2. The change in said ordinance shall be substantially as follows:

3. The passage and approval of an ordinance amending the present zoning regulations of the zoning ordinance passed and approved on the 3rd day of November, A. D. 1938, so as to incorporate the following:-

4. To enlarge the "F" Local Retail District of New City Block 9175 bounded by Donaldson, Manor, Retama (formerly Morning Glory), and O'Neill Place in line with the projected increase of the length of that block from 400 to 468 feet; to extend the "B" Two Family on the south side of Retama to Morning Glory by changing Lots 1 through 14, New City Block 9177 and the corner Lot of the Block to the east from "A" One Family; and to change the zoning of New City Block 9176 "A" One Family to "B" Two Family.

5. Notice of such hearing shall be given by publication three times in the "COMMERCIAL RECORDER", the official publication of the City of San Antonio, stating the time and place of such hearing, which time shall not be earlier than fifteen (15) days from the first date of such publication.

That an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ZONING REGULATIONS AND DISTRICTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, AND REGULATING AND RE-DISTRICTING THE HEIGHT, NUMBER OF STORIES AND SIZE OF BUILDING AND OTHER STRUCTURES, PERCENTAGE OF LOT THAT MAY BE OCCUPIED, THE SIZE OF YARDS, THE DENSITY OF POPULATION, LOCATION, AND USES OF BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES AND LAND FOR TRADE, INDUSTRY, RESIDENCES AND OTHER PURPOSES, AND DIVIDING THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO INTO DISTRICTS AND REGULATING AND REDISTRICTING THE ERECTION, CONSTRUCTION, RE-CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, REPAIR OR USE OF BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES OR LAND WITHIN SUCH DISTRICTS, AND PROVIDING UNIFORM REGULATIONS FOR THE SEVERAL CLASSES OR KINDS OF BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES AND USES WITHIN THE RESTRICTIVE DISTRICTS, AND ADOPTING A ZONING MAP DISCLOSING THE VARIOUS DISTRICTS AND USE AREAS AND THE RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS AND PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO SUCH DISTRICTS AND AREAS, AND PROVIDING FOR A BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT AND DEFINING THE POWERS OF SAME, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF SUCH ORDINANCES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY", passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the 3rd day of November, A. D. 1938, be and the same is hereby amended so as to incorporate the following:

2. "To change the properties fronting on the east side of San Pedro Avenue, north of the present "F" Local Retail and south of Riddle, to "F" Local Retail; and to change the properties facing 668.4 feet on San Pedro Avenue and 280 feet on Fresno, to "F" Local Retail; to change lots 1, 2, 3 and 4 in Block 4, Lots 1, 10, 11, 12 and 13 in Block 3, and lots 1 and 32 in Block 1, to "D" Apartment, and to change all the remainder of the subdivision up to and including Block 10 of San Pedro Place to "A" Residential."

3. "To discontinue the present classification of said area and to change the zoning maps accordingly."

4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed, and the present classification of said area is discontinued.

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A RESOLUTION (3413).

DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO GIVE NOTICE FOR THE RECEIVING OF PROPOSALS SUBMITTING A PLAN PROVIDING FOR AUTOMOBILE STORAGE FACILITIES TO RELIEVE PARKING PROBLEM IN DOWN TOWN AREA OF CITY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, Texas, desires to effect a solution to its down town parking problem: and

WHEREAS, it now desires to obtain proposals to the end that the problem may be solved

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the Mayor be and he is hereby directed to publish, for the time and in the manner required by law in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of San Antonio, Texas, a notice in the form substantially as follows:

"LEGAL NOTICE"

The City of San Antonio is desirous of effecting a solution of its down town parking problem and to that end proposals will be received in the Mayor's office at the City Hall until 10:00 A.M., May 23, 1946, at which time they will be publicly opened and read. Where practicable subsurface use of City Parks for underground storage will be permitted.

The City of San Antonio recognizes that the location of adequate parking facilities in the down town area where traffic is congested will likely enhance the value of property in the vicinity of each parking facility, and will likely cause establishments in the area served by each such facility to gain business advantage over other areas where adequate parking facilities are not provided. To insure all sections of the down town San Antonio area adequate facilities and equal advantage with each other section, the City of San Antonio believes that parking facilities should be available north, south, east and west of the down town San Antonio district at substantially the following locations:

- (1) In the vicinity or under Alamo Plaza.
- (2) In the vicinity or under Travis Park.
- (3) In the vicinity or under Main Plaza.
- (4) At a suitable location west of LaVillita, west of Water Street, east of the Bexar Court House, and north of Nueva Street.

The enumeration of such locations is not intended to restrict the submission of any feasible proposal.

