Proceedings had during meeting of the City Council in the Council Chamber relative to to Resolution directing the S. A. Transit Co., to present facts concerning motor bus fares and motor bus system: Mr. Kennon Utilities Attorney representing the City introduced one witness, the witness only stated his name, hearing was started without the Transit Company present. The Transit Company having been duly advised through the mails of such a hearing. Mayor Mauermann then stated to the council this testimony is being put on for the Commissioners and then I ask that the matter be postponed until Tuesday. A resolution was introduced "Setting hearing on motor bus fares and Motor Bus System" which was passed and approved at Commissioners' meeting April 17th, 1947. After Mr. Kennon started to place a witness on the stand, Commissioner Anderson asked is this a hearing on the rate question? The Mayor answered it is not a rate question, it is a question of zoning. Comm. Anderson said it certainly involved the rate. Mayor Mauermann answered in a way it does. Commissioner Anderson: We are within two or three weeks of an election and this rate question is one of the most important question and it involved not only the City of San Antonio but the life of any company doing business under franchise or otherwise. In order that this question might not become involved in politics, I am going to move that further action on this matter be deferred until the first Thursday in June. Mayor Mauermann asked Commissioner Anderson won't you let me finish putting in the evidence, and then we will get to that? Commissioner Anderson I make a motion that and I do not think that this question can be treated in an orderly manner. Commissioner Callaghan: I second the motion, your Honor. Comm. Anderson, the motion had been made and seconded. Mayor Mauermann: I want to state this, that the question of rates can come up in an orderly manner after June 1st, and we intend to do that. A Vote was then taken and the Mayor voted "No", and each of the following Commissioners, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Callaghan voted "Aye". Mayor Mauermann had Mr. Kennon read the Ordinance and also had him read the letter before a vote was called. Mayor Mauermann I call for a vote now on the Ordinance. Commissioner Anderson, Your Honor, it has been moved and seconded that the action on this Ordinance be postponed until the first Thursday in June. Mayor Mauermann, I am offering it now and it has not been offered before. Commissioner Anderson, I move that the action on the Ordinance be postponed until the first Thursday in June. Commissioner Callaghan I second the motion. A Vote was then had on said motion the Mayor voted "Nay" and each of the Commissioner voted "Aye".

On motion made by Commissioner Callaghan and seconded by Commissioner Anderson and duly carried meeting was adjourned April 29th, 1947.
