AN ORDINANCE (1326) **OJ-30**

PROHIBITING THE USE OF WOODEN SHINGLES WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. It shall hereafter be unlawful to use any wooden shingle roofing within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio.
2. Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined in any sum not to exceed \$200.00, and each and every day of violation shall be a separate offense.
3. If any part of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision or decisions shall not effect the remaining parts, sentences or phrases of this ordinance.
4. All prior inconsistent ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.
5. This ordinance is declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent therefrom, and shall take effect from the date of its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, and it is so ordered.

AN ORDINANCE (1337) *OJ-31*

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE MAKING A CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, FOR ELIMINATION OF UNFIT DWELLINGS, FOR THE FURNISHING OF CERTAIN CITY SERVICES, ETC.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

This ordinance creates and manifests an amendment to the contract entered into by and between the City of San Antonio (herein called the "City") and the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio, Texas (herein called the "Authority") whose name is subscribed hereto in acceptance and ratification hereof and made a part hereof for all purposes, that is to say: that:

WHEREAS, on the 10th day of June, 1938, there was passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio

"AN ORDINANCE MAKING A CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR THE ELIMINATION OF UNFIT DWELLINGS, FOR THE FURNISHING OF CERTAIN CITY SERVICES, ETC.,"

which Ordinance is recorded in Ordinance Book "I" of the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio, Texas, proposes to develop an addition to the project mentioned in said ordinance; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire and intention of the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, Texas, that the agreement contained in said ordinance shall include and cover the said proposed addition known as "Project TEX-6-1A";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio that all of the conditions, covenants, agreements and understandings contained in the said ordinance passed and approved by this Commission on June 10th, 1938, shall stand and remain in full force and effect as to the project mentioned in said ordinance and in addition shall cover and include "Project TEX-6-1A" as the proposed addition to the project mentioned in said ordinance which is known as "Project TEX-6-1"; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by this Commission that the second paragraph of said ordinance passed and approved June 10th, 1938, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio (herein called the "Authority") proposes to develop and administer a low-rent housing project known as "Project TEX-6-1" and an addition thereto known as "Project TEX-6-1A" (herein called the "Project") within the territorial limits of the City of San Antonio (herein called the "City") including approximately 1,350 dwelling units: and"

AN ORDINANCE (1338) *OJ-32*

ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE SECURITIES PLEDGED BY THE NATIONAL BANK OF COMMERCE OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, TO SECURE THE CITY FUNDS DEPOSITED AND TO BE DEPOSITED IN SAID BANK BY THE CITY DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1939, AND DIRECTING THE DEPOSITING OF SAID SECURITIES FOR SAFE KEEPING AND RELEASING THE SURETIES ON BONDS ON RECEIPTS NOS. 4, 10 AND 13 GIVEN BY SAID BANK AS CITY DEPOSITORY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the securities pledged with the governing body of the City of San Antonio by the National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio, Texas, as City Depository, to secure the funds of said City, deposited and to be deposited, in said Bank during the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1939 and ending May 31, 1940, be and the same are hereby accepted and approved, and that receipt signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor, be given said Bank for securities pledged by it, which said securities are described as follows:

Securities pledged by the National Bank of Commerce are described in Receipt No. 1 attached to Ordinance dated August 2, 1939, Receipt No. 8 attached to ordinance dated September 29, 1939, Receipt Nos. 11 and 12 attached to ordinance dated December 14, 1939 and attached Receipts Nos. 14 and 15, which are made a part of this ordinance by reference as fully as if they were specified herein.

2. The receipts given to said Bank for securities pledged by it shall recite, in substance, that the said securities have been duly pledged with the governing body of the City of San Antonio, by the National Bank of Commerce, San Antonio, Texas, as a Depository of said City, for the purpose of securing the Funds of said City, deposited and to be deposited, in said bank during the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1939, upon the terms and conditions prescribed and provided by law.

3. It is directed that said securities be deposited by the Mayor, for safe-keeping in safe deposit box in the vaults of the National Bank of Commerce rented by the City from the said bank.

4. That all securities on all bonds on Receipts Nos. 4, 11 and 13, given to said City by said National Bank of Commerce, as City Depository, be and are hereby released from further liability as sureties on such bonds.

AN ORDINANCE (1340) *05-34*

CREATING CONTRACT WITH BEXAR COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 7 - OLMOS TERRACE DISTRICT - TO FURNISH FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this ordinance creates and manifests a contract between the City of San Antonio, a municipality of the State of Texas in the County of Bexar, and Bexar County Water Control and Improvement District No. 7 - Olmos Terrace District - a corporation, of Bexar County, Texas, WITNESSETH:-
2. WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio is under no obligation to furnish fire protection to other incorporated towns; NOW, THEREFORE:-
3. It is agreed by and between the City of San Antonio and said Bexar County Water Control and Improvement District No. 7 - Olmos Terrace District - that for and in consideration of the sum of \$300.00 cash deposited with the City of San Antonio by the said District, and not less than \$300.00 cash always to be kept on deposit as aforesaid, the City of San Antonio shall furnish necessary fire apparatus to make necessary runs to the Olmos Terrace District hereinafter defined, for a period of time from this date to May 31st, 1940.
4. The Olmos Terrace District shall be defined as including the following territory, to-wit: Olmos Terrace bounded on the north by Contour Drive; on the east by McCullough Avenue on the west by San Pedro Avenue; on the south by Wildwood and Hermosa Streets including houses on both sides of Wildwood and Hermosa Streets.
5. Out of said cash on deposit said District agrees to pay a \$125.00 minimum fee

for each fire run actually made when two or more fire trucks answer any alarm to the District named.

