

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

THURSDAY, MAY 17th, A.D. 1917. 4 P.M.

Present: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Garland, Lambert and Heuerman.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

----MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS----

Petition of Nathan Newelow, for permit to erect telephone booth at 102 E. Houston Street, was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police:
For arc lamp at South Presa Street and Fairview Ave.
Ed. Stauss, for building permit.

Petition of J.L. Watson, for correction of assessment, was read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation.

Petition of O.O. Luter for quit claim deed was read and referred to City Attorney.

Commissioner Garland reporting on petition of R.S. Springall for correction of assessment recommended that assessment of building be reduced to \$1500.00 in addition to taxes on lot. Adopted.

Commissioner Garland recommended that petition of Wasson School for exemption from taxation be granted, in accordance with report of City Attorney.

No. 374 **MB-592** AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$114,823.18 to pay off certain notes of the City.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$114,823.18 be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1916 General Fund to pay off and liquidate the following notes with interest thereon to May 18, 1917:

Note No. 3 dated August 1, 1916, payable to the Alamo National Bank, in the sum of Fifty Five Thousand (\$55,000.00) Dollars, with interest computed to May 18, 1917 at 5-1/2 per cent per annum, being Twenty Four Hundred and Eleven and 59/100 (\$2411.59) Dollars.

Note No. 4. dated August 1, 1916 payable to the State National Bank in the sum of Fifty Five Thousand (\$55,000.00) Dollars, with interest computed to May 18, 1917, at 5-1/2 per cent per annum, being Twenty Four Hundred and Eleven and 59/100 (\$2411.59) Dollars.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom and the same shall take effect at once.

No. 375 *MB-593* AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$23.90 to pay New York Exchange on \$15,922.50.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$23.90 be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1916 General Fund to pay exchange on \$15,922.50 transmitted to New York by the Alamo National Bank to pay interest on bonds.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Five Hundred and Eighty Seven and 50/100 (\$587.50) Dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the sinking fund of Improvement District No. 1 to pay interest matured on bonds issued upon the credit of said Improvement District No. 1.

Accepting proposal of David Lehr Jr. for constructing sidewalks on north side of Myrtle Street and authorizing contract and appropriating money therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1:(Acceptance) That the City does hereby accept the attached written proposal of said party named in the caption hereof, dated May 7, 1917 and offering to construct a sidewalk on the north side of Myrtle Street from San Pedro Avenue to Flores Street in and for said City in accordance with the written specifications and description and drawings prepared and submitted by the City Engineer provided said party making said proposal shall strictly comply with all requirements made by or under the provisions of this ordinance and all instruments herein referred to, which are made a part hereof.

Section 2. (Appropriation) To defray the costs and expenses to be paid by the City by reason of the premises the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary shall be and the same is hereby appropriated out of sidewalk and curbing fund

No. 378. *-596* AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$1338.07 to pay the Woolley Construction Co.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of

Thirteen Hundred and Thirty Eight and 07/100 (\$1338.07) Dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1916 General Fund to pay Woolley Construction Co. for repairs to paving on Lakeview Avenue, the City to be reimbursed by the Equitable Surety Company of St. Louis.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

Commissioner Uhr arrived to attend the meeting.

Bids of Charles F. Parker, Woolley Construction Co. and W.F.Southwell and Co., to build sidewalks, ordered constructed under a resolution adopted April 30, 1917, were opened, read and referred to City Engineer for recommendation.

Petition of Pioneer Mills for permit to construct spur track across S.Alamo Street, and build trestle across San Antonio River was granted on recommendation of City Engineer, and to be built under his direction.