All proposals must conform to the following provisions:

(1) Each project must be designed or approved by practicing San Antonio Architects and engineers, subject to final approval by the City. Each proposal shall furnish complete plans and specifications.

(2) No completed project shall provide for less than a minimum storage capacity of 500 cars.

(3) Proposals of lowest responsible bidder on each project will be accepted.

(4) The City shall have the right to reject any and all proposals.

(5) Each successful proposer shall be required to give a performance bond in the full amount of the contract price, executed by a Surety Company authorized to do business in the State of Texas in accordance with the provisions of Article 5160, Revised Civil Statutes of 1925, as amended,

(6) Acceptance of any proposal or the manner of the letting of any contract shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

(7). The City intends to pay for each project through the issuance of its revenue bonds, and the revenue alone of each facility, shall be pledged to secure the payment of the principal and interest of the bonds issued to construct such facility. Each proposer or bidder shall agree to accept such bonds in payment of the construction work. Said revenue bonds shall have a maximum maturity date of 25 years from the date thereof and shall bear interest at not exceeding 3% per annum.

(8) Each acceptable proposal shall provide for an adequately financed Operating Company which will pay lease rental in an amount sufficient to amortize said Revenue Bonds.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the proposal of National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio, Texas, dated the 16th day of May, 1946, to act as depository of the City of San Antonio, all of which is more fully set out in said instrument attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A", and made a part hereof for all intents and purposes as fully as if it were copied herein, be and the same is hereby accepted.

6. This ordinance and the attachments thereto creates and manifests the contract between the City of San Antonio and National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio, Texas to act as depository and fiscal agent of the City of San Antonio for the current fiscal year.

Gentlemen:

Pursuant to your official published notice that sealed bids will be received at the office of the City Clerk in the City Hall not later than 10 A.M., May 16, 1946, said bids submitting proposals from banks to act as depository for the City of San Antonio for the fiscal year ending May 31, 1947, and submitting proposals for effecting loans and advances to the City of San Antonio during said period, we respectfully submit to you the following Proposal:

A. FOR ACTING AS DEPOSITORY

Subject to the National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio, Texas, being designated as sole depository for all funds of the City of San Antonio for the aforesaid period, and subject to clauses appearing under Section C Below, we propose as follows:

1. To pay interest on daily balances on any and all fund accounts which may be designated as Time Accounts, subject to notice of not less than thirty (30) days prior to any withdrawals, at the rate of Seventy-seven One-Hundredths of One Percent (77/100s of 1%). per annum.
2. To pay interest on daily balances on any and all fund accounts which may be designated as Time Accounts, subject to notice of not less than ninety (90) days prior to any withdrawals, at the rate of One and Thirty-one One-Hundredths Percent (1.31%) per annum.
3. To pay interest on daily balances on any and all fund accounts which may be designated as Time Accounts, subject to notice of not less than one hundred and eighty (180) days prior to any withdrawals, at the rate of One and Sixty-Seven One-Hundredths Percent (1.67%) per annum.

Interest on daily balances on any of the above accounts is to be calculated on balances in even thousands and paid monthly as it accrues.

- 4.. No interest is to be paid on any balances subject to check without notice.

B. FOR THE ADVANCE AND LOAN OF MONEY

Provided that the proposal of this Bank to be named as sole depository is accepted and this Bank so designated by the City Council, we agree to make legally authorized and contracted loans and advances in accordance with official bid notice, in anticipation of receipt of taxes and the current revenues of the City for said fiscal year, and/or such collateral and/or pledges acceptable to this bank, the rates of interest to be as follows:

1. Interest at the rate of One & Nineteen One-Hundredths (1.19%) per annum, calculated from the date the note is discounted by us; the maximum maturity of said notes, unless contracted otherwise, to be May 31, 1947.
2. Interest on any notes or portions thereof unpaid at maturity is to be at the rate of Three and Seventy-Five One-Hundredths Percent (3.75%) per annum, after maturity, with the usual penalty clauses.

C. GENERAL

1. The National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio, Texas, is to be designated as Fiscal Agent of the City of San Antonio in connection with the payment of principal and interest and funded obligations of the City of San Antonio and/or Improvement Districts, etc.
2. We agree to make acceptable depository bond as provided in bid notice and in keeping with usual custom.

AN ORDINANCE (3444)

MAKING A CONTRACT FOR A TRUCK WITH PAGE S. DEWEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this ordinance makes and manifests a contract between the City of San Antonio, and the undersigned, hereinafter called Contractor. WITNESSETH:-

2. That the Contractor will supply to the City of San Antonio, one three (3) yard dump truck, to deliver gravel, furnished by the City from City gravel pit, to streets designated by the City Engineer at a rate per load to be agreed upon with the City Engineer.

