION 3. The City Manager or her designee, or the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department or his designee, is further authorized to accept any additional grant funds, if awarded, from the Texas Department of Agriculture for the 2010 Summer Food Services Program and to execute any and all necessary documents to accept said additional funds.

SECTION 4. The City Manager or her designee, or the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department or his designee is further authorized to execute any and all necessary documents to effectuate said application and acceptance to carry out the purpose of this ordinance.


SECTION 5. Fund 2602026003 entitled "Summer Food Program 2010" and internal order 126000000161 are hereby designated for use in the accounting for the fiscal transaction in the acceptance of this grant and should funding be awarded, the sum of \$1,316,488.00 from the Texas Department of Agriculture will be appropriated in said fund. The proposed budget which is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as **Attachment I**, is approved and adopted for entry in the City books.

SECTION 6. The City Manager or her designee, or the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department or his designee, is hereby authorized to carry-over funds, in an amount up to \$312,220.00 for a total program budget of \$1,628,708.00.

SECTION 7. The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Chief Financial Officer (CFO), City of San Antonio. The CFO may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific Cost Centers, WBS Elements, Internal Orders, General Ledger Accounts, and Fund Numbers as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage by eight (8) or more affirmative votes of the entire City Council; otherwise, said effective date shall be ten (10) days from the date of passage hereof.



Summer Food Service Program
Criminal Provisions and Penalties

1. Whoever, in connection with any application, procurement, record keeping entry, claim for reimbursement, or other document or statement made in connection with the program, knowingly and willfully falsifies, conceals or covers up by any trick, scheme, or device a material fact, or makes any false, fictitious or fraudulent statements or whoever in connection with the program knowingly makes an opportunity for any person to defraud the United States or does or omits to do any act with intent to enable any person to defraud the United States, shall be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned not more than five years.
2. Whoever being a partner, officer, director, or managing agent connected in any capacity with any partnership, association, cooperation, business, or organization, either public or private, embezzles, misapplies, steals, or obtains by fraud, false statement or forgery, any benefit provided by the program, or any money, funds, assets, or property derived from benefits provided by this program, shall be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than five years or both. If the benefits, money, funds, assets, or property involved is not over \$200, then the penalty shall be a fine of not more than \$1,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.
3. If two or more persons conspire or collude to accomplish any act made unlawful under this subsection, and one or more such person commit any act to effect the object of conspiracy or collusion, each shall be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than five years, or both.

TERMINATION PROCEDURES

The following is a list of deficiencies that are grounds for termination. Grounds for termination, however, are not limited to this list.

1. Non-compliance with applicable bid procedures and contract requirements of Federal Child Nutrition regulations.
2. The submission of false information to the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA).
3. Program violations at a significant proportion of the sponsor's sites. Such violations include, but are not limited to the following:
 - A. Non-compliance with the meal service time restrictions.
 - B. Failure to maintain accurate records.
 - C. Failures to adjust meal orders to conform to the variations in the number of participating children.
 - D. The simultaneous service of more than one meal to any child.
 - E. Service of a significant number of meals which do not include required quantities of all meal components.
 - F. The claiming of program payments for meals not served to participating children.
 - G. Excessive instances of off-site meal consumption.
 - H. Continued use of food service management companies that are in violation of health codes.
