A RESOLUTION.

Authorizing the C. A. Wortham Shows to conduct a carnival show in the City of San Antonio on Bowen's Island and contiguous territory.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section One: That the C. A. Wortham Shows be and they are hereby authorized to conduct a carnival show and exhibit upon Bowen's Island and contiguous territory in the City of San Antonio on November 14th-25th inclusive, subject to all legal regulations, whether by statute or ordinance.

Section Two: Nothing in this resolution shall be construed to waive any license fees which the City of San Antonio may be entitled under the law to demand and receive.

A RESOLUTION.

Spillman and Leo M. J. Dielman, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Section Two: That the bid of said Charles Schoenfeld to remodel the lower floor of the present market house, according to the plans and specifications, upon a basis of the cost of all labor and materials, plus ten per cent, to be paid the said Charles Schoenfeld for his services, is also hereby accepted, provided, however, that the commissioners shall have the right to direct said improvements as they may see fit and shall have the right to add to or discontinue the same at any time.

Section Three: That the bid of Kirkwood and Wharton for plumbing in said east wing and cold storage and engine rooms of said market house, for the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred and Forty (\$3,540.00) Dollars be, and the same is hereby also accepted.

Section Four: That the bid of the San Antonio Machine and Supply Company to install the refrigerating plant in said east wing of said building, as well as in the present market house building, for the sum of Nineteen Thousand (\$19,000.00) Dollars be and the same is hereby accepted.

Section Five: The City Attorney is hereby directed to prepare contracts covering all of the above bids, said contracts to bind the respective bidders to perform their respective employments in accordance with said plans and specifications prepared by the said Beverly Spillman and Leo M. J. Dielman, and under their direction.

Section Six: All bids for electrical work upon said east wing of said building be and the same are hereby rejected, and the clerk is hereby directed to re-advertise for electrical work upon said building, according to said plans and specifications.

A RESOLUTION.

Approving minutes of the special meeting of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, Saturday, October 14th, 10:30 A. M., 1922, for the purpose of considering bids for the erection of market house annex.

WHEREAS, on the morning of Saturday, October 14th, 1922, at 10:30 A. M., the Mayor called a special meeting of the Commission of the City of San Antonio for the purpose of considering bids for the erection of the market house annex, and

WHEREAS, there were present in the morning, at that time, Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, Commissioner William O. Rieden and Commissioner Phil Wright, and

WHEREAS, said business was not completed at said meeting, it was agreed to meet at 2:30 P.M. the same afternoon, for the purpose of concluding said business and at said 2:30 P. M. there appeared O. B. Black, Mayor, William O. Rieden, Commissioner of Streets and Phil Wright, Commissioner of Police, and the said John P. Pfeiffer, Commissioner of Finance, being absent, the aforesaid business was taken under further discussion and a

resolution accepting the bid of Charles Schoenfeld to construct the east wing and the cold storage and engine rooms of said market house and remodel first floor of the present market house, as specified by the plans and specifications heretofore published for bids by the City of San Antonio, and accepting the bid of Kirkwood and Wharton for the plumbing upon said building and the bid of the San Antonio Machine and Supply Company for the refrigerating plant in said building, and rejecting the bids for the electric wiring only, and calling for new bids for electric wiring, was adopted by the affirmative vote of the above three Commissioners, who were present at that time.

WHEREAS, at a subsequent meeting of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, held Monday, October 16th, A. D., 1922, at four P. M., the Honorable John P. Pfeiffer, Mayor pro tem, presiding, and Commissioners Lambert, Rieden and Wright present, the motion was made to approve the minutes of the special meeting of Saturday, October 14th, 1922, and after the same had been read and discussion had thereon, the question was called for and a viva voce vote was held, in which the minutes were ordered approved by a vote of three to one, the Honorable John P. Pfeiffer, Mayor pro tem, dissenting, and

WHEREAS, some question has arisen as to whether or not, under said circumstances, said minutes were approved, now

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the minutes of a special meeting of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, held Saturday, October 14th, A. D., 1922, are hereby again approved and the Mayor is hereby directed to approve the same in the minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, as same appear in Volume "E" of said minutes.

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A RESOLUTION.

Authorizing the Mayor to enter into a tentative agreement for the auditing of the books of the City of San Antonio.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio:

Section One: That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a tentative agreement and contract with some competent auditor or auditing firm to audit the books and accounts of the City of San Antonio from the time of the last audit thereof up to and including the 31st day of May, 1923.

Section Two: That no agreement entered into by the Mayor shall be deemed or considered as final and binding on the City of San Antonio until the same shall have been approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio by ordinance duly passed and approved.

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Commissioner Rieden introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

AN ORDINANCE.

ME-910 Granting permission to the G.H. & S.A. Railway Company to construct, operate and maintain a switch or spur track on Walnut Street across and over Delaware Street.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio:

Section One: That permission be and the same is hereby granted to the Galveston, Harrisburg & San Antonio Railway Company to construct, operate and maintain a switch on spur track, and to operate its cars thereon, across Delaware Street, and along the western side of Walnut Street, by extending its present track 280 feet across Delaware Street, and opposite lots 1 to 5, City Block #664 of the Stout addition to the City, as described on blue print hereto attached and made a part hereof.

Section Two: That said spur track over and across said street shall be laid under the direction of the Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements and shall be constructed in accordance with such plans and specifications as may or shall be approved by the City Engineer, and the construction and maintenance of said crossing shall conform to the regulations imposed or hereafter to be imposed by the City of San Antonio as to grades, drainage etc., and subject to all ordinance and regulation now in force or that may hereafter be enacted regulating such character of street crossing.

Section Three: In consideration of the granting of this permit, said Galveston, Harrisburg & San Antonio Railway Company agrees to construct its said spur track across said street in the manner and form ordered and directed by said Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements and in accordance with the lines, grades and the system of drainage approved by the City Engineer, and to construct such culverts and make such additional provision for drainage from time to time as may be deemed necessary by the City, and further binds and obligates itself, its successors and assigns to hold said City of San Antonio free and harmless from all damages to persons or property that may result by reason of the granting of this permit, or to exercise any of the rights thereunder.

Section Four: That the license and privilege hereby granted is subject to revocation at the will of the Commissioners or other governing body of the City of San Antonio, and said Railroad Company agrees to remove its said track from across the said street on demand, upon the revocation of the license hereby granted.

Section Five: The acceptance and exercise of any privilege under this ordinance shall be an acceptance of all of its terms and conditions, by said Galveston Harrisburg & San Antonio Railway Company, its successors and assigns.

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Bids for paving two sections of E. Mulberry St. were opened and referred to City Engineer

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