3. That the Contractor shall, at his own expense, employ the driver, and maintain the truck in a good state of repair.

4. The Contractor will use the truck to haul gravel to the above designated streets and location, at the time and place directed by the City Engineer of the City of San Antonio; and, will accomplish this work in a manner and by the method chosen by the Contractor.

1. That the Mayor be and he is hereby directed to publish, for the time and in the manner required by law in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of San Antonio, Texas, a notice in the form substantially as follows:

"LEGAL NOTICE"

The City of San Antonio is desirous of effecting a solution of its down town parking problem and to that end proposals will be received in the Mayor's office at the City Hall until 10:00 A. M., June , 1946, at which time they will be publicly opened and read. Where practicable, subsurface use of the City Parks for underground storage will be permitted.

PROVISIONS INCIDENT TO THE OBJECT AND PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE WHETHER MENTIONED IN DETAIL IN THE CAPTION OR NOT, THE FIXING OF PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF ANY SECTION OF THIS ORDINANCE, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, AND CONTAINING A SAVING CLAUSE", passed and approved on the 6 day of August, A. D. 1942, be and the same is amended hereby so that hereafter the same shall read as follows:-

2. "Every milk distributor or operator of a milk plant as defined in this ordinance, whether operated by an individual or as a firm, association, partnership, or corporation, shall immediately upon the passing of this ordinance, make application in writing to the City Health Officer of the City of San Antonio, upon form prescribed and furnished by said health officer, for a permit to distribute milk and operate and do business in the City of San Antonio, as has been hereinbefore defined in this ordinance.

"The permit fee for the sale or disposal of milk or milk products in the City of San Antonio shall be as follows:

"Every milk plant or milk producer-distributor engaged in processing or in distribution of milk or milk products in the City of San Antonio shall pay to the City of San Antonio a permit fee of forty cents per thousand quarts of milk and milk products sold or processed in this city as defined in this ordinance. These fees shall be used for the execution of the provisions of this ordinance. These fees shall be payable on or before the 16th of each month and shall be in payment for all milk and milk products processed or sold by the plant during the preceding month.

"Such milk distributor shall receive a permit in writing to distribute milk and do business in said City under the terms of this ordinance as hereinbefore set out, and as defined herein. Such permit shall entitle said milk distributor to distribute milk and do business in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, and unless revoked shall continue in force for a period of one fiscal year or fractional part thereof, beginning June 1st of each year, and shall be non-transferable, and shall be renewed annually upon application and payment of a like sum, in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions of this ordinance."

3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed hereby.

4. This ordinance being of urgent importance to the public peace, health and safety of the City of San Antonio, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Commissioners, as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

AMENDING SECTION ONE AND SECTION TWO OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING FOOD PRODUCTS ESTABLISHMENTS AND REQUIRING THE LICENSING OF SAME", PASSED AND APPROVED ON THE 31 DAY OF MAY, 1918, AS AMENDED.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Section One of an ordinance, entitled "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING FOOD PRODUCTS ESTABLISHMENTS AND REQUIRING THE LICENSING OF SAME", passed and approved on the 31 day of May, 1918, as amended by an ordinance on the 18 of June, 1942, be and the same is hereby amended so as to hereafter read as follows:-

2. "SECTION ONE. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person or persons afflicted with or having any contagious, communicable or infectious diseases, in a transmissible stage of such disease of diseases, to accept employment or work in, around or about any food products establishments, hotels, rooming houses, boarding houses, pecan shelling plants and such other establishments as defined in a certain ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING FOOD PRODUCTS ESTABLISHMENTS AND REQUIRING THE LICENSING OF SAME", passed and approved on the 31st day of May, A. D. 1918, and every person applying for or accepting such work or employment shall first call upon and be examined by a licensed physician or by the City Health Officer and procure an examination certificate showing said applicant to be free from said diseases in a transmissible stage of such diseases, and said applicant shall present said examination certificate to the Department of Health where a health certificate shall be issued, unless said applicant shall hold a valid United States Government health certificate issued within six months preceding the date of application for health certificate, and which said United States Government certificate has been duly registered by the Department of Health of the City of San Antonio, and in which event the said Department of Health shall then issue its health certificate to such applicant; provided that if such examination aforesaid be made by a duly licensed private physician, it shall be certified to and reported upon a form provided by the Department of Health and such examination shall be the equivalent of that given by the City Health Officer. For the registration of each examination certificate and issuance of a health certificate a fee of \$1.50 shall be charged by the Department of Health of the City of San

Antonio. A fee of 25 cents for a duplicate health certificate shall be charged and same shall be furnished on payment of said fee and written application of certificate holder."

