AN ORDINANCE 011-89

AMENDING SECTION 2 OF THE ORDINANCE DATED DECEMBER 1, 1921, REGULATING LOCAL STREET TRANSPORTATION IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO..

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Sec. 1. That Section 2 of an ordinance dated December 1, 1921, entitled "An ordinance for the purpose of regulating local street transportation of persons by jitneys, motor buses and other vehicles and prohibiting the use of jitneys, motor buses and other vehicles for such transportation in the streets of the city of San Antonio, except as herein provided for, and providing appropriate penalties," be and the same is hereby amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation to use the streets or public ways for operating or causing to be operated any vehicle for the purpose of engaging in local street transportation, as herein defined, except over the routes hereinafter designated and using the character of equipment hereinafter specified, and maintaining minimum schedules hereinafter required:

1. ARMY POST

There is hereby designated a route to be known as the Army Post route for motor bus service as follows:

Beginning at Broadway and Travis Streets
 Thence south on Broadway to Houston Street
 Thence west on Houston Street to Navarro
 Thence north on Navarro to Travis Street
 Thence east on Travis to Broadway

 Returning over the same route in the inverse order to

There is hereby designated a route to be known as the St. Mary's route for motor bus service as follows:

Beginning at Roosevelt and Uvalde Street
 Thence east on Uvalde to Whiting Avenue
 Thence south on Whiting to Eads Avenue
 Thence west on Eads to Roosevelt Avenue
 Thence north on Roosevelt, South St. Mary's and
 North St. Mary's Streets to Mulberry Street
 Thence west on Mulberry to King's Court
 Thence south on Kings' Court to North St. Mary's Street
 Returning over North St. Mary's South St. Mary's and
 Roosevelt Avenue to Uvalde Street, the place of
 beginning.

Every motor vehicle operated on each of the above designated routes shall have a seating capacity of not less than twenty (20) persons and be completely enclosed by metal or wood sides and glass windows; no motor vehicle shall be operated on these routes unless equipped with pneumatic tires; and on these routes there shall be maintained a schedule whereby local transportation shall be furnished from six o'clock in the morning until twelve o'clock the following night, at intervals of not less than twenty (2) minutes, excepting upon the South San Antonio route, the Kelly Field route and the Brooks Field route, upon which buses shall have a seating capacity of not less than sixteen (16) persons and a schedule shall be maintained with intervals of not less than sixty (60) minutes.

Sec. 2. That said original Section 2 of said ordinance and all amendments thereto -fore made are hereby repealed.

 AN ORDINANCE 011-90

PROVIDING FOR A MODE AND METHOD OF COLLECTING DELINQUENT TAXES, AND PROVIDING PENALTY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

SECTION I. That if any person shall fail to pay the taxes imposed on him and his property within the time prescribed by law and the ordinances of the City of San Antonio, the Assessor and Collector of Taxes shall, by virtue of his tax list and assessment roll, levy upon so much of the property subject to taxation belonging to such person as may be sufficient to pay his taxes, and shall give notice of the time and place of the sale by advertisement of the property and the amount of taxes, costs and fees due thereon.

SECTION II. That by authority of and in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Texas, the Statutes of said State and the Charter of the City of San Antonio and this Ordinance, the said City of San Antonio shall have the right and power to seize and take possession of any and all real and personal property, and other property subject to taxation, where the owner or owners thereof have failed or refused to pay or shall hereafter fail or refuse to pay the taxes on any such property when lawfully due and payable to said City of San Antonio, after the same have become due and delinquent as shown by the books and records of the Assessor of Texas and Collector of Taxes of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION III. That such notice of sale shall be published in some newspaper of general circulation published in said City in the manner and for the time prescribed by law for judicial sales of lands and personal property. At the expiration of the time stated in such notice and on the day therein specified the Assessor and Collector shall proceed to sell such property at

public auction in some public place in said City designated in said notice. When real estate is offered for sale, the least amount of such real estate shall be sold as will be sufficient to bring the amount of the taxes, penalties and costs due by said delinquent. Should a less amount than the whole tract levied upon be sold, the Assessor and Collector shall in making his deed to the purchaser begin at a corner of said tract or parcel of land and designate the same as nearly as possible in a square, so that the remaining portion will be affected to as little disadvantage as possible.

SECTION IV. That before any property upon which taxes have become delinquent can be seized and possession taken by said City under the provisions of this Ordinance the notice shall first be given in writing to the owner or owners, their agents or representatives stating the amount of ad valorem taxes due and all interest and penalties accrued thereon. Said notice shall further state that unless such taxes, interest and penalties as stated in said notice are paid within ten days from the date of the issuance of said notice the City of San Antonio will at the expiration of the tenth day, seize, take possession of, manage, operate and control said property or any part thereof. The manner of such notice shall be given in accordance with the requirements for giving notice as provided for in Section VI of this Ordinance.

