WHEREAS, The national organization of the Veterans of Foreign Wars is to engage soon in the selection of the site for the 1947 National Encampment of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, an event which is of outstanding importance and benefit to the city which is successful in obtaining it; and

WHEREAS, San Antonio members of the VFW are striving to secure for our City their 1947 National Encampment and are working hard toward that praiseworthy goal; and

WHEREAS, Few cities can offer as many attractions and inducements for a national gathering of this type as the City of San Antonio, which is a logical choice because of the prominent role it has occupied in all the wars in which our nation has engaged, its rich historical background, its many picturesque attractions for the tourist, and the great and varied number of fond memories it holds for all veterans of the armies of the United States who have trained and served at San Antonio's numerous army establishments; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, THAT,

The Honorable Gus B. Mauermann, Mayor of the City of San Antonio, is hereby authorized and directed to extend this City's official invitation to the 1947 National Encampment of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, with the official assurance that San Antonio's elected officials, citizens and VFW posts will cooperate wholeheartedly in making the 1947 National Encampment one of the greatest in the history of the VFW.

Anderson each were granted leaves of absence dating from November 26 through December 9, to accept invitations from the Mexican Government to attend inaugural ceremonies for President-Elect Miguel Aleman.

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Mayor Mauermann made a report on his discussions with James Dunbar, attorney for the St. Louis Browns, concerning the ball park contract, during Dunbar's visit in the City over the week-end. He said the architects were consulting with contractors, after which they would ask bids on construction of the ball park.

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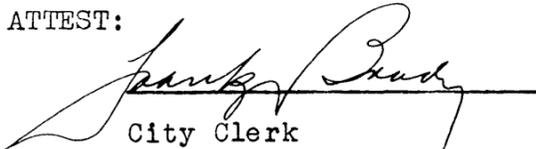