6. At the expiration of said period of time, if said deposit is not used up, the remainder thereof shall be paid to Bexar County Water Control and Improvement District No. 7 - Olmos Terrace District -, and if for any reason whatsoever this contract is canceled by the City of San Antonio, and unused funds remaining on deposit shall be returned to the District.

7. The City of San Antonio agrees to keep as available for said purpose two fire pieces and the service of one District Chief.

8. The Fire Marshal of the City of San Antonio shall cooperate in distributing and promulgating fire prevention methods.

9. It is also further agreed that the City of San Antonio shall furnish fire apparatus and firemen to the limit of its present ability only and subject to its right first to use all apparatus for all necessary purposes within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio. It is also agreed and understood that the City of San Antonio will be under no obligation whatever to provide any additional facilities for fighting fires, such as water supply, etc., than are already in existence in said areas, and shall be under no duty to make inspections.

11. The City of San Antonio shall be held harmless and indemnified for all damages and injuries to persons or property incurred in making said runs, or for failure to answer any call, unless said call is made to the Fire Department of said City and it refuses to answer the call.

AN ORDINANCE (1344) OJ-35

DEFINING THE DUTIES OF THE PARKS AND PLANNING BOARD OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. The Parks and Planning Board of the City of San Antonio shall advise and confer with the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio from time to time concerning the maintenance and improvement of all the grounds, streets, cemeteries, public parks, parkways, waterways, bridges, municipal squares and plazas, improved or unimproved, and the ground surrounding all municipal buildings (except school buildings) now owned or controlled, or which may hereafter be acquired by the City of San Antonio, either within or without the corporate limits of the City.

2. The Parks and Planning Board of the City of San Antonio shall make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio concerning the beautification and improvement of any grounds, streets, public parks, waterways, municipal squares and plazas, parkways or cemeteries belonging to the City of San Antonio which the Board of Commissioners may designate to receive improvements.

3. The Parks Planning Board of the City of San Antonio shall make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio concerning the planting and care of trees, plants and shrubs of any kind in the public parks and other grounds under the jurisdiction of the City, as well as on or in the streets or parkways of the City of San Antonio, and the banks of rivers flowing through the City of San Antonio.

4. The Parks Planning Board of the City of San Antonio shall recommend to the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio the institution of condemnation proceedings whenever, in its judgement, private property should be taken in the name of the City of San Antonio for the purpose of beautifying the City or enlarging the park system of the City of San Antonio, or in the development of any project affected with a public purpose which, in the opinion of the Parks Planning Board, should be sponsored by the City of San Antonio.

5. The Parks Planning Board of the City of San Antonio shall examine all plans involving the erection of monuments, cenotaphs, memorials or other edifices designed to commemorate the glories of the history of San Antonio, and make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio concerning the advisability of erecting any such structures.

6. The Parks Planning Board of the City of San Antonio shall seek donations, legacies and bequests for the beautification, improvement and betterment of the City of San Antonio.

7. The Parks Planning Board of the City of San Antonio shall file, at the end of each fiscal year, a report with the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio detailing its activities during the year and making such recommendations as said Board shall deem advisable looking to the beautifications, improvement and betterment of the City of San Antonio.

8. This ordinance is cumulative of and shall in no way repeal an ordinance passed and approved the 17th day of June, 1939, entitled "AN ORDINANCE APPOINTING MEMBERS OF THE CITY PARKS PLANNING BOARD," and an ordinance passed and approved the 2nd day of June, 1939, entitled "AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE CITY PARKS PLANNING BOARD; APPOINTING MEMEBRS THEREOF, AND PRESCRIBING THEIR DUTIES".

AN ORDINANCE (1346) *OJ-36*

AUTHORIZING THE CONVEYANCE AND ACCEPTANCE OF PROPERTY, APPROPRIATING THE NECESSARY FUNDS, ASSUMING TAXES AND CANCELLING A NOTE, VENDOR'S LIEN AND DEED OF TRUST.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the Mayor of the City of San Antonio be and he is hereby authorized to execute deeds conveying to Louis Henry Theis, of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, the following described property situated in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, to-wit:-

a. A strip 50 feet wide off of the northeast end of Lot 10, City Block 896, same having a frontage of 50 feet on Washington Street, running back between the northeast boundary line of Lot 10, City Block 896 and a line drawn parallel with and 50 feet south of said northeast boundary line and said strip running back between said parallel lines from said Washington Street to the San Antonio River.

b. Two lots situated in City Block 541, same being Lots A-7 and the property situated between Lots A-7 and A-6, all of said property fronting 80.4 feet on Elm Street and 49.8 feet on Sixth Street running back to the Alamo Ditch, 122.5 feet along the line of the Alamo Ditch to the north boundary line of Lot A-6, and 84 feet along the north boundary line of Lot A-6, City Block 541, from the Alamo Ditch to Elm Street;

as part consideration for the conveyance to the City of San Antonio of the property described in Section 2 hereof by Louis Henry Theis and wife, Virginia Theis.