SECTION V. That not more than eight days nor less than two days after any property, either real or personal, is seized or taken possession of under the provisions of this Ordinance the Assessor and Collector of Taxes of said City shall notify the owner or owners, or his or their ^{or agents} agents, representative or representatives, in writing and by registered mail, addressed to the last known address of such person or persons, that a public hearing will be held as to the seizure or taking possession of the property of such owner or owners under the terms and provisions of this Ordinance, at which hearing the interested party or parties, his or their representative or representatives, shall have the right and be accorded the privilege of contesting before the City Council of the City of San Antonio any such seizure or takeover of such property. That such seizure shall only be subject to contest upon the grounds that the taxes due thereon have been paid or that such property is not subject to taxation.

SECTION VI. That in the exercise of the right of said City under the provisions of this Ordinance and the laws of this State to seize, take over, hold and or sell property of a delinquent tax owner or owners, the Chief of Police or any policeman, under the authority and direction of the Mayor of said City, may make such seizure by leaving written notice of such seizure with such owner or owners, or their representative or representatives, which written notice shall be issued by the City Clerk in duplicate, one copy of such notice to be left with the owner or owners, or his or their representative or representatives, and in case he or they cannot be found, then the officer making such seizure shall by registered mail send such written notice to such owner or owners, either of which methods of seizure and notice shall be deemed sufficient to meet the requirements of this Ordinance, that there shall be included in said written notice of seizure the following matters and things:

- (a) Said written notice shall be addressed to the owners or owners.
- (b) Said written notice shall describe the property seized as it is described upon the tax rolls of said City or the Deed Records of Bexar County, Texas.
- (c) Said written notice shall be dated, signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk under his seal of office.
- (d) Said written notice shall direct the Chief of Police or any policeman to seize and take possession of the property of any such delinquent tax owner or owners for the purpose of collecting delinquent taxes and make his return to the City Clerk, showing the date and hour

when the notice was received and the date and hour when served, and upon whom served, signing said return in his official capacity.

That if in the effort to seize any property in order to collect delinquent taxes under the provisions of this Ordinance any owner or owners, or his or their agent or agents, representative or representatives, should for any reason refuse to yield possession for the use and benefit of said City of any such property to the said officer making such seizure, then such officer so making said seizure is hereby authorized and directed to take possession of said property, using no more force than should be necessary in the performance of his official duty. After the officer or officers have secured possession of such property, the same shall be turned over to the Tax Collector or Fiscal Agent as hereinafter provided.

SECTION VII. That the Assessor and Collector shall, when any property has been sold for the payment of taxes, make, execute, and deliver a deed for and on behalf of the owner or owners thereof of conveying said property to the person purchasing the same, and such deed shall be ^{evidence} prima facie / in all controversies and suits in relation to the right of the purchaser, his heirs and assigns, to the premises thereby conveyed of the following facts:

1. That the land or lot or portions thereof conveyed was subject to taxation or assessment at the time the same was advertised for sale, and had been listed or assessed in the time or manner required by law.

2. That the taxes or assessment were not paid at any time before the sale.

3. That the land, lot or portion thereof conveyed had not been redeemed from the sale at the date of the deed, and shall be conclusive evidence of the following facts:

(a) That the land, lot or portion thereof sold was advertised for sale in the manner and for the length of time required by law.

(b) That the property was sold for taxes or assessments as stated in the deed.

(c) That the grantee in the deed was the purchaser.

(d) That the sale was conducted in the manner prescribed by law.

And in all controversies and suits involving the title to land claimed and held under and by virtue of such deed, the person claiming title adverse to the title conveyed by such deed shall be required to prove, in order to defeat said title, either that the land was not subject to taxation at the date of the sale, that the taxes or assessment had been paid, that the land had never been listed or assessed for taxation and assessment, as required by this title, or some ordinance of the City, or that the same has been redeemed according to the provisions of this title, and that such redemption was made for the use and benefit of the person having the right of redemption under the laws; but no person shall be permitted to question the title acquired by the said deed without first showing that he, or the person under whom he claims title, had title to the land at the time of the sale, or that the title was obtained after the sale; provided, however, that the owner of such property shall have the right to redeem the same at any time within two years of the day and date of the sale thereof, upon payment to the purchaser of double the amount of taxes for which the same was sold, together with the costs of such sale and double the amount of all taxes.

SECTION VIII. That the Assessor and Collector shall have power to levy upon any personal property to satisfy any tax imposed by law and Ordinance of the City of San Antonio. All taxes shall be a lien upon the property upon which they are assessed, and in case any property levied upon is about to be removed out of the City, the Assessor and Collector shall proceed to take into his possession so much thereof as will pay the taxes assessed and the costs of collection.

