

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 19TH, A.D.1923, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Rieden, Wright. Absent, Lambert.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

---MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS---

Petition of Banda Juvenil for permission to hold carnival on grounds at corner of Medina and Buena Vista Street, Feb. 22 to Mch 22, 1923 was read and granted. (Monroe Carnival Co.)

Communication from San Antonio Architectural Club offering to furnish the City free copies of Building, Plumbing and Electrical Ordinances, was read and final action postponed until these ordinances had been passed by the Commissioners.

Petition to have street between Soledad Street and N. Flores Street named W?Martin Street was read the first time and laid over.

Petition to change name of Groesbeck Street to Hoefgen Ave. was read the second time and laid over.

Petition of Vicks Everready Garage for permit to install gasoline tank 107 Frio City Road; Petition of Swinebrood Auto Supply to install gasoline pump and tank 412 S. Alamo St.; and petition of Henry Kohler, for permit to repair awning, were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police.

Petition of J.K. Burr, for permit to connect with City sewer was read and referred to City Engineer.

Commissioner Wright introduced an ordinance providing for lighting the City for three years, which was read and laid over.

Commissioner Wright made the following recommendations, which were adopted: Nevelow Bros. for permit to install gasoline pump and tank 740 S. Alamo St. granted. C.B. Ranzual, for permit to install gasoline pump and tank 625 N. Zarzamora Street granted.

Commissioner Rieden introduced an ordinance appropriating \$1909.98 to pay S.A. Water Supply Co. which was read and laid over.

Commissioner Wright introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Rieden, Wright, Nay, Pfeiffer.

AN ORDINANCE

Directing the abandonment of Euclid Park and of the strip of ground 55 x 350 feet, adjoining the same on the south, for park and highway Purposes, respectively, and authorizing the conveyance thereof to the San Antonio Independent School District for school purposes..

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio, Texas, possessed the following described property within the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, for highway and park purposes, respectively, to-wit:

A strip of land, as shown by a certain plat of the Lakeview Addition to the City of San Antonio, Texas, recorded in Volume 105, page 190 of the plat records of Bexar County, Texas, about 55 feet wide, between the property hereinafter described as Euclid Park, and Block 34, as shown by said plat, now known as City Block 3633, bounded to the westward by the line of 21st Street, to the eastward by the line of 20th Street, to the northward by said Euclid Park, and to the southward by the north line of said Block 34, now known as City Block 3633; and also the following tract of land shown on said plat aforesaid, to which reference is made, and known as Euclid Park, being bounded to the north by City Block 3633, to the east by the line of 20th Street to the west by the line of 21st Street, and to the south by the north line of said 55 foot strip described above; said last named tract being shown upon said plat aforesaid, and designated as Euclid Park, and

WHEREAS, the original dedicators of said property, as well as the adjoining property owners have agreed and consented that said property may be abandoned for said park and highway purposes, and conveyed to the San Antonio Independent School District for school purposes, and

WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio are satisfied that the public interests would be advanced by such abandonment and conveyance:

IT IS ACCORDINGLY ordered, in the form of an ordinance,

(1) That the tract of land above described as being denominated "Euclid Park" is hereby abandoned by the City of San Antonio for park and highway purposes.

(2) That the strip of ground 55 feet wide above described as located immediately south of said Euclid Park, is hereby abandoned for highway purposes.

(3) The Mayor of the City of San Antonio is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to make a good and sufficient conveyance of all of the rights of the City of San Antonio in and to said two tracts of land to the San Antonio Independent School District, duly organized and acting as a municipal independent school district, as provided by the laws of Texas, for public school purposes.

The immediate necessity of making use of said two tracts of land for school purposes creates a public necessity for the immediate effect of this ordinance, and it is therefore ordered that this ordinance shall, and it hereby does, take effect from and after its passage.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$6.93 (The San Antonio School Boards proportion being \$2.10) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1921 General Fund to pay Manuel Garza taxes collected in error.

Levying an advalorem and occupation tax for the support of the City Government of the City of San Antonio, and levying a tax to pay the interest on the bonded debt of said City, and to create a sinking fund therefor, and a special tax for the support of the Carnegie Library in said City, all said taxes being levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. That there is hereby levied for general purposes for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, on all property, real, personal and mixed, within the limits of the City of San Antonio, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of the State, and ordinances of this City, an advalorem tax of and at the rate of One and 25/100 Dollars upon every One Hundred Dollars valuation.