-2. That the sum of \$1800.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1939 General Fund - Villita Account, to be paid to Louis Henry Theis upon receipt of the General Warranty Deed and acknowledged By Louis Henry Theis and wife, Virginia Theis, and delivered by them to the City of San Antonio, which Deed conveys to the City of San Antonio the property described as follows:-

FIRST: Two feet taken off the east lot of two certain lots fronting 28 varas, more or less, on Villita Street, said two feet being described in a deed dated July 12, 1913 and recorded in Volume 420, page 236 of the Deed Records of Bexar County, Texas, from Norman W. Luke to Frederick Reinartz;

SECOND: A lot in New City Block 900 fronting on the south side of Villita Street, whereon it has a front of 14 varas, more or less, beginning at the point 17 varas west of Wombole Alley; thence southwest with the west line of property belonging to Groos, 14 varas, more or less, to Hessler Alley; thence in a westerly direction with Hessler Alley, 14 varas, more or less, to property belonging to the Hessler Estate; thence in a northerly direction with the east line of the said Hessler Estate property, 14 varas, more or less, to Villita Street; thence in an easterly direction with the south line of Villita Street, 14 varas, more or less, to the place of beginning, being the same property conveyed by deed to F. Reinartz by Mrs. Louise Platz, et al. of record in Volume 318, page 261 Deed Records of Bexar County, Texas, and being the same property conveyed by W. E. Knight and wife to Anna Pauline Schneider by deed recorded in Volume 614, page 187 Deed Records of Bexar County.

and cash to be part consideration for conveyance of above described property to the City of San Antonio, with assumption of the various indebtednesses by the City of San Antonio, as set

out in Sections 3 and 4 hereof.

3. The City of San Antonio hereby assumes the payment of all taxes, state, county, city and school district, or any other taxes, which may have accrued or which may be due and payable on the property described in Section 2 above.

4. As a further consideration for the conveyance of the property described in Section 2 above, the City of San Antonio agrees to release one certain promissory note, with deed of trust and vendor's lien securing same, to assume payment thereof and cancel same, and to stay the sale of the property secured by said note, deed of trust and vendor's lien, said note and deed of trust being generally described as follows:

One certain promissory note dated the 18th day of September, A. D. 1937, executed by Louis Henry Theis in the original principal sum of \$4,397.00, payable to the order of the San Antonio Loan and Trust Company, and secured by a Deed of Trust Lien and Vendor's Lien of even date therewith, duly executed by Louis Henry Theis and wife Virginia Theis, which Deed of Trust is duly recorded in the Deed of Trust Records of Bexar County, Texas in Volume 1096, pages 633 to 637, reference to which is hereby made for all pertinent purposes; being the same note and deed of trust lien and vendor's lien transferred and conveyed by the San Antonio Loan and Trust Company to the City of San Antonio by proper instrument on the _____ day of _____, 1939, for a consideration of \$3000.00 cash,

and said assumption release and cancellation shall include and cover all principal interest and other charges which may have accrued or been made on said indebtedness under the said liens thereon.

5. Both the City of San Antonio and Louis Henry Theis and wife Virginia Theis, agree to deliver to the grantees under the respective conveyances called for hereunder, all abstracts of title and other papers and instruments of title which they now have in their possession or which they are entitled to possess covering the property conveyed to each respectively.

6. The execution and delivery of all instruments called for hereunder and the payment to be made hereunder shall be concluded or or before the 9th day of February, 1940, and the delivery of possession of the premises described in Section 2 hereof shall be concluded on or before the 19th day of February, 1940.

7. The signing of the acceptance set out below shall constitute a binding obligation upon Louis Henry Theis and wife, Virginia Theis, to carry out and perform all acts which this ordinance may require of them.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent therefrom, and shall take effect from the date of its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, and it is so ordered.

AN ORDINANCE (1349) **OJ-37**

AMENDING RULE 30 OF DIVISION 7 OF SECTION 1 OF AN ORDINANCE PASSED AND APPROVED ON DECEMBER 8, 1921, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC ON THE STREETS, PLAZAS AND PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Rule 30 of Division 7 of Section 1 of an Ordinance passed and approved on December 8, 1921, entitled "An Ordinance Regulating Traffic on the Streets, Plazas and Public Places of the City of San Antonio, Repealing All Ordinances in Conflict Herewith, and Providing Penalties", be and the same is hereby amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

2. "Rule 30. Turning and Traffic Direction at Intersections.

The driver of a vehicle intending to turn at an intersection shall do so as follows:

- (a) Both the approach for a right turn and a right turn shall be made as close as practical to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway.
- (b) Approach for a left turn shall be made in that portion of the right half of the roadway nearest the center line thereof, and after entering the intersection the left turn shall be made so as to leave the intersection to the right of the center line of the roadway being entered.
- (d) Approach for a left turn from a two-way street into a one-way street shall be made in that portion of the right half of the roadway nearest the center line thereof, and upon entering the intersection the left turn shall be made to the right of such center line where it enters the intersection.
- (d) A left turn from a one-way street into a two-way street shall be made by

turning left so as to pass to the right of the center line of the two-way street being entered upon leaving the intersection.

- (e) At irregular intersections or in special instances where official markers, buttons, or signs are placed within or adjacent to any intersection by the Police Department of the City of San Antonio, indicating the specific course to be followed by vehicles in turning, it shall be unlawful for the driver to turn any vehicle other than as indicated, directed and required by such markers, buttons, or signs."

3. This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent therefrom, and shall take effect from the date of its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio.

AN ORDINANCE (1368) *OJ-38*

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ZONING REGULATIONS AND DISTRICTS, ETC.", PASSED AND APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO ON THE 3RD DAY OF NOVEMBER, A. D. 1938.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ZONING REGULATIONS AND DISTRICTS, ETC.", passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the 3rd day of November, A. D. 1938, be and the same is hereby amended by adding paragraph 53-a to Section 21 thereof, as follows:-

2. "53-a. DISPLAY SIGNS. The Board of Commissioners may grant a permit to erect a display sign or flood light, or both, within the area included in the set-back provisions of this ordinance in all Districts except Districts A, B, C, D and E, provided such display signs or flood lights are erected and supported wholly within the property lines of such property; and

provided further, that such display sign or flood light shall in all other respects comply with the requirements of the Sign and Billboard Ordinance of the City of San Antonio passed and approved the 11th day of January, A. D. 1940.