3. That Section Two of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING FOOD PRODUCTS ESTABLISHMENTS AND REQUIRING THE LICENSING OF SAME", passed and approved on the 31 day of May, A.D. 1918, as amended by an ordinance on the 11 of January, 1940, be and the same is amended hereby so as to hereafter read as follows:-

4. "SECTION TWO. It shall be the duty of the City Health Officer to examine all applicants for employment or work in all food products establishments, hot els, rooming houses, boarding houses, pecan shelling plants, and such other establishments as may be designated by the City Health Officer as defined in a certain ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING FOOD PRODUCTS ESTABLISHMENTS AND REQUIRING THE LICENSING OF SAME", passed and approved on the 31st day of May, A. D. 1918, unless said applicant shall present an examination as provided in Section One of this ordinance. The Department of Health shall issue to all persons engaged or employed in, around or about such establishments a health certificate after being duly examined as provided in Section One of this ordinance who may be free from all contagious, communicable and infectious diseases, in a transmissible stage of such disease or diseases, upon the payment of the health certificate fee, excepting, however, applicants holding valid United States Government health certificate issued within six months preceding the date of application for health certificate, and which said United States Government health certificate has been duly registered with the Department of Health, and who has been issued a health certificate. Such health certificate shall authorize such person to accept employment or work in, around or about all food products establishments, hotels, rooming houses, boarding houses, pecan shelling plants, and such other establishments as may be designated by the City Health Officer as defined in a certain ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING FOOD PRODUCTS ESTABLISHMENTS AND REQUIRING THE LICENSING OF SAME", passed and approved on the 31st day of May, A. D. 1918, for a period of six months from and after the date of such certificate; provided, the said City Health Officer may require all such persons to be re-examined as often and at such times as in his opinion may be necessary and imperative for the preservation and protection of public health and public safety, and with power and authority to cancel any certificate previously issued, should the holder thereof, upon re-examination be found to be affected or afflicted with any contagious, communicable or infectious diseases in a transmissible stage of such disease or diseases; provided further, that no fee shall be charged for such re-examination made within six months after the date of the previous examination by the City Health Officer. At the expiration of the period of six months the holder of the health certificate must be re-examined paying the examination and registration fees provided for in Section One hereof, and have and deposit certificate of re-examination with the proprietor of the establishment where employed; and provided further, that all such fees collected by the Department of Health for health certificates shall be put into and be a part of the Commerce Building Fund of San Antonio, for use as therein stipulated."

5. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed hereby.

6. This ordinance being of urgent importance to the public peace, health and safety of the City of San Antonio, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Commissioners, as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

## AN ORDINANCE (3519)

DIRECTING THE TAX COMMISSIONER OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO ASSESS PROPERTY FOR TAXATION AT NINETY PER CENT OF ITS FAIR VALUE.

WHEREAS, Section 1, Article 8 of the Constitution of the State of Texas provided that "all property . . . shall be taxed in proportion to its value, which shall be ascertained as may be provided by law"; and,

WHEREAS, Section 11, Article 8 of the Constitution provides that "and all lands and other property . . . shall be assessed at its fair value; and,

WHEREAS, Section 30 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio provides that "The Commissioner of Taxation shall make up the assessment of all property taxed by the City in accordance with this Charter. It shall be his duty to assess within the time herein fixed, all property subject to taxation in said City, whether the same be rendered to him or not, and to make out a list of the same. HE SHALL ASSESS ALL PROPERTY AT ITS FULL VALUE, GIVING THE VALUE OF LANDS AND IMPROVEMENTS SEPARATELY, AND SHALL ALSO ASSESS PERSONAL PROPERTY OF WHATEVER NATURE, INCLUDING FRANCHISES, PRIVILEGES AND CHOSE IN ACTION."; and

WHEREAS, Article 7211 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Texas provides that:-

"(ACCEPTS TAXPAYERS VALUATION IF RENDERED AT REASONABLE CASH MARKET VALUE)

"Hereafter when any person, firm or corporation renders his, their or its property in this State for taxation to any tax assessor, and makes oath as to the kind, character, quality and quantity of such property, and the said officer accepting said rendition from such person, firm or corporation of such property is satisfied that it is correctly and properly valued according to the REASONABLE CASH MARKET VALUE of such property on the market AT THE TIME OF ITS RENDITION, he shall list the same accordingly;"

"(RAISES TO BE REASONABLE CASH MARKET VALUE IF RENDITION BELOW SUCH AMOUNT)

"but, if the assessor is satisfied that the value is below the REASONABLE CASH MARKET VALUE of such property, he shall at once place on said rendition opposite each piece of property so rendered an amount equal to the REASONABLE CASH MARKET VALUE of such property AT THE TIME OF ITS RENDITION."
