The City Clerk read the following communication from the Mayor.

January 7, 1950

To the Board of Commissioners,
City of San Antonio.

Sirs:

Under the authority vested in me by Section 26 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, I herewith notify you that I disapprove the resolution announcing the intention of the City Commissioners of San Antonio to pass an ordinance on or before May 16, 1950, authorizing an election to be held on June 27, 1950, and I herewith veto said resolution. In compliance with the Charter requirement that I specify my objections thereto in writing, please be advised that my objections are as follows:

1. It is another step in the Commissioners' carefully planned scheme to betray the people and deny them their right to a fair vote on changes in our outmoded form of government.
2. The resolution is sheer hypocrisy and the Commissioners know it. The Commissioners set the June 27 election date knowing full well that the voting machines will not be available for that date. The machines are to be used in the county primary election on July 22. The County Clerk says it would be a physical impossibility to clear the machines for July 22 if they are used June 27, and therefore they will not be available for a city charter election on June 27.
3. The commissioners' resolution is part of their scheme to build confusion upon confusion. Thirteen thousand voters signed the People's Committee petitions in which June 1 was fixed as the date for those charter amendments to become effective. The Commissioners now create more confusion by setting an election four weeks after that date.
4. The Commissioners refuse to give any assurance that the June 27 election would be any less confusing than the scheduled January 24 election, which I was compelled to veto because it was an insult to the voters.
5. The people no longer can place any faith in promises made by the Commissioners. The Commissioners set a deadline for filing proposed amendments for the January 24 election. Then they betrayed the people by including amendments that had never been filed with the City Clerk. The Commissioners' June 27 election resolution once again sets a deadline for filing proposed amendments. In view of the Commissioners' past actions, there is no reason to believe that they will comply with that deadline. There is every reason to believe they will do everything possible to add to the confusion in an attempt to defeat the will of the people.
