

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AUGUST 17TH, 1915,
AT FOUR O'CLOCK, P. M..

PRESENT: Hon. Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners, Garland, Lambert and Steves. Absent, Kearny.

Minutes of the previous meeting were ordered approved.

MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS.

The petition for paving West Cypress Street from San Pedro Avenue to Woodlief Street was read and ordered filed.

The petition for paving West Travis Street from Hamilton Avenue to Brazos Street was read and ordered filed.

The following petitions were read and referred to the Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements, Kearny:

R. A. Goeth regarding lost auto number, was read and referred to the Commissioner of Police & Fire, Steves.

The petition of C. R. Quillian for permit to erect electric sign at 635 $\frac{1}{2}$ East Commerce Street was read and referred to the Commissioner of Police and Fire, Steves.

The petition to establish a slaughter house was read and referred to the Commissioner of Sanitation, Lambert.

Commissioner Steves recommended that the petition for better lighting of the Market Square be not granted, account not being properly signed. Adopted.

Commissioner Steves recommended that the petition of the Fox Company, for permit to erect electric sign be not granted. Adopted.

MA-125 A RESOLUTION.

Granting the San Antonio Irrigation Company permission to excavate fifty feet outside their present right-of-way.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the San Antonio Irrigation Company be and they are hereby granted permission to excavate some dirt fifty feet outside of their present right-of-way on property belonging to the City of San Antonio and situated at the end of the new outfall sewer and to continue for the two abutments on either side of the Creek, in making the necessary fill to sustain the concrete ditch in which to carry the new outfall sewer to the City Sewer Farm. The San Antonio Irrigation Company agreeing not to abrupt said property more than is absolutely necessary, and to leave the same in good drainage condition.

MA-126 AN ORDINANCE.

Granting permission to E.H. Powell to construct sewer on East Courtland Place, according to certain conditions therein named.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section One. That E. H. Powell is hereby given permission to construct a sewer according to certain plans and specifications now on file in the office of the City Engineer, said sewer to be built along East Courtland Place, from a point in front of Lot No. 14, in Block No. 2964 to the City Main on Josephine Street; according to plat hereto attached and made a part hereof, and in accordance with all ordinances of the City of San Antonio now or that may hereafter be in force and under supervision of the City Engineer.

Section Two. Said sewer shall be constructed at the expense of the said E.H. Powell, and when completed shall become the property of the City of San Antonio and part of its public sewer system.

Section Three. Said E.H. Powell shall file with the City Engineer immediately upon the passage and approval of this ordinance a statement showing the cost of said sewer, which is not to exceed the sum of Two Hundred and Forty (\$240.00) Dollars.

Section Four. For every connection to be made with said sewer including connections made by said E.H. Powell, the City Engineer shall collect the sum of thirty-five (\$35.00) Dollars per lot, not exceeding fifty feet in width (in addition to any fee prescribed by City Ordinance for connection with the City's Public Sewer System elsewhere in the City) and such fee of thirty five (\$35.00) Dollars shall be kept in a special fund until the amount collected on the basis of thirty-five (\$35.00) Dollars for each connection shall equal the cost of said sewer, as provided in the preceding section of this ordinance, when no further connection fee of thirty-five(\$35.00) Dollars shall be charged or collected, provided that not later than the 10th day of each and every month the City Engineer shall turn over to said E.H. Powell, his heirs or assigns, the amounts collected during the preceding month and which shall be credited on said total cost.
