APPROPRIATING \$1,015 OUT OF PARK REVENUE BOND 1945 FUND FOR PAYROLL.

AN ORDINANCE (3443)  
ACCEPTING PROPOSAL OF NATIONAL BANK OF COMMERCE AND DESIGNATING IT AS GENERAL DEPOSITORY AND SPECIAL DEPOSITORY OF THE CITY AND AS FISCAL AGENT FOR THE CITY; AND CREATING THE CONTRACT WITH SAID BANK TO FINANCE THE CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1946.

At the suggestion of Mayor Mauermann and on motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Callaghan and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson, the Council ordered a meeting of the Committee of the Whole to be held at 10:00 o'clock, A.M., on Wednesday, May 22, for an open discussion in the Council Chamber of the tentative budget for the 1946 fiscal year.

At the request of Commissioner Hein, and on motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Callaghan and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson, the Council authorized the purchasing agent to proceed with emergency purchase of sprayer, weed-killer and two drums of DDT needed in the anti-polio drive.

On motion of Commissioner Callaghan, seconded by Commissioner Hein and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson, the Council ordered certain funds on hand from sale of lands and other sources, which funds had not been earmarked for the banks, transferred to the Mayor's Dept. to pay the \$10,000 Helmle judgment.

On motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Callaghan and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson, the Council directed the Clerk to write and thank the DDT Products Corp. of Houston, in the name of the

City of San Antonio, for their contribution and assistance in the City's fight against the polio epidemic.
