AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$9,750.00 out of 1922 General Fund to pay interest on seven (7) Notes.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$9,750.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of 1922 General Fund (Various Depts), payable to the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, to pay one years interest from August 1st 1923 to August 1st 1924, at the rate of 5% per annum, on seven (7) Notes in the total sum of \$195,000.00, viz; 6 notes Nos. 9 to 14 inc., in the sum of \$25,000.00 each and No. 15 in the sum of \$45,000.00, being of a series of notes Nos. 1 to 15 inc., dated August 1st 1923, and maturing June 1st 1925, drawn against the 1922 General Fund.

AN ORDINANCE

APPROPRIATING CERTAIN SUMS TO COVER PRO-RATA 1924 TAXES ON CERTAIN LOTS ACQUIRED BY THE CITY FOR STREET PURPOSES, AS THEREIN SET OUT.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio,

1. That the sum of TWELVE AND 59/100 DOLLARS (\$12.59) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1919 Street Opening and Widening Fund, in favor of R. A. Richey to cover taxes he will be required to pay to the State of Texas and County of Bexar, and the City of San Antonio, for the fiscal year 1924, on Lot No. 15, New City Block No. 6161, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas; upon said lot being deeded to the City of San Antonio for street purposes, said sum being the estimated pro-rata of taxes accruing to the State, County and City, for the fiscal year 1924, to be paid to the said R. A. Richey.

2. That the sum of FOUR AND 73/100ths DOLLARS (\$4.73) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1919 Street Opening and Widening Fund, in favor of J. C. Magee and wife Ora M. Magee, to cover taxes they will be required to pay to the State of Texas and County of Bexar, and the City of San Antonio, for the fiscal year 1924, on part of Lot No. 17, N. C. B. No. 2588, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas; said sum, being the estimated pro-rata of taxes accruing to the State, County and City aforesaid, for the fiscal year 1924, to be paid to the said J. C. Magee and wife Ora M. Magee, upon said portion of said lot being deeded to the City of San Antonio for street purposes.

3. That the sum of Ten and 18/100ths Dollars (\$10.18) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1919 Street Opening and Widening Fund, in favor of Chas. F. A. Hummel and wife Emelia Hummel, to cover taxes they will be required to pay to the State of Texas and County of Bexar, and the City of San Antonio, for the fiscal year 1924, on Lot No. 16, N. C. B. No. 2588, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas; said sum, being the estimated pro-rata of taxes accruing to the State, County and City aforesaid, for the fiscal year 1924, to be paid to the said Chas. F. A. Hummel and wife Emelia Hummel, upon said lot being deeded to the City of San Antonio for street purposes.


AN ORDINANCE