3. WHEREAS, on account of the congestion in the streets in the City of San Antonio and the danger from fire, panic, and the undue concentration and congestion of population, and the lack of adequate ordinances and provisions controlling the construction and use of buildings and other structures within the City of San Antonio, the lack of regulations restricting and regulating the use to which lands and buildings of the City of San Antonio may be devoted, creates an urgency and emergency in behalf of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare, necessitating that this ordinance become effective at once, and it is accordingly ordained that the same become effective immediately upon its passage, as the Charter of the City of San Antonio in such cases is made and provided.

4. PASSED AND APPROVED this 8th day of February, A. D. 1940.

AN ORDINANCE (1369) 0J-39

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE PASSED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, ON THE 27TH DAY OF JULY, 1939, WHICH APPEARS OF RECORD IN VOLUME "I", PAGE 499, ET SEQ., OF THE OFFICIAL ORDINANCE RECORDS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS; AUTHORIZING BY THIS AMENDING ORDINANCE THE ISSUANCE OF CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, FUNDING BONDS, SERIES 1940, IN THE TOTAL PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$172,949.20, MATURING SERIALY FROM 1941 TO 1950, INCLUSIVE, BEARING INTEREST AT THE RATE OF TWO AND ONE-FOURTH PER CENTUM (2 $\frac{1}{4}$ %) PER ANNUM, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING, CANCELLING AND IN LIEU OF A LIKE PAR AMOUNT OF LEGALLY ISSUED, VALID AND SUBSISTING INDEBTEDNESS OF SAID CITY; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS AND INTEREST COUPONS; PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY, ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF AN ANNUAL AD VALOREM TAX ON EACH \$100.00 VALUATION OF TAXABLE PROPERTY SITUATED WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO PAY THE INTEREST ON SAID BONDS AND PROVIDE A SINKING FUND FOR THE REDEMPTION THEREOF AT MATURITY; ENACTING PROVISIONS INCIDENT AND RELATING TO THE SUBJECT AND PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

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WHEREAS, House Bill No. 228 of the Forty-sixth Legislature of Texas, Regular Session, approved February 21st, 1939, grants unto cities of the size of San Antonio the power to fund by ordinance enacted by the governing body the whole or any part of any legal debt, which debt is the difference between the wages paid or to be paid the firemen and policemen, and the wages required to be paid the firemen and policemen by the terms of Senate Bill No. 89, passed and approved the 19th day of April, 1937, by the Forty-fifth Legislature of Texas, at the regular session, and which debt accrued or will have accrued before the 31st day of May, 1939, and to issue negotiable bonds with or without coupons, bearing interest at an annual rate as provided by the Charter of the City which issues the said obligations; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio owes to certain persons, or their respective legal representatives or assigns, a legal debt of said City for services performed by some of said persons as firemen, and by the remainder of said persons as policemen of the City of San Antonio, between the dates of April 19th, 1937, and May 31st, 1939, both inclusive, which debt is the difference between the wages paid to said firemen and policemen and the wages required to be paid to said firemen and policemen by the terms of said Senate Bill No. 89, of the Forty-fifth Legislature of Texas, regular session, as aforesaid; and

WHEREAS, heretofore the City of San Antonio has caused an investigation and audit to be made by the appropriate officers and employees of said City for the purpose of determining the names of the firemen and policemen to whom, or to whose legal representatives or assigns, the said indebtedness is owing, and the amount thereof which is owing for each said fireman and policeman, respectively, and it has been ascertained and found that the respective amounts of said indebtedness so owing and the names of the respective persons to whom same is owing are hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, since the passage of the ordinance by the City Commission of the City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 27th day of July, 1939, which appears of record in Ordinance Book "I", Page 499, et seq., to which, and the entire record thereof, reference is hereby SPECIALLY made, which said ordinance authorized the issuance of CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FUNDING BONDS, SERIES

1939, in the principal amount of \$430,260.99, for the purpose of funding, cancelling and in lieu of a like par amount of claims for back wages of the firemen and policemen under said above cited laws, and which said bonds have never been issued or delivered, the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio has found that there has become available from the back tax general fund for the years 1936, 1937 and 1938, the sum of \$257,311.79, for use in making a cash payment of the hereinafter set forth claims or warrants; in some instances the cash payment made upon such claim or warrant discharges the full amount of such obligation, and in other instances as noted hereinafter the cash payment is in part payment of the face amount of such claim or warrant, leaving an unpaid balance due and legally owing thereon as noted; and

WHEREAS, upon payment of said sum of \$257,311.79, to the respective persons hereinafter set forth there will remain an unpaid balance of \$172,959.20, due the respective firemen and policemen, or their legal representatives or assigns, as hereinafter shown, which said amount is a legal debt against the City of San Antonio, Texas, as aforesaid, and it is the desire of the City Commission of the City of San Antonio to amend said ordinance passed on the 27th day of July, 1939, hereinabove referred to, by authorizing the issuance of funding bonds of the City of San Antonio, Texas, in the aggregate principal amount of \$172,949.20, for the purpose of funding, cancelling and in lieu of the balance due by the City of San Antonio, Texas, on said warrants or claims due the firemen and policemen of said City of San Antonio under the above cited Acts and as hereafter shown to be due thereon; and

