

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO,

FIDAY, June 1st, 1923. A.D. at 10:00 A.M.

Hon. John W. Tobin, Mayor elect and all of the Commissioners elected at the general election held in this City on May 8th, 1923, having previously subscribed to the constitutional oath administered by Hon. W. S. Fry, Chief Justice of the Court of Civil Appeals, 4th Supreme Judicial District of Texas, Mayor Tobin called the Meeting to order with all the Commissioners present, when the following proceedings were had.

Commissioner Bushick read the following communication to wit:

To the Honorable John W. Tobin, Mayor, and the Honorable Commissioners,

Gentlemen;

We present to you these products of Bexar County soil as a token of our esteem and good wishes on this occasion as you gentlemen enter upon the important duties you have so patriotically assumed.

In our mind's eye we see a new era of civic progress for San Antonio; we see its beauty enhanced, its commercial and industrial supremacy promoted, and its historical traditions kept alive as a guiding spirit in our forward march as the first city of Texas.

We have faith in the integrity and judgment of you gentlemen, and it is with pride that we see you sworn in today as the custodians of our public welfare.

C. E. Convers to be City Electrician

On motion of Commissioner Wright duly seconded and carried, Commissioner Lambert was elected Mayor pro tem by unanimous vote, upon which the meeting adjourned.
