

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO HELD IN
THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, ON
THURSDAY, MAY 25, 1972.

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The meeting was called to order at 9:30 A. M. by the presiding officer, Mayor John Gatti, with the following members present: HABERMAN, HILL, BECKER, HILLIARD, MENDOZA, GARZA, NAYLOR, PADILLA, GATTI; Absent: NONE.

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72-23 The invocation was given by Mr. Herb Smith, Oak Hills Church of Christ.

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72-23 Members of the City Council and the audience joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

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72-23 The minutes of the meeting of May 18, 1972, were approved.

Mr. Macdonald stated, however, that the administration has asked for additional funds, and it is felt that we will receive more money very shortly.

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The Ordinance was explained by Mr. John Brooks, Director of Purchasing, who stated that all bids met the City's specifications and that the lowest bids were submitted by Pagani's Food Hosts, Inc. and Preston Dairy Products. Mr. Brooks recommended approval of the Ordinance.

In answer to a question from Mr. Mendoza, Mr. Brooks stated that bidders were given a choice of packaging in boxes or in paper bags.

Mr. Ernesto Gonzales, Director of IMAGE - Youth Entrepreneurship Program, a Model Cities Project, asked that the Council make the award to his organization as it will employ local youths in the Model Cities area.

Mr. Becker felt that the slight added cost would be worthwhile when the employment situation is considered.

Mr. Brooks stated that he was obligated to consider best bids only and had never been able to bring such matters into bid specifications. Such consideration would have to come from higher authority.

Mr. Hill stated that all bidders were furnished the same information for bidding, and he objected to considering anything unless it was in the specifications.

City Manager Henckel advised the Council that IMAGE is funded by the City, and there is a strong possibility of a violation of the City Charter as it applies to conflict of interest.

After discussion, Mr. Hill moved that the proposed Ordinance be adopted. The motion was seconded by Mr. Naylor.

Mr. Mendoza offered a substitute motion that the award be made to the IMAGE - Youth Entrepreneurship Program. CITY MANAGER REPORTS

SURPLUS BUILDING

City Manager Henckel reported that he had received word from HEW that the City's request for a surplus building has been approved. The transfer papers should be received within two weeks. The building will be used as a community center in the western portion of the City.

HEMISFAIR PLAZA

Mr. Henckel pointed out that this week's report on Hemis-Fair Plaza reveals a 20 percent increase in attendance over last year. He stated also that the Mexican Plaza is being worked on and should be completed by the arrival of the President of Mexico in June. The waterway has been drained for its annual cleaning. He stated that sometime the City will need to put in a filter and a circulation system in the waterway.

PAY PLAN

City Manager Henckel stated that the Personnel Department is now preparing the proposed pay plan for Fiscal Year 1972-73. He added that he would recommend an increase in the maximum levels for unclassified employees. This will give the City Manager and Council more leeway in attracting top executive talent to the City staff.

Mr. Henckel stated he is also giving serious consideration to a possible pay increase to all employees and possible additional increases for police, fire and labor.

Mr. Henckel stated that these matters were brought to the Council's attention so that if any Council members have any ideas or recommendations in regard to the pay plan, he would like to have them for review and possible incorporation into the pay plan.

HERTZBERG CIRCUS COLLECTION

Councilman Hill suggested to Mr. Henckel that it would be fitting to have the Hertzberg Circus Collection transferred to the HemisFair Plaza area.

Mr. Henckel stated that he agreed that such a move would be proper. The matter will be investigated by the staff, and if the move is feasible, funds for it will be included in the new budget.

POLICE OFFICER RICHARD CUELLAR

Mayor Gatti referred to a letter suggesting that one of the Model Cities parks be named after Police Officer Richard Cuellar who was killed in the line of duty. Mayor Gatti stated that Councilman Padilla was very close to Officer Cuellar and, with the Council's permission, would ask Mr. Padilla to look into the matter and report to the Council.

Mr. James Bailey, Executive Director of Bexar County Mental Health and Retardation Board, invited the members of the City Council to attend the Texas Special Olympics being held in San Antonio for mentally retarded children. Mr. Bailey briefly reviewed the program and the good results being obtained.

Mrs. Helen Dutmer spoke to the Council about a large bill for delinquent taxes which was recently paid by the Houston Terrace Little League. She asked that the Council consider this matter since this is a non-profit organization and has done a great deal of good in the southeast sector of the City.

Mr. William Wallace, 224 Bogue, charged the E.O.D.C. with "stealing human rights" of poor people. He accused E.O.D.C. of a number of practices which led to favoritism for certain agencies and the falsifying of reports on hiring. He asked that the matter be investigated by the City Council.

Rev. Charles Kemble, 319 Tomrob, made reference to the appearance before the City Council last week of Mr. Steven Lang regarding the recently passed Ordinance concerning nude movies. In order to expedite matters, Rev. Kemble suggested that Mayor Gatti appoint a committee to work out a valid ordinance. He suggested that the committee might be composed of himself, Mr. Lang, Councilwoman Carol Haberman, and Councilmen Garza and Hill.

The matter was taken under advisement.

Mr. Ed Holmes discussed with the Council a drainage problem at Salado Creek and Rice Road. Due to poor drainage 144 students were absent from school one day last week.

City Manager Henckel stated that this project is included in the 1970 bond program, but is scheduled for next year. He stated that he would have the matter investigated to see what can be done now.

Mr. Homer Ziegler asked if residents in the newly annexed areas are eligible to be employed by the City.

Mr. Ziegler was advised that they are very welcome and to have them apply at the Personnel Office.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting adjourned at 11:30 A. M.