WHEREAS, the warrants dated July 26th, 1939, issued by the City of San Antonio to firemen and policemen of said City (or their heirs, legal representatives, or assigns) for services rendered between April 19th, 1937, and May 31st, 1939, representing the indebtedness of said City for the difference between the wages paid the firemen and policeman and the wages required to be paid the firemen and policemen by the terms of said Senate Bill No. 89, as passed by the Regular Session of the 45th Legislature of the State of Texas, are herewith described in detail to show the names to whom same were issued, the original or total face amount of each respective warrant before the cash payment was made thereon, the amount of cash payment made on such respective warrants by the City of San Antonio, and the balance still owing on each respective warrant after making said cash payment, which said balance in the aggregate amount, namely: \$172,949.20, is funded in this bond issue, is as follows:

Warrants Nos. 1 to 527, inclusive, represent ninety-seven and one-fourth per cent ($97\frac{1}{4}\%$) of the amount so owing in each case on account of the said services of the payee named (or of the deceased person whose heirs and/or legal representatives are named) in each said warrant, respectively, the remaining two and three fourths per cent ($2\text{-}3/4\%$) having been duly assigned by the respective firemen and policemen (or their heirs and legal representatives in the cases of descendents) as follows: Two per cent (2%) to the City of San Antonio for the account of the Firemen, Policemen and Fire Alarm Operators Pension Fund of said City; and three-fourths of one per cent to Schlesinger & Goodstein, Harry A. Nass, Theo E. Simman^g and Augustus McCloskey.

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of San Antonio, after inquiring into and considering both the names and amounts owing as set forth in the foregoing list, is of the opinion and does hereby find, represent and certify that the said list and amounts owing are true and correct as stated therein; and that the assignments have been duly made in the amounts shown, to the pension fund, and to the persons, and in all things as set forth in said list, and that the amounts stated in each and every instance indicated and shown as the balance amount of warrant due and unpaid, owing and payable to the person or persons named in said warrant, respectively; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to and as previously provided for by an ordinance duly adopted by the City Commission on July 17th, 1939, and by ordinance duly adopted by the City Commission on July 25th, 1939, deficiency warrants of the City of San Antonio with the numbers, date and payees and in the amounts as set forth in the foregoing list have been duly signed by the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of San Antonio and have been duly issued by said City

of San Antonio to the respective payees thereof in the respective amounts shown above and that there is still due and owing thereon the respective amounts shown above to the respective payees, the amounts set forth in the column designated "Balance Amount Due and Unpaid on said Warrant", and that all of said warrants were issued for the purposes stated herein; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of San Antonio does hereby find and certify that each and every warrant hereinabove described and referred to, which shows that there is an unpaid balance due thereon, and said aggregate unpaid balance in the sum of \$172,949.20, represents and is a valid, subsisting, outstanding and legal debt of the City of San Antonio, Texas, and that such debt, namely: \$172,949.20, is the balance still owing to the above payees as shown after the cash payment made on their respective warrants; and that the said sum of \$172,949.20, is the remaining balance of an original debt in the amount of \$430,260.99, which said debt was the difference between the wages paid or to be paid to the firemen and policeman of said City and the wages required to be paid the said firemen and policemen by the terms of said Senate Bill No. 89, passed and approved the 19th day of April, A. D. 1937, by the Regular Session of the 45th Legislature of the State of Texas; that said debt accrued before the 31st day of May, A. D. 1939; that the unpaid balance of said debt as shown above, namely: \$172,949.20, is eligible to be funded by the City of San Antonio, Texas, by ordinances enacted by the governing body of said City pursuant to House Bill No. 228, as passed by the Regular Session of the 46th Legislature of the State of Texas, approved February 21st, 1939; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of San Antonio finds that it is desirable and to the best financial interest of said City to issue its bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$172,949.20, for the purpose of funding, cancelling and in lieu of the unpaid balance due on said warrants; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the ordinance heretofore passed by the City Commission of the City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 27th day of July, 1939, which appears of record in Ordinance Book "I", Page 499, et seq., and entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE

BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FUNDING BONDS, SERIES 1939, IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$430,260.99, MATURING SERIALLY FROM TWO TO FIFTEEN YEARS AFTER DATE THEREOF, BEARING INTEREST AT THE RATE OF 2-3/8% PER ANNUM, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING, CANCELLING AND IN LIEU OF A LIKE PAR AMOUNT OF LEGALLY ISSUED, VALID AND SUBSISTING INDEBTEDNESS OF SAID CITY; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS AND INTEREST COUPONS; PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY, ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF AN ANNUAL TAX ON EACH \$100.00 VALUATION OF ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY SITUATED WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO PAY THE INTEREST ON SAID BONDS AND PROVIDE A SINKING FUND FOR THE REDEMPTION OF THE PRINCIPAL THEREOF; ENACTING PROVISIONS INCIDENT AND RELATING TO THE SUBJECT AND PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY."

shall be and the same is hereby, amended by this Ordinance enacted this, the 9th day of February, 1940, and that said bonds of said City authorized in the amount of \$430,260.99, as set forth in said Ordinance of July 27th, 1939, shall not be issued in accordance therewith, but bonds in the amount of One Hundred Seventy-two Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-nine and 20/100 (\$172,949.20) Dollars of said City shall be issued in accordance herewith.

SECTION 2. That the negotiable bonds of the City of San Antonio, Texas, to be called "CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, FUNDING BONDS, SERIES 1940", be issued under and by virtue of House Bill No. 228, of the Forty-sixth Legislature of Texas, Regular Session, approved February 21st, 1939, and by virtue of the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas and the Charter of said City of San Antonio, in the amount of \$172,949.20, for the purpose of funding,

AN ORDINANCE (1390) OJ-41

AMENDING SECTION 111 OF THE BUILDING CODE OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Section 111 of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, MAINTENANCE, REPAIR AND REMOVAL OF BUILDINGS WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF", passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on January 13th, 1913, as amended, be amended so that same shall hereafter read as follows:-

2. "Section 111.

