A RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF
AN ADDITION TO PRESENT SHELTER BUILDING AT WITTE MEMORIAL MUSEUM

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to advertise for bids for the construction of an addition to present Shelter Building at Witte Memorial Museum according to plans and specifications on file in the City Park Engineer's Office, 3rd Floor, City Hall, in the City of San Antonio, Texas; bids to be opened at 10:00 A. M., Thursday, March 10, 1938.

2. The successful bidder on each job will be required to enter into a contract with the City of San Antonio, Texas, which will contain provisions conforming with the requirements of the City of San Antonio for the construction of public works.

3. A performance bond, executed by a Surety Company authorized to do business in the State of Texas and approved by the City of San Antonio, in an amount not less than fifty per cent (50%) of the contract price, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract and upon the payment of all persons applying labor or furnishing materials will be required.

4. Attention of the bidders is directed to the provisions of House Bill 54, as passed by the Forty-third Legislature at its regular session, VTS-1936, Article 5159-A, requiring not less than the general prevailing rate of per diem wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed, and not less than the general prevailing rate of per diem wages for legal holiday and overtime work which shall be paid to all laborers and mechanics in the construction of public works; the following is the prevailing rate in the City of San Antonio, Texas:

Skilled Labor	1.50
Semi-skilled Labor	.85
Unskilled labor	.40

all of which is more fully specified in the schedule of wages and hours filed in the office of the City Clerk.

5. Bidders are required to inspect the site of the work and to investigate local conditions.

6. The City reserves the right to accept any bid or to reject any and all bids. The City reserves the right to hold the three lowest bids and deposit checks for same for a period of thirty days, after such shall be opened, and to accept any one of the said bids.
