

OCTOBER 18, 1945

REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER OF THE CITY HALL, AT TEN O'CLOCK, A.M., ON THURSDAY, OCTOBER 18, 1945.

PRESENT: Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler, Anderson; Mayor Mauermann presiding.

The Clerk read the minutes of the Regular Meeting of September 20, the Recessed Meeting of Sept. 26, the Regular Meeting of Sept. 27, the Canvassing Board Meetings of Sept. 26 and subsequent days, the Regular Meeting of October 4, the Regular Meeting of Oct. 11, and the Recessed Meeting of Oct. 13. These minutes were each approved as read, on motion of Commissioner Steffler, seconded by Commissioner Hein and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson (in each case).

PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN ADDITIONAL TERRITORY ADJACENT TO THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY ON THE EAST.

Commissioner Anderson called up for final vote the following annexation ordinance, which had been introduced on first reading Sept. 27, 1945, and published Oct. 1, 1945. Commissioner Anderson stated that Commissioner Callaghan, who had voted for publication of this ordinance when it was first introduced, had said later that he was misled at the Sept. 27 meeting and made a mistake by voting "Aye" at that time. Commissioner Anderson asked that all members of

the Council now vote "Nay" in order to "kill" this ordinance, so Commissioner Callaghan's record on all annexation ordinances would be consistent. Mayor Mauermann said he did not wish to vote "Nay" on any annexation ordinance, but would do so since Commissioner Anderson, who originally introduced the ordinance, now requested it. Accordingly, the ordinance was rejected and not passed, by roll call vote, to-wit: Nays, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler, and Anderson. The rejected ordinance follows:

AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN ADDITIONAL TERRITORY ADJACENT TO THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY ON THE NORTH.

Mayor Mauermann introduced the following ordinance, which was passed and approved by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler, Anderson.

AN ORDINANCE (2735)

APPROPRIATING \$9.00 OUT OF ADVERTISING FUND FOR POSTAGE STAMPS.

On motion of Commissioner Steffler, seconded by Commissioner Hein and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler, Anderson, the Council granted Commissioner Anderson a leave of absence for October 22, 23 and 24.

Bids to furnish and/or install certain radio equipment and accessories for the Police Dept. were opened and publicly read and referred to the Commissioner of Fire and Police and the Purchasing Agent.