D I S T R I C T "A"

(a) In District "A", the Fireproof District, only buildings of the first class shall hereafter be erected. All additions to existing buildings must be of the first class.

(b) New additions to present structures must have brick fire walls between old and new buildings. All openings to have approved fire doors on each side of the wall, and all outside windows except those fronting on streets, to be fire-proof construction.

(c) No wooden sheds or other structures of any kind whether wholly or partly inclosed, shall be erected and all roofs shall be constructed of incombustible material.

(d) No building, the outer covering of which is corrugated iron or other sheet metal, and no buildings constructed of steel or iron posts and channel iron, covered with metal lath and plaster, shall be erected within this district.

(e) No lumber yard or planing mill shall be hereafter located in the inner fire District and no lumber yard or planing mill now in said district, shall be extended.

(f) Temporary frame buildings may be erected for the uses of builders upon permits issued by the Building Inspector, as may also such temporary structures as platforms, stands, election booths and circus tents.

(g) Alterations.

1. Any building or structure in District "A" which is enlarged, altered raised or built upon to an extent exceeding in any consecutive period of 24 months an expenditure of 20 per cent of the value of such building or structure, shall be made to comply with all the requirements of a building hereafter erected in such District "A". In computing the value of such building or structure, any part of such building or structure which is to be removed or demolished shall not be taken into consideration in determining the value of such building or structure.

2. Changes, alterations and repairs to the interior of such building or to the front facing a public street may be made, provided such changes shall not increase the fire hazard of the building, in the opinion of the Building Inspector.

3. No masonry or other fireproof walls shall be removed from any building in District "A" with the approval of the Building Inspector.

4. All openings in fire walls in District "A" must have on both sides of such firewall fire doors approved by the Building Inspector.

(h) Any person or persons violating any of the above provisions shall be punishable by a fine of not exceeding Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars.

3. Whereas, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation, good government and public welfare and safety that requires this ordinance to become effective at once; therefore, upon the passage of this ordinance by a vote of four-fifths (4/5) of the Commissioners, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio; and it is so ordered.

AN ORDINANCE (1405) OJ-42

AMENDING SECTION 1 OF CHAPTER 43 OF THE 1899 REVISED CRIMINAL ORDINANCES
OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Section 1 of Chapter 43 of the 1899 Revised Criminal Ordinances of the City of San Antonio, be and the same is hereby amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

2. "Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to erect or cause to be erected on any street, alley, or public thoroughfare within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, any fence or fences composed either wholly or in part of barbed wire, unless the use of said barbed wire is restricted to the placing of not more than two strands thereof at the top of any fence or fences over five feet in height provided further, that said strand or strands slant away from the street, alley or thoroughfare and toward the property said fence or fences may bound.

3. This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent therefrom, and shall take effect from the date of its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio.

AN ORDINANCE (1408) *OJ-45*

GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO,
TEXAS, WITH CERTAIN RESERVATIONS, AND UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS AND STIPULATIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. The Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio, Texas, is hereby granted the right within the boundaries herein designated in the City of San Antonio to lay and maintain pipes underneath, and to string and maintain wires over and along, that portion of the public streets, alleys, plazas, squares and creeks, located within the Housing Project of said Housing Authority described by metes and bounds as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of South Colorado Street with Apache Creek; thence north along South Colorado Street to Vera Cruz Street; thence east along Vera Cruz Street to South San Marcos Street; thence north along South San Marcos Street to Durango Street; thence west along Durango Street to South Brazos Street; thence south along South Brazos Street to Colima Street; thence west along Colima Street to South San Jacinto Street; thence south along South San Jacinto Street to Vera Cruz Street; thence east along Vera Cruz Street to South Brazos Street; thence south along South Brazos Street to Apache Creek; thence along Apache Creek to the place of beginning.

This franchise shall also include portions of public streets, alleys, plazas, squares and creeks, located between irregular portions of such project, even though same are not within the project boundary lines proper.

2. The purpose of this grant is to authorize said Housing Authority to construct and put in place poles, wires, pipes and other appurtenant equipment for the transmission of gas and electric current into said project.

3. The gas and electric current purchased by said Housing Authority shall be sold to the tenants on said project on a non-profit basis.

4. This grant is subject, however, to all legal rights of the owners of land abutting on such streets, alleys, plazas, squares and creeks, and is subject also to the reservations and conditions following.

5. The City Council reserves the right of exclusive control of said streets, alleys, plazas, squares and creeks with the right to direct and control the location, construction and use of all such poles, wires, pipes and other appurtenant equipment in said streets, alleys, plazas, squares and creeks, together with the right to require the location of same to be changed at the expense of said Housing Authority wherever in the judgement of said City Council the public interest or convenience may require such change of location, and whenever, in the judgement of said City Council, such change of location may be necessary to the due accommodation of said Housing Authority's use to which the same are dedicated; which change of location may include the laying of wires underground or a change in the position or location of wires laid underground. When any such change of location may be ordered by said City Council, and is not made by said Housing Authority within 60 days after receipt of said notice of such order, the change may be made by the City at the expense of said Housing Authority.

6. The franchise hereby granted shall not be transferred, assigned, sold or leased without the consent of the City of San Antonio given by ordinance.

