

AN ORDINANCE **98020**

ORDERING A BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD JOINTLY WITH BEXAR COUNTY AND THE NORTH EAST INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT ON THE 4TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 2003, IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, BEXAR COUNTY, TEXAS, ON A PROPOSED BOND ISSUE FOR STREETS AND PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS, DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS, LIBRARY IMPROVEMENTS, PARKS AND RECREATION IMPROVEMENTS, AND PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS; MAKING PROVISION FOR THE HOLDING OF THIS ELECTION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas (the "City") wishes to call a bond election for November 4, 2003; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Bexar County, Texas (the "County") and the Board of Trustees of the North East Independent School District ("NEISD") also intend to call an election for November 4, 2003, and the parties therefore wish to hold a joint election as permitted by the provisions of Section 271.002, as amended, Texas Election Code ; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City hereby finds that an election should be held to determine whether the City Council shall be authorized to issue bonds of the City in the amounts and for the purposes hereinafter identified and that said election should be held jointly with the County and NEISD, **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. A bond election shall be held on Tuesday, the 4th day of November, 2003, in accordance with the laws of Texas and the provisions of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and the official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code and at said election the following PROPOSITIONS shall be submitted in accordance with law.

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the City in

the principal amount of \$29,398,217 for the purpose of making permanent public improvements and for public purposes, to wit, constructing street and pedestrian improvements and drainage and amenities incidental thereto, street lighting, technology improvements, and signage, and acquiring lands and rights-of-way necessary for street improvements, with respect to:

signage, and acquiring lands and rights-of-way necessary for street improvements; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise not more than forty (40) years from their issued date, and any issue or series of said bonds to bear interest at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of said City Council, provided that such interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of said bonds; and shall the City Council be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity?"

DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS PROPOSITION

“Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$18,912,770 for the purpose of making permanent public improvements and for public purposes, to wit: constructing facilities for the removal of, and protection from, harmful excesses of water and acquiring lands and rights-of-way necessary thereto, with respect to:

water, and acquiring lands and rights-of-way necessary thereto; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise not more than forty (40) years from their issued date; and any issue or series of said bonds to bear interest at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of said City Council, provided that such rate of interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of said bonds; and shall the City Council be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity?"

PROPOSITION NO. 5

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$35,500,000 for the purpose of making permanent public improvements and for public purposes, to wit: acquiring, constructing, improving, renovating and equipping public health and safety facilities, and acquiring lands and rights-of-way necessary thereto, with respect to:

Animal Care Facility

Emergency Operations Center

Medical Center Area Senior Multi-Service and Health Center

and in providing for the above improvements, the City Council shall have the option to utilize other funds available for such purposes, and after making due provision therefore, the City Council, in its discretion, may use any excess funds for acquiring, constructing, improving, renovating and equipping public health and safety facilities, and acquiring lands and rights of way necessary thereto; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise not more than forty (40) years from their issued date; and any issue or series of said bonds to bear interest at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of said City Council, provided that such rate of interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of said bonds; and shall the City Council be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity?"

SECTION 2. The official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" OR "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITIONS, with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings, and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITIONS to be expressed substantially as follows:

SECTION 3. The City Council of the City of San Antonio hereby finds that the November 4, 2003 Bond Election shall be held jointly with Bexar County and the North East Independent School District.

SECTION 4. Said election shall be held as prescribed by law at the following voting places in the several precincts of the City of San Antonio, as listed in **Attachment I**, and Bexar County, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock a.m. and 7.00 o'clock p.m. at those locations listed in **Attachment II**. Attachments I and II are attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes.

SECTION 5. Voting at said election for election day voting shall be done by the use of AIS650 Tabulators, paper ballots or the iVotronic™ touch screen voting system, as determined by the City Clerk of the City of San Antonio and the Bexar County Elections Administrator. The City Clerk does determine hereby that AIS650 Tabulators and paper ballots shall be used for the casting of early votes by mail at this election. Voting at said election for early voting by personal appearance shall be done by the use of the iVotronic™ touch screen voting system. The equipment shall be placed at branch offices as listed in **Attachment III**, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes, established for the purpose of conducting early voting by personal appearance during the dates and hours hereby indicated in **Attachment III**.

