GRANTING G. C. VERNON AND JESSIE MAIE VERNON AN EASEMENT ON LOT 10, BLOCK 58, ALAMO HEIGHTS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That for and in consideration of \$100.00 cash in hand paid to the City of San Antonio, the City of San Antonio conveys an easement to G. C. Vernon and Jessie Maie Vernon, of the County of Bexar and State of Texas, to use lot 10, Block 58, according to plat of record in the Records of Deeds and Plats of Bexar County, Vol. 368, page 181, in the City of Alamo Heights, as a lawn, flower garden and for a driveway appurtenant to Lot 9 in Block 58.

2. No building shall be erected, nor shall anything which will float be put on this land, and the City of San Antonio reserves the right of entry at any time to inspect and to regulate the use of the described property to conform with this contract and to remove arbitrarily anything

which the City Engineer declare to be an obstruction of the reservoir or which might interfere with the Olmos Dam or its equipment; and the exercise of the rights conveyed shall be at the peril of the grantees, their heirs, assigns, successors, tenants and licensees, free from any liability, demands, or causes of action against the City of San Antonio or its successors for any loss, damage or destruction, all of which conditions, limitations and acquittances shall be covenants running with the land.

3. The grantees represent that they have examined the premises and that they understood that the premises are a part of the Olmos Flood Basin and may be flooded with water at any time; and acknowledge the title of the property in the City of San Antonio and will never assail or resist it.

4. The grantees will take good care of the property and suffer no waste and will keep it in good condition; and upon the termination of the use for which this grant is made, or on the breach of any condition contained herein, the rights herein contained shall cease and the right of possession revert into the City of San Antonio.

5. The lease of this land made to the City of Alamo Heights on the 2 day of February 1931 is hereby terminated.

6. This conveyance shall not be effective until the grantees have accepted its terms in writing.

7. The foregoing instrument in writing constitutes the entire consideration for the conveyance there being no other written nor any parol agreement with any officer or employee of the City, it being understood that the Charter of the City of San Antonio requires all contracts of the City to be in writing, and adopted by ordinance.