7. The term of this franchise shall be 25 years from the date hereof.

8. Upon the violation by the Housing Authority of any condition in this ordinance,

the City Council shall notify said Housing Authority of such violation, and unless the condition be complied with within 60 days after such notice, the City Council may by ordinance declare the franchise forfeited.

AN ORDINANCE (1420) OJ - 46

GRANTING ALEXANDER & HALE A PERMIT TO CONNECT WITH THE CITY SANITARY
SEWERAGE SYSTEM.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Alexander & Hale, a firm composed of M. D. Alexander and J. P. Hale, is granted a permit to connect sanitary sewers built outside of the city limits with the sewerage system of the City of San Antonio, subject to the following conditions and stipulations:-

2. The sewer lines shall be constructed in Terrell Hills to serve the following areas, the first being between Ridgemont Avenue and Zambrano Road, starting at east property line of Wiltshire Avenue 132.9 feet from Ridgemont and extending to eastward along centerline of 5 foot easement a distance of 487.2 feet to centerline of a public alley, thence on eastward along said centerline of alley to east property line Eldon Road, a total distance of 1195 feet of new sewer line; and the second being from manhole in said public alley a distance of 494.7 from Wiltshire (along easement), to north a distance of 174 feet to manhole in centerline Ridgemont, thence to east along centerline Ridgemont a distance of 64.7 feet to a manhole, thence to north along centerline of alley a distance of 157.9 feet to manhole, thence eastward along centerline of alley a distance of 488.4 feet to a manhole, a total distance of 885 feet of new sewer line; the cost of said sewers being estimated at about \$1855.00 to be paid by the said Alexander & Hale, and the final cost to be filed with the City Plumbing Inspector within 10 days after completion of said sewers.

4. The permit hereby granted is temporary and the City reserves the right to revoke same at any time, with or without notice, for any reason that may in the judgement of the City be sufficient, and to stop taking the sewage, or any part thereof.

5. This permit shall only be for sanitary sewage, and no use shall be made thereof which in the opinion of the City Sewer Engineer, is detrimental to the sewerage system of San Antonio, or which might impair the function of its sewage treatment plant.

6. In consideration of the permission granted hereby and the service to be rendered by the City, the users of the said sewers agree severally to pay to the City of San Antonio the schedule of fees fixed or to be fixed by the Ordinances of the City of San Antonio, said rental commencing on the date connection is made with the sewers, payable yearly in advance.

7. The rental charge of San Antonio is made a lien upon the real estate served by a connection to the sanitary sewerage system of the City of San Antonio, and after maturity the rent shall bear interest at the rate of 10 per cent per annum, and if suit is brought to enforce the collection or if collected through judicial proceedings, the user agrees to pay San Antonio a reasonable attorney fee.

8. The inspectors of the City shall have free access to premises of a user and all buildings situated thereon while said premises are connected with City sanitary sewers, for the purpose of inspecting the condition of the plumbing and the use of the sewers.

9. Said sewer when completed and paid for will become the property of the City of San Antonio, and part of its public sewer system.

10. Individual service connections and the house piping shall be made in conformity with the ordinances of the City of San Antonio, but same shall not be made until said sewers have been completed and properly connected to the City's main sewer line and duly accepted by the City.

11. Each individual user shall make application for the service connection and the house piping to the City Plumbing Inspector and shall pay the City the fees stipulated in the city ordinances, and until said sewer lines are paid for they shall pay the sum of 60 cents per foot of frontage along both of the above mentioned sewer lines, with a minimum charge of \$35.00 for each and every connection with said sewers or house service going into said sewers until the actual cost of said sewers shall have been collected and paid to said Alexander & Hale.

LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between San Antonio Public Service Company, hereinafter called "Lessor," and City of San Antonio, Texas, hereinafter called "Lessee", WITNESSETH:

I

Lessor does hereby lease and let unto Lessee for a period of two years from and after the date of execution hereof, that portion of the building known as Station A, located at the corner of Villita and South Presa Streets in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, heretofore used as a boiler room, being the northern portion of said building adjacent to the San Antonio River, and measuring approximately 150 feet by 54 feet, for use by the City of San Antonio and the National Youth Administration as a workroom for the production of articles made of metal, clay, stone and other products, and in instruction in arts and crafts connected therewith.

II.

Lessee hereby agrees to lease and take said premises for the purpose and in accordance with the conditions and covenants herein contained, and to pay a rental therefor in the amount of \$1.00 per year, payable each year in advance.

III.

It is agreed that lessee accepts said property in its present state and assume all risk and liability with respect to the suitability of said premises for the use to which it is to be placed, and agrees to remove all property belonging to Lessor located in said leased premises into the unleased portions of said building, to close with brick and mortar the door leading to the other parts of the building, and to completely close the leased portions of the building off from the unleased portions of the building in a manner satisfactory to the representative of Lessor. Lessee further agrees to rearrange the rest rooms in the leased portion of the building as to provide one toilet for the unleased portion of the building completely segregated from the remaining facilities, said work to be done in a manner satisfactory to the representative of Lessor. The platform and motor located in the leased premises shall remain in place, but Lessee shall cage off the motor and line shaft and all equipment connected with the motor in a manner satisfactory to Lessor's representative. All work done on the leased premises is to be at the exclusive expense of Lessee and under Lessee's supervision.

IV.

In conjunction with the leased premises, Lessee shall be entitled to use the unoccupied and unused portion of the yard at the west end of said building, provided Lessee, prior to using or occupying same, shall put up a fence (approximately 40 feet in length) segregating said portion of said yard from the portion now used for equipment of the Company, said fence to be erected at the sole expense of Lessee.

V.

