EXEMPTING THE SAN ANTONIO KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS HOME ASSOCIATION FROM TAXATION.

1. WHEREAS, the San Antonio Knights of Columbus Home Association of San Antonio has petitioned the City of San Antonio for the consideration of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio for the exemption of its property from taxation; and,

2. WHEREAS, the San Antonio Knights of Columbus Home Association of San Antonio is a corporation existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Texas; and,

APPROPRIATING \$400.00 TO PAY THE ESTATE OF A. L. MATLOCK FOR LEGAL SERVICES RENDERED THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That \$400.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of Judgments & Suits Account to pay the Estate of A. L. Matlock for legal services rendered by A. L. Matlock, attorney at law, employed by the City of San Antonio, through its Mayor and Commissioners on or about May 31, 1933, to represent the City of San Antonio in collecting advalorium taxes due the City of San Antonio, amounting to \$115,861.16, as shown upon tax statements delivered by the City to said Matlock; said claims for taxes are against G. H. & S. A. Ry. Co. and other railroad lines; said Matlock, during his lifetime, did a great deal of research, looking up authorities and briefing the questions involved and in getting the case ready for trial he paid out several dollars for certified copies of petitions and documents.
