CITIZENS TO BE HEARD

MR. FRANK M. SALTER

Mr. Salter stated that he is a recovering drug addict who also used inhalants, and stated that he feels that he has a good plan to curb the matter of inhalant abuse. He stated that his plan involves introducing an additive to inhalant material that has a bitter smell or taste, rather than the sweet taste and smell, as now. He then spoke to the advantages of his plan, and spoke to the forces behind drug usage, asking that federal laws be pursued to implement his plan.

Mr. Wing spoke to past efforts to curb inhalant abuse, and noted that strong lobby groups at the state level have defected these efforts.

Mr. Thompson noted that much of this is a 'dollars and cents' issue to large paint firms, and stated his opinion that this is a societal issue.

Council asked staff to place Mr. Salter in touch with state inhalant abuse experts.

Mr. Culbertson stated his opinion that the City's water panel is making progress in water matters.

MR. GUNTHER KRELLWITZ

Mr. Krellwitz spoke to his views of San Antonio's water problems, and stated his belief that only one agency is necessary to handle water issues for the city. He spoke to his hopes for an alternative to the Applewhite Reservoir, and also lauded the use of outside attorneys to defend the City against the City Water Board lawsuit.

Mr. Wing spoke of the contributions made by the new members of City Council and the proposed consolidation of water agencies.

Ms. Bussell spoke of her experiences in matters of alleged sexual harassment and attempts to force her into prostitution. She spoke to the rise of Adolph Hitler and terrorism in Germany, and the importance of secrecy in that system.