It is agreed that Lessee may open an entrance door to said premises at a point on South Presa Street in a manner satisfactory to Lessor's representative, may pave the floor of the leased premises with asphalt pavement, and may paint the inside of the leased premises white and install electric wiring in the leased premises, provided that all electricity used in the leased premises shall be secured on proper application and shall be paid for by the Lessee in accordance with the usual regulations for such use.

VI.

Lessee hereby agrees to keep said premises in good order and free from fire hazards, and at the expiration or termination of this lease to return the same to Lessor in as good condition as when received, ordinary wear and tear and obsolescence excepted, except that Lessee shall not be required to tear out or change any of the structural alterations made with the approval of Lessor and in accordance with the provisions of this lease, and Lessee hereby agrees to indemnify and hold Lessor harmless from any liability growing out of the alterations, changes and improvements herein provided and growing out of the occupancy of the leased premises, whether to persons employed in said leased premises, employees of Lessor, or members of the public.

VII.

It is expressly understood and agreed that this lease may be terminated at any time by either Lessor or Lessee upon ninety (90) days written notice, if given by Lessor to Lessee to be delivered to the Mayor of the City of San Antonio, and if by Lessee to Lessor to be delivered to the President, Vice-President or Secretary of Lessor.

AN ORDINANCE (1475) *OJ-49*

CANCELLING THE ISSUANCE OF CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, FUNDING BOND, NO. 1, SERIES 1940, DATED FEBRUARY 1st, 1940, IN THE DENOMINATION OF \$949.20; AUTHORIZING AND DESIGNATING THE COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS OF TEXAS TO CANCEL THE SAME; ENACTING PROVISIONS INCIDENT AND RELATING TO THE SUBJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, heretofore, on the 9th day of February, 1940, the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, Texas, authorized the issuance of \$172,949.20, "CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, FUNDING BONDS, SERIES 1940", dated February 1st, 1940, numbered consecutively from one (1) to one hundred seventy-three (173), both inclusive, in the denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, except Bond No. 1, being for the principal sum of Nine Hundred Forty-nine and 20/100 (\$949.20) Dollars; which said ordinance authorizing the issuance of said bonds appears of record in Ordinance Book "J", Page 52, et seq. of the Minutes of said City Commission, to which reference is hereby SPECIALLY made; and

WHEREAS, the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, Texas, affirmatively find that said bonds numbered from two (2) to one hundred seventy-three (173), both inclusive, aggregating One Hundred Seventy-two Thousand (\$172,000.00) Dollars, have been issued and delivered and now constitute outstanding, unpaid and unsatisfied obligations of the City of San Antonio, Texas; however, Bond No. 1, for the said sum of Nine Hundred Forty-nine and 20/100 (\$949.20) Dollars has not been issued or delivered by the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Commissioners of said City not to issue said Bond No. 1, for the said sum of \$949.20, but it is the desire of the City Commissioners to pay the underlying debt for the issuance thereof in cash, and to authorize the Comptroller of Public Accounts, where such Bond is now being held as provided in said ordinance of February 9th, 1940, to cancel and return the said Bond No. 1 to the City of San Antonio, Texas; NOW, THEREFORE:-

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the issuance of Bond No. 1, in the amount of Nine Hundred Forty-nine and 20/100 (\$949.20) Dollars, of an issue of One Hundred Seventy-two Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-nine and 20/100 (\$172,949.20) Dollars, CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, FUNDING BONDS, SERIES 1940, dated February 1st, 1940, shall be, and the same is hereby cancelled.

2. That the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas, Austin, Texas, shall be, and he is hereby, AUTHORIZED and REQUESTED to cancel said Bond No. 1, above described, and to return the same to the City of San Antonio, Texas.

3. That the City Clerk of the City of San Antonio, Texas, shall be, and he is hereby, AUTHORIZED, ORDERED and DIRECTED to cause a certified copy of this ordinance to be forwarded to the Comptroller of Public Accounts which shall be his authority to so cancel and return said Bond No. 1 to the City of San Antonio, Texas.

4. Due to the necessity that exists to maintain the financial and borrowing credit of the City for the payment of its debts and to provide the necessary and essential functions of the Government and to effect the purposes of this ordinance, the same creates an emergency and an urgency exists which requires that this ordinance become effective at once, and it is accordingly ordained that, upon the passage of this ordinance by a four-fifths vote of the

AN ORDINANCE (1522) *OJ-51*

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PROCEDURE IN THE CORPORATION COURT OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, PASSED AND APPROVED ON THE 4TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, A.D. 1928.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Section 2 of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PROCEDURE IN THE CORPORATION COURT OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO", passed and approved on the 4th day of September, A. D. 1928, be and the same is hereby amended so as to hereafter read as follows:-

2. "SECTION 2: The Judge of said Court shall be appointed as provided by the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio. The Board of Commissioners shall appoint one clerk and six or more deputy clerks of said Court, one of whom shall be on duty at the said Court at all hours and times, under such regulations and equality of hours of service as may be fixed by said judge and ~~as~~ provided by law. The Board of Commissioners shall appoint one chief bailiff and two deputy bailiffs of said Court who shall perform all such duties as required of them by law. The appointment of the clerk and deputy clerks and the appointment of the chief bailiff and deputy bailiffs shall be entered upon the Minutes of said Court. The Judge of said Court, the clerk and all deputy clerks and the chief bailiff and all deputy bailiffs shall take the oath of office prescribed by the Constitution and give such bond as is required by the Charter and Ordinances of said City."

3. WHEREAS, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of order, good government and public safety that requires this ordinance to become effective at once; therefore, upon the passage of this ordinance by a four-fifths vote of the Commissioners, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.