SECTION 6. Early voting by personal appearance shall be conducted at the branch offices as listed in Attachment III, during the period for early voting, commencing Monday, October 20, 2003 and ending Friday, October 31, 2003, including Saturday, October 25, 2003 and Sunday, October 26, 2003.

SECTION 7. Electors may cast their early vote by mail, and the early voting clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail shall be sent to, is as follows:

SECTION 8. The City Council will hereafter contract with the Bexar County Elections Administrator to conduct this election. The contract will be considered by the City Council at a subsequent meeting, as evidenced by passage of an ordinance

SECTION 9. Notice of such bond election shall be given by posting a substantial copy of this Ordinance, both in English and in Spanish, at three (3) public places in the City of San Antonio and also at the City Hall, not less than 15 days prior to the date set for said election; and a substantial copy of this Ordinance also shall be published, both in English and in Spanish, on the same day in each of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of San Antonio, the date of the first publication to be not less than 14 nor more than 30 days prior to the date set for said election.


SECTION 10. All resident qualified electors of the City shall be permitted to vote at the election and on the day of the election, such electors shall vote at the designated polling place. The election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code, as amended, and the provisions of the Texas Government Code, and as may be required by any other law. All election materials and proceedings shall be printed in both English and Spanish.

SECTION 11. All bonds voted at said election shall be issued only in accordance with, and subject to all restrictions and requirements of, all applicable laws.

SECTION 12. Pursuant to the City of San Antonio City Charter, this Ordinance shall not become effective until August 24, 2003, which is the tenth day following the passage of this Ordinance, and this Ordinance shall be considered to be dated as of such effective date.

BACKGROUND

In the FY2002-2003 budget, the Council approved a plan that anticipated a \$115 million General Obligation Bond program be developed during the year as the 2003 General Obligation Bond Program for consideration by the voters. The item before Council today, if approved, will call for the election and finalize the projects and ballot language to be submitted to the voters on November 4, 2003.

The last General Obligation Bond authorization was in 1999 and was developed as a five-year program totaling \$140.2 million. The five-year program has been a tool utilized to minimize the impact to the tax rate, spreading projects over a five-year completion timeframe. However, due to a very favorable interest climate as well as extremely prudent management of debt, the 2003 General Obligation Bond Program is being brought forward for consideration one year earlier than originally planned.

The proposed 2003 General Obligation Bond Program has been developed by Council over the last few months utilizing a number of criteria such as: review of master plans for planned infrastructure improvements, projects leveraging additional funds, projects with opportunity for partnering with the other entities, projects that are phased continuations of previously authorized projects, as well as addressing neighborhood mobility projects such as sidewalks. These criteria, along with extensive community input, resulted in the projects for consideration before Council today. An example of a project meeting criteria is the proposed Emergency Operations Center (EOC), a joint project with the County whereby the City's share is \$20.5 million and the County is proposing to contribute an additional \$5.0 million in order to build a facility that meets the needs of the City of San Antonio and Bexar County.

Attached is a proposed ordinance that includes the projects selected by Council. A breakdown of those projects is as follows:

Streets & Pedestrian Improvements	\$ 29,398,217
Drainage Improvements	\$ 18,912,770
Libraries and Educational Improvements	\$ 3,965,000
Parks and Recreation Improvements	\$ 27,224,013
Public Health and Safety Improvements	\$ 35,500,000

As outlined in the final documents, the projects will be presented to the voters for consideration in Five (5) Propositions. The ballot will not include a listing of each individual project but will include a more generalized statement about the nature of the improvements by Proposition. However, the ordinance to be considered today does include a specific listing of the projects.

Once approved by the City Council, the documents will be sent to the Justice Department for pre-clearance. The ballots will be ready for early voting to begin Monday, October 20 and end Friday, October 31. The election will be held on Tuesday, November 4. This will be a joint election with Bexar County and Northeast Independent School District (NEISD). Canvassing of the votes will take place at the November 6 City Council meeting.

POLICY ANALYSIS

The 2003 General Obligation Bond Program continues the policy of the City Council to develop bond programs to address needed infrastructure improvements in the City of San Antonio with a scheduled program.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

The program improvements, if approved, will be spread out and be funded over three fiscal years, beginning in FY2004, with projects substantially completed by FY2008.




