AN ORDINANCE.

Appropriating \$6,072.91 to pay City's proportion of R. B. Green Hospitan and adjuncts. *MD-1675*

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$6,072.91 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1921 General fund to pay City's proportion of maintenance of R. B. Green Memorial Hospital and adjuncts for the month of August, 1921, as per statement on file in office of City Auditor, warrant to be made payable to County Judge, Bexar County.

AN ORDINANCE. *MD-1676*

Appropriating the sum of Thirty-Three (\$33.00) Dollars to pay G. T. Talamantes for services as an emergency special police.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of Thirty-Three (\$33.00) Dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1921 general fund to pay G. T. Talamantes for eleven day's service as an emergency special police, at the rate of Three (\$3.00) Dollars per day, for services rendered subsequent to the flood of September 9th, 1921.

No. 230.

AN ORDINANCE. *-1677*

Authorizing the purchase of a strip of land from E. G. Cervantes and others for the widening of Losoya Street, and appropriating the sum of \$3000, to pay half the amount due by the City for said strip, balance to be paid upon the demolishing and setting back of the building to the new property line.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the City of San Antonio be authorized to purchase a strip of land out of lot known as Lot A-2 in new city block No. 423, being the same property described on a plat of the Losoya Street widening now on file in the City Engineers office, and that the sum of \$3000, Three Thousand Dollars be and is hereby appropriated out of the Street widening Fund bond issue of 1919 to pay one half of the price agreed upon for said tract, the other half, \$3000. to be paid when the land is delivered and the building set back to the new property line.

Be it further ordained that a warrant for \$3000. be drawn payable to E. G. Cervantes, Damas Cervantes, Josephine Cervantes de Aredondo, Fernando de Aredondo, Juanita Casanova de Chapa, Isidoro Chapa, Lucinda Casanova, Manuel Casanova, and Adel Casanova.

No. 231.

AN ORDINANCE. *-1678*

Appropriating \$366.4250 pay various Merchants Bills.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the following Sums of Money or so much thereof as may be necessary be and is appropriated out of the 1921 General Fund to pay the Lee Tire Co, and J. H. Rogers aw per bills on file with City Auditor.

RESOLUTION.

Calling for bids for construction of Fire Station on East Crockett Street.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City Clerk be and is hereby directed to advertise for bids for the construction of the Fire Station on East Crockett Street, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the office of the City Engineer, all bids to be received by the City Clerk not later than 4:00 P.M. October 24th, 1921.

Cashier's Check must accompany each bid, amounting to five percent of total bid.

The City of San Antonio reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

The following resolutions were read and adopted.

RESOLUTION.

For the purpose of fixing the date and term of the board of equalization for the purpose of revising and correcting assessments of property for taxation for the fiscal year, 1921-1922.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the Board of Equalization convene on October 24th., at 9:30 A.M., and remain in session thereafter, daily, from the hours of 9:30 to 12:00, and from 2:00 to 5:00, excepting on days fixed by Ordinance for the holding of Council Meetings, when the Board of Equalization shall adjourn at noon, for the period of sixty days, or so much longer as may be necessary for the purpose of revising and correcting all assessments on the rendered and unrendered tax rolls of the City of San Antonio for the fiscal year, 1921, in accordance with Section 116 of the Charter of said City.

And be it further resolved that the Clerk of this City be ordered to insert an advertisement in the San Antonio Evening News, giving public notice of the fact that the Board of Equalization will be in session for the purpose of passing on all 1921 assessments. Said Advertisement shall be published, beginning with October 14th, and continue until the adjournment of the said Board of Equalization.

A Resolution locating the International Exposition and Live Stock Show on land owned by the City of San Antonio, adjacent to Brackenridge Park was read and after some discussion was laid over for further consideration.

AN ORDINANCE. *MD-1679*

Appropriating \$132.50 to pay expense of salvage of flood wreckage.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, That, the sum of \$132.50 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1921 General Fund to pay expense of salvage of flood wreckage for week ending Friday, October 14, 1921, the same having been expended under direction of Committee appointed by the Mayor.
