GIVING NOTICE THAT BIDS WILL BE RECEIVED FOR THE SELECTION OF THE DEPOSITORY OF THE FUNDS OF THE CITY.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. Sealed proposals for the custody of the funds of the City of San Antonio, from any banking corporation, association or individual banker doing business within the City, that may desire to be selected as the depository of the funds of the City, will be received on or before the 30th day of June, A. D. 1930, at 10:00 A. M.; at which time the same will be opened at a meeting of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, who will make selection and designation of such depository of the City funds; and thereafter receive and consider the bonds tendered by such bidder; all as provided by the laws of the State of Texas and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

2. Any banking corporation, association or individual banker doing business in San Antonio, desiring to bid, shall deliver to the City Clerk a sealed proposal, stating the rate per cent upon daily balances, which shall not be less than three per cent, that such bidder offers to pay to the City for the privilege of being made the depository of the funds of the City for the fiscal year next following the date of such meeting; and

3. Any proposal which contemplates any deposit with the bidder of less than the whole of the fund of the City, shall designate the amount, part or portion, of such deposits desired.

4. Each bidder shall include, or combine in the proposal, or shall file in a separate proposal at the ^{same} time and in the same manner, the terms and conditions upon which the bidder proposes to loan the City of San Antonio, from time to time, as needed, if required by Ordinance, such sum or sums of money as the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio may desire to borrow for the use of the City, in anticipation of the receipts of the taxes and the current revenues of the City for such fiscal year.

"WHEREAS, the City Commissioners heretofore, by Resolution, ordered the improvement of FREDERICKSBURG ROAD, between its intersection with the east line of North Flores Street, and the north line of Cypress Street, and,

WHEREAS, said improvements are generally described as follows, to-wit: The opening and extension of said street between said points by setting back the property lines thereof, removing such improvements as exist between said lines and acquiring such property as may be

required for the purpose; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has, in accordance with the Improvement Ordinance, filed with the Commission, his report, containing the plans and specifications covering the proposed improvements, together with the statement of the cost of same, the names of the property owners abutting thereon, the description of the said property as their or its proportion of the cost of the making of such improvements, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: That a public necessity exists for the opening and extension of said FREDERICKSBURG ROAD, between the points aforementioned, and that the roll and report of the City Engineer, with plans and other documents attached thereto are hereby approved and adopted and the new lines of said streets are hereby designated as shown upon such plans and said improvement is hereby ordered made.