Section 2: That to provide for the payment of the annual interest on all outstanding bonds of the City, issued prior to the year 1913 other than district improvement bonds, and to produce a sinking fund with which to pay such bonded indebtedness at maturity, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of five (5) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned or referred to in Section 1 hereof; and for fiscal year 1922 all collections on account of said levy made, shall be received and expended as a part of the General Sinking Fund of said bonds the same as heretofore notwithstanding any ordinance to the contrary.

Section 3: That to provide for the payment on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1913, in the sum of \$1,500,000.00 for paving public streets and public places, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they may severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of five and 50/100 (.0550 cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 4: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1913, in the sum of \$375,000.00 for opening and widening streets, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of one and 20/100 (.0120) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 5: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1913, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for constructing concrete bridges, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Thirty One Hundredths (.0030) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 6: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1913, in the sum of \$25,000.00 for constructing sidewalks and curbing, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922 and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of ten-one hundredths (.0010) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 7: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1913, in the sum of \$800,000.00 for constructing sanitary sewers, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special

tax of Three and no/100 (.03) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 8: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1913, in the sum of \$300,000.00 for constructing storm sewers and drains, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922 and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Ninety One Hundredths (.0090) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 9: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1913, in the sum of \$125,000.00 for constructing a City Hospital, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Forty One Hundredths (.0040) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 10: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1913, in the sum of \$175,000.00 for constructing a Police and Fire Station, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof, as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922 and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of forty one hundredths (.0040) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 11: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1913, in the sum of \$50,000.00 for constructing garbage incinerators, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922 and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of twenty one hundredths (.0020) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 12: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$950,000.00 for opening and widening and straightening streets and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of four and no/100 cents (.0400) on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 13: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$900,000.00 for street paving, storm sewers and drains, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922 and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of three and 70/100 (.0370) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 14: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$500,000.00 for sanitary sewers, mains and laterals, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Two and no/100 (.0200) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 15: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$500,000.00 for public auditorium building, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922 and ending May 31st, 1923 a special tax of two and no/100 (.0200) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 16: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for constructing permanent bridges and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922 and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Eighty one hundredths (.0080) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 17: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for San Antonio River improvements, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922 and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Eighty one hundredths (.0080) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 18: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for public parks improvement, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922 and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Eighty One Hundredths (.0080) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 19: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$150,000.00 for Fire and Police Station building and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Sixty One Hundredths (.0060) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 20: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for garbage incinerator extension, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922 and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Thirty One Hundredths (.0030) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 22: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for Market House Annex, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof, as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Eighty One Hundredths (.0080) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 21: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1st, 1919, in the sum of \$50,000.00 for sidewalks and curbing, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Twenty Hundredths (.0020) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 23: That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of Two (.02) cents on the One Hundred

Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof, for the support and maintenance of the Carnegie Library in said City.

Section 24: That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, upon every person, firm or corporation or association of persons, pursuing any occupation upon which a tax is placed by the laws of the State of Texas one half of the State Tax imposed upon each such occupation subject to such restrictions and limitations as may be imposed by the laws of the State of Texas and ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

Levying special taxes for the payment of interest on and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment of certain issues of bonds, issued on the credits of improvement Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14, in the City of San Antonio, Texas, for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$23,500.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 1 as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 3rd day of April, 1905, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of three (3) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 1 in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 2: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$30,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 2 as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 12th day of December, 1903, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of four (4) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 2 in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by the ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 3: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$38,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 3 as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 21st day of December, 1904, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of six (6) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation of all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 3, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 4: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$15,000.00 and \$221,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 4 as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 14th day of December, 1904, and a special election held on February 8th, 1913, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of eighteen (18) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 4 in the City of San Antonio, as same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of this City.

Section 5: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$7,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 5, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 2nd day of January, 1905, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of four (4) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation of all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 5 in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 6: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$45,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 7, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 15th day of June, 1908, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of six (6) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 7 in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 7: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$75,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 8, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 14th day of March, 1905, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of five (5) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 8 in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 8: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$55,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 9 as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 3rd day of March, 1905, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of five (5) cents on the One Hundred

Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 9 in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 9: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$43,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 10, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 4th day of August, 1905, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of five (5) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 10, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 10: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$120,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 11, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 12th day of December, 1905, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of two (2) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 11 in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 11: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$5,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 12, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 17th day of September, 1909, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of five (5) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 12 in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 12: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$20,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 13 as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 10th day of August, 1909, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of four (4) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 13 in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 13: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$17,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 14, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 21st day of June, 1919, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1922, and ending May 31st, 1923, a special tax of ten (10) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation of all property, real and personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 14, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the Board of Commissioners of said City.