SECTION IX. That if, from any cause, the sale of property levied upon or seized for taxes

shall not take place at the time first appointed, the Assessor and Collector shall appoint some other time, give like notice, and proceed to sell such property as perscribed in the first instance. If said property levied upon or seized for taxes cannot be sold on the day advertised, such sale may be postponed from day to day until completed, of which postponement the Assessor and Collector shall give verbal notice at the expiration of sale each day.

SECTION X. That if, at any sale of real or personal property or estate for taxes, no bid shall be made for any parcel of land, or any goods and chattels, the same shall be struck off to the City, and the City shall receive, in the corporate name, a deed for said property, and shall be vested with the same right as other purchasers at such sale, and may sell and convey the same.

SECTION XI. That all lands sold under and by virtue of decree and judgment of court as otherwise provided by law, for taxes due any incorporated city or town within this State, may be redeemed by the owner or owners thereof within two years from the date of deed, upon the payment to the purchaser, or his assigns, of double the amount so paid, including costs of court. The purchaser at such foreclosure sale, and his assigns shall not be entitled to the possession of the property sold for taxes until the expiration of two years from the date of deed.

SECTION XII. That if the City Council should in its discretion determine after the property of any owner or owners has been seized and taken possession of by said City under the provisions of the laws of this State and this Ordinance, that the collection of delinquent taxes may be more speedily accomplished by the mere holding possessions of, controlling, managing and operating such property or any part thereof so seized and the collecting of rents, revenues and income therefrom and the impounding thereof, then the Mayor of said City shall be authorized and empowered to appoint a Fiscal Agent, and who shall be subject to removal at the pleasure of the Mayor and whose compensation shall be set by the City Council. The powers and duties of such Fiscal Agent shall be to take over, manage, operate and control under the direction of the Mayor any property or any part thereof and demand under oath complete information relative thereto, including the production of books of account, contracts, letters or other papers in connection therewith and all moneys, rents, revenues and income and hold the same impounded which shall be found to be in the custody or control of such owner or owners, their agents, servants and employes or if such property be owned by any firm, corporation or association then the officers and agents thereof.

SECTION XIII. That to assure a proper accounting of all rents, revenues and income, the Fiscal Agent shall procure such books and keep an accurate account of all funds coming into his hands and the disbursement thereof in the performance of his duties and shall from time to time after deducting therefrom all costs and expenses incident to and necessary to the collection of any such rents, revenues and income transmit the net balance to the Tax Collector who shall apply the net balance if any to the payment of any and all unpaid delinquent taxes of such owner or owners whose property has been seized under the provisions of this ordinance, and if the net balance shall pay and discharge all delinquent taxes of such owner or owners, then he or they shall receive from the Tax Collector the customary official receipt for such taxes and his or their property so seized and taken over shall at once thereafter be returned to him or them, provided that this section of this Ordinance shall not apply after any property has been sold under the terms and provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION XIV. That wherever the word "person" is used in this Ordinance it shall include reference to and mean any person, firm, corporation, association, or other owner or owners of taxable property.

SECTION XV. The remedies provided for in this Ordinance for the collection of delinquent ad valorem taxes shall not be deemed exclusive but cumulative of all other remedies, whether provided by General Law or the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION XVI. In the event any section or part, or sections or parts, of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional, such holding shall not affect the remaining sections or parts thereof, but the same shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION XVII. Any person, firm, corporation or association, or any officer, agent, servant, or employee thereof, who shall interfere with the lawful seizure and taking possession of any property under the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof in the corporation court shall be fined in any sum not less than Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) provided that each such person, firm, corporation or association, or any officer, agent or servant thereof shall act in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed a separate offense.

SECTION VIII. The fact that numerous persons, firms, corporations and associations owning real and personal property within the City of San Antonio subject to ad valorem taxes, and upon which the taxes have now become delinquent, and such persons are able to pay their taxes but have purposefully refrained from so paying, and the further fact that without adequate tax revenues with which to operate the City of San Antonio efficient government cannot be had, and the further fact that the City of San Antonio has outstanding its bonds in many millions of dollars which, under the Constitution, General Laws, and the Charter of said City, must be retired with revenues derived from taxation, and, further, that it is imperative that the holders of such bonds be by the City of San Antonio protected in making adequate provisions for their payment, and the further fact that unless the emergency measures as herein provided be taken the efficiency of the fire and police department and other departments of said City will be diminished to such an extent as to render the public generally without adequate fire and police protection and without efficient governmental agencies, all of which will greatly endanger the public health, safety and welfare in such City and creates an emergency and imperative public necessity which requires that this Ordinance shall become effective ten days after its passage and approval and publication, as required by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.
