REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE PLANTING OF "THE CENTENNIAL PECAN TREES".

TO THE MAYOR AND COMMISSIONERS OF  
THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

WE, the undersigned committee of the Bexar County Pecan Growers Association, appointed by resolution of the Board of Commissioners to plant "The Centennial Pecan Trees" in memory of the Heroes of the Alamo, beg leave to report as follows:

On Texas Independence Day, March 2nd, 1936, we planted twelve pecan trees in the following locations and of the following varieties: (1) ALAMO PLAZA, south end, Oklahoma; north end, Mystery; (2) CITY HALL, southeast corner, Success; northeast corner, Delmas; (3) MAIN PLAZA, south end, Delmas; southeast of bandstand, Mystery; northwest of same, Success; (4) COURT HOUSE, at southwest corner, Oklahoma; at Southeast corner, Mystery; at northwest corner, Bradley; (TRAVIS PARK, north side, Delmas; east side, Bradley.

We desire to thank Mr. A. P. Heinen and Mr. D. D. Heinen, who donated the trees; Mr. Henry Steingruber, who superintended the planting thereof; and Mr. Robert Uhr, County Commissioner; Mr. Fred Mally, County Agent; the County Commissioners' Court, the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, the San Antonio Express, and the San Antonio Light, for their hearty cooperation in the project.
